(BROAD CLOSE, APPLEBY) ORDER 2003

The Council of the District of Eden ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Section 35 (1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984("the Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act and of all other enabling powers, with the consent of the County Council of Cumbria in accordance with Section 39 (3) of the Act and after consulting the Chief Officer

1.	This order shall come into operation on 1 April 2003 and may be cited as the Eden District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) (Broad Close, Appleby) Order 2003
2.	In this order:
	"charging hours" means any period specified in column 5 of Part I of the Schedule in respect of which a charge is specified in Article 4;
	"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;
ere.	"owner", in relation to a vehicle means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used;
	"parking bay" means any area of a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle and indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place; and
	"parking place" means any area of land specified by name in column 1 of Part I of the Schedule provided by the Council under Section 32(1) of the Act for use as a parking place
USE C	OF LAND AND PARKING PLACE

3.	(1)	The area of land specified by name in column 1 of Part I of the Schedule may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such classes of the vehicles, in such positions on such days and during such hours, as are specified in the Schedule
	<u>(2)</u>	Where in Part I of the Schedule a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place unless it is of the class and in the position specified
	(3)	Where, within a parking place, there is a sign or surface marking which

indicates that a parking bay is available only for a disabled person's vehicle,

		the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking bay unless it is a disabled person's vehicle
	(4)	Insofar as a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours the driver thereof shall pay such charge or charges as are specified in the following provisions of this Order, unless the vehicle is a Motorcycle as defined by the Act and the Motorcycle is left in an area marked for the parking of Motorcycles free of charge. The driver of a Motorcycle left in a parking bay shall pay the charge applicable to that bay
AMOU	INT OF	INITIAL CHARGE AT PARKING PLACES
4.	(1)	This Article applies to the parking place specified by name in column 1 of Part I of the Schedule
	(2)	The initial charge for a vehicle left in the parking place specified by name in column 1 of Part I of the Schedule during the charging hours shall be as specified in column 7 of Part I of the Schedule
	(3)	The charges referred to in paragraph (2) of this Article shall be payable by the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins into the apparatus or device provided, being an apparatus or device approved in accordance with Section 35(3) of the Act, and the provisions of Section 47 (5) of the Act shall apply in respect of such apparatus
	(4)	The owner of a vehicle may on application to the Council purchase a season ticket in respect of that vehicle for a charge as specified in Part II of the Schedule and that season ticket shall be valid in such parking place as is specified thereon during the period for which it is issued
	(5)	Any ticket issued on payment of the charge referred to in a paragraph (2) of this Article, or season ticket issued in accordance with paragraph (4) of this Article shall be attached in a conspicuous position to the vehicle in respect of which it was issued. A vehicle shall not be left in a parking place if it displays an out-of-date ticket
AMOU	NT OF	PENALTY CHARGE AT PARKING PLACES
5.	(1)	If a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours in contravention of the provisions of any paragraph of this Order an amount as specified in Part III of the Schedule (which amount is hereinafter referred to as "the Penalty Charge") shall be payable PROVIDED THAT where the Penalty Charge is tendered within fourteen days of the date of the notice referred to in paragraph (2) of this Article the Council will accept in full satisfaction thereof the reduced sum as specified in Part III of the Schedule
•	<u>(2)</u>	In the case of a vehicle in respect of which an Penalty Charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a parking attendant to attach to the

vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars:

- the registration mark of the vehicle or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
- (b) the date and time at which the parking attendant first observed that the contravention was made;
- a statement that the Penalty Charge as specified in Part III of the Schedule is required to be paid;
- (d) the manner in which, and the time within which, the Penalty Charge should be paid; and

	<u>(2)</u>	No person shall use any part of a parking place or any vehicles left in a parking place: (a) for sleeping or camping or cooking; or (b) for the purpose of servicing or washing any vehicle or part thereof
		other than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from the parking place

<u>10.</u>	The driver of a vehicle using a parking place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in, or to depart from, the parking place
11.	(1) If a vehicle is left in a parking place in a position other than in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, a person authorised by the Council in that behalf may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle so that its position is in accordance with the said provisions
	(2) If a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the foregoing provisions of this Order a person authorised by the Council in that behalf may remove the vehicle from that parking place or arrange for such removal
	(3) For the purpose of meeting the requirements of any emergency, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or a police constable in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of a vehicle in a parking place or remove or arrange for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place
•	(4) Any person altering, or causing the alteration of, the position of a vehicle by virtue of paragraph (1) of this Article, or removing, or causing the removal, of a vehicle by virtue of paragraphs (2) or (3) of this Article, may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think reasonably necessary to enable the position of the vehicle to be altered or the vehicle to be removed
	(5) Any person removing or arranging for the removal of a vehicle by virtue of paragraphs (2) or (3) of this Article shall make such arrangements as he considers to be reasonably necessary for the safety of the vehicle in the place to which it is removed
12.	Where in a parking place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of:
	(a) indicating the entrance to or exit from the parking place; or
	(b) indicating that a vehicle using the parking place shall proceed in a specified direction within the parking place,
	no person shall drive or permit to be driven any vehicle (i) so that it enters the parking place otherwise than by an entrance, or leaves the parking place otherwise than by an exit, so indicated, or (ii) in a direction other than so specified
13.	No person shall, except with the permission of a person authorised by the Council in that behalf, drive or permit to be driven any vehicle in a parking place for any purpose other than the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place
14.	The registered driver of a disabled person's vehicle properly parked in accordance with this Order and with necessary badges properly displayed shall be exempt




