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# THE BOROUGH OF FAREHAM (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND PARKING PLACES) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2014

## SECTION 1 – PRELIMINARY

The Fareham Borough Council (“the Council”) in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47 and 49 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the 1984 Act”) and the Traffic Management Act 2004 (“the 2004 Act”) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on 1st April 2014 and may be cited as the Borough of Fareham (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2014.
2. The Borough of Fareham (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2013 Plans (“the Plans”) are incorporated into this Order.
3. All the traffic regulation orders and parts of traffic regulation orders imposing waiting prohibitions and restrictions and all street parking places orders which relate to roads in the Borough of Fareham as defined on the Plans made prior to this Order and listed in Schedule 4 to this consolidation order are hereby revoked. This Order consolidates all the contents of those Orders in this Order.

### Definitions

#### 4. **In this Order:-**

“authorised loading bay” means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.3 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 and specified in the Plans;

“authorised parking place” means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order or having effect as if made under the 1984 Act and specified in the Plans;

“authorised taxi rank” means an area of carriageway which is indicated by road markings complying with diagram 1028.2 in the Traffic Signs and General Directions 2002;

“Business Visitor Permit” shall mean a permit issued to businesses which comply with the conditions listed in Article 42.

“Civil Enforcement Officer” means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place or enforce restrictions indicated on the Plans;

“clearway” means any of the sides or lengths of roads specified on the Plans where stopping or waiting is prohibited for the hours as specified in the Plans

“disabled coach” means a public service vehicle as defined in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981, displaying in the relevant position a disabled person’s badge;

“disabled person’s badge” means either

- (i) a badge in the form prescribed by Regulation 11 of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000; or
- (ii) a replacement badge issued in accordance with Regulation 7 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000.

“disabled person’s vehicle” means a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person’s badge;

“driver” in relation to a vehicle means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

“Essential Visitor Permit” shall mean a permit issued to health workers who comply with the conditions listed in Article 41.

“full registered person” has the same meaning as in Section 55 of the Medical Act 1983;

“goods” includes postal packets of any description and cash over five kilograms in weight or one thousand pounds value; and “delivering” and “collecting” in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

“goods vehicle” means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, and is not drawing a trailer;

“grass verge” means any unmetalled area between the edge of the carriageway and the highway boundary

“hackney carriage” has the same meaning as in Section 38 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847;

“Health Worker” shall mean those carrying out health and medical related activities, such as doctors, nurses and midwives.

“Light Goods Vehicle” means a motor vehicle not exceeding one tonne unladen weight and which is constructed or adapted for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, and is not drawing a trailer

“loading” means the loading or unloading of goods to or from a vehicle;

“motor cycle” has the same meaning as that in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

“motor vehicle” has the same meaning as that in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

“no loading hours” means in relation to any no loading road the hours during which loading and unloading is restricted as specified on the Plans;

“no loading road” means any of the sides or lengths of roads specified on the Plans where loading is prohibited provided that the expression “no loading road” shall not include any parking place;

“no stopping hours” means in relation to any no stopping road the hours during which stopping is restricted as specified on the Plans;

“no stopping road” means any of the sides or lengths of roads specified on the Plans where stopping is prohibited as specified in the Plans;

“owner” in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used and it shall be presumed that the owner is the person in whose name the vehicle is registered at the time of the contravention this includes any person who drives a vehicle leased to them or provided for their use by their employer

“parking disc” means a device which

- (a) is 125 millimetres square and coloured blue;
- (b) has been issued by a Local Authority and has not ceased to be valid; and
- (c) is capable of showing the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting has begun;

“Passenger vehicle” means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle or invalid carriage) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than 12 passengers exclusive of the driver and not drawing a trailer.

“pedal cycle” means a unicycle, bicycle, tricycle, or a cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle of such class as is to be treated as not being a motor vehicle for the purpose of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

“penalty charge” and “reduced penalty charge” means a charge set by the Council as detailed in Schedule 1, under the provisions of section Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 which is to be paid to the Council within 28 days beginning with the date of the penalty charge notice, or 14 days in the case of a reduced penalty charge, following the issue of a penalty charge notice, or 21 days in the case of a penalty charge notice sent by post (Postal PCN).

“penalty charge notice” means a notice issued or served by a parking attendant pursuant to the provisions of Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 Act containing the particulars therein required;

“permit holder” means a person to whom a permit has been issued under the provisions of this Order;

“permitted hours” means in relation to any prohibited road the hours during which waiting or loading is prohibited as specified on the Plans;

“prohibited hours” means in relation to any prohibited road the hours during which waiting or loading is prohibited as specified on the Plans;

“prohibited road” means any of the sides or lengths of roads specified on the Plans where waiting is prohibited provided that the expression “prohibited road” shall not include any parking place;

“public service vehicle” has the meaning given in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981;

“relevant position” means:-

- (i) A vehicle displays a disabled person’s badge in the relevant position if:-
  - (a) the badge is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle, or
  - (b) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle,so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle.
- (ii) A vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:-
  - (a) the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle, or
  - (b) where the vehicle does not have a dashboard or fascia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle;so that, when marked to show the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle
- (iii) A vehicle displays a permit or waiver certificate in the relevant position if:-
  - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the permit or waiver certificate is exhibited thereon so that the details shown on the front of the permit or waiver certificate are legible from outside the vehicle;Or
  - (b) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the permit or waiver certificate is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the details shown on the front of the permit or waiver certificate are legible from outside the vehicle

“Resident parking areas” referred to as “the areas” means any of the sides or lengths of roads specified on the Plans where waiting is restricted to permit holders

“Residents’ Carer Permit” shall mean a permit issued to a residents carer of any person who complies with the conditions listed in Article 43.

“Resident Parking Area” shall mean the road or group of roads that make up a residents’ parking area as listed in Schedule 1.



"Residents" Permit" shall mean a permit issued to any person who is a resident of the roads listed in Schedule 2 and who complies with the conditions listed in Article 40.

"restricted hours" means in relation to any restricted road the hours during which waiting is restricted as specified on the Plans;

"restricted road" means any of the sides or lengths of roads specified on the Plans where waiting is restricted or specified activities are restricted during the restricted hours provided that the expression "restricted road" shall not include any parking place;

"Visitor Day Permit" shall mean a permit issued to a visitor of a resident who lives in any of the roads listed in Schedule 2 and who complies with the conditions listed in Article 43A. The Visitor Day Permit allows parking for up to 24 hours by visitors in resident parking bays in any of the roads so listed.

"Visitor Four Hour Permit" shall mean a permit issued to a visitor of a resident who live in any of the roads listed in Schedule 2 and who complies with the conditions listed in Article 43A. The Visitor Four Hour Permit allows parking for up to four hours by visitors in resident parking bays in any of the roads so listed.

"waiver certificate" means a certificate duly issued on behalf of the Council permitting a vehicle to wait in specified circumstances on a length or lengths of roads where waiting of that vehicle would otherwise be prohibited

Reference to the masculine shall include the feminine

5. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
6. A reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule having that number in this Order and any reference to a Plan is a reference to a Plan incorporated into this Order.

## SECTION 2 – PROHIBITION, RESTRICTION AND LIMITED WAITING

### 7. Prohibition of Waiting

Save as provided in Article 12 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform, cause or permit a vehicle to wait at any time on the side and lengths of a prohibited road during the prohibited hours as specified on the Plans.

### 8. No Stopping

Save as provided in Article 12 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform, cause or permit a vehicle to stop on the sides and lengths of a no stopping road during the restricted hours as specified on the Plans.

### 9. Restriction of Waiting

Save as provided in Article 12 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform, cause or permit a vehicle to wait at any time on the sides and lengths of a restricted road during restricted hours as specified on the Plans.

### 10. Limited Waiting

Save as provided in Article 12 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform, cause or permit a vehicle of the specified class to wait on any restricted road in respect of which there is specified on the Plans a period during the restricted hours in which waiting is allowed, for a period longer than specified on the Plans or if a period less than that

specified on the Plans as being the period in which the vehicle shall not return has elapsed since a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side and same length of road.

11. Prohibition Of Motor Vehicles And Pedal Cycles On Grass Verges

(Save as provided in Article 12) No person except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform shall drive or park any motor vehicle or pedal cycle on the areas of grass verges in the side and lengths of roads specified in the Plans.

12. Exemptions

- (1) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait on a side or length of road specified as a prohibited road or restricted road for so long as may be necessary to enable –
- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in or in connection with any of the following operations, namely
    - (i) building, engineering or demolition operations;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of such length of road; or
    - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, such length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984
  - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a Local Authority or water company in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (d) the vehicle to be used for fire services, ambulance or police purposes or in connection with a funeral provided always that the vehicle being used for fire service, ambulance or police purposes is a liveried vehicle;
  - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125(1) of the Postal Services Act 2000;
  - (f) the vehicle to be used in the delivery or collection of goods or to be loaded or unloaded except in respect of a no loading road or hackney carriage stand;
  - (g) the avoidance of an accident;
  - (h) the vehicle is a licensed hackney carriage applying for hire on an authorised taxi rank.
- (2) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle to wait on a side or length of prohibited road or restricted road for a period not exceeding 3 hours if –

- (a) the vehicle displays a valid disabled person's badge and a parking disc in the relevant position;
  - (b) the time at which the period of waiting commenced is marked on the parking disc; and
  - (c) a period of at least 1 hour separated the commencement of the period of waiting from any previous period of waiting on that length of road on the same day.
- (3) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait on a side or length of prohibited or restricted road if the vehicle displays in the relevant position a valid waiver certificate or permit issued by the Council and the vehicle is waiting in accordance with the terms and conditions of the said certificate.

#### Prohibition/Restriction of Loading and Unloading

13. Save as provided in article 15 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be used for the delivery or collection of goods or to be loaded or unloaded on the sides and lengths of "no loading road" during the "no loading hours" specified in the Plans.
14. No person shall cause or permit a disabled persons vehicle to wait on the sides and lengths of "No Loading Road" during the "No Loading Hours" as specified on the Plans.

#### Exemptions

15. (1) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait on a side or length of road specified as a "prohibited road" or "restricted road" for so long as may be necessary to enable –
- (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in or in connection with any of the following operations, namely
    - (i) building, engineering or demolition operations;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of such length of road; or
    - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to , such length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984
  - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a Local Authority or water company in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (c) the vehicle to be used for fire services, ambulance or police purposes or in connection with a funeral provided always that the vehicle being used for fire service, ambulance or police purposes is a liveried vehicle;
  - (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125(1) of the Postal Services Act 2000;
  - (e) the avoidance of an accident.

- (2) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait on a side or length of prohibited or restricted road if the vehicle displays in the relevant position a valid waiver certificate issued by the Council and the vehicle is waiting in accordance with the terms and conditions of the said certificate.

### SECTION 3 – PARKING PLACES

#### Authorised Parking Place for Taxis

16. The sides and lengths of road specified on the Plans for the waiting of taxis are hereby designated as authorised taxi ranks for such vehicles, on such days and during such hours subject to the provisions of this Order and as specified on the Plans.
17. Save as provided in article 27 no person shall except upon the direction of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform or police constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle other than a hackney carriage to wait on the sides and lengths of the road identified as an authorised taxi rank during the period of operation as specified on the Plans.
18. No person shall cause or permit a hackney carriage to wait on the sides and lengths of road identified as an authorised taxi rank during the period of operation of the authorised taxi rank as specified on the Plans for other than the purpose of plying for hire.
19. No person shall cause or permit a hackney carriage to wait on the sides and lengths of road identified as an authorised taxi rank outside the period of operation of the authorised taxi rank as specified on the Plans.

#### Authorised Parking Place For Disabled Persons Vehicles

20. The sides and lengths of roads authorised and specified as disabled persons' parking places on the Plans are hereby designated as parking places for disabled persons' vehicles on such days and during such hours as specified on the Plans.
21. Save as provided in article 27 no person shall except upon the direction of a Civil Enforcement Officer or police constable in uniform cause or permit a vehicle to wait during the permitted hours as specified on the Plans.
22. It is not unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a disabled persons' parking place for the period not exceeding that specified in the Plans, if any,
- (a) if the vehicle displays in the relevant position a disabled persons' badge and, where a time limit applies, a parking disc;
  - (b) where a time limit applies the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting commenced is marked on the parking disc; and
  - (c) where a period of not less than that specified on the Plans has elapsed since the previous period of waiting on the same length of road by the same vehicle on the same day.

#### Disabled Coach Bay

23. The sides and lengths of road authorised and specified on the Plans as disabled coach bays are hereby designated as parking places for disabled coaches on such days and during such hours as specified on the Plans.
24. Save as provided in article 27 no person shall except upon the direction of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform or police constable in uniform cause or permit a vehicle

other than a disabled coach to wait in the disabled coach bay on such days and during such hours as designated on the Plans.

#### Loading Areas

25. The sides and lengths of road specified on the Plans for loading and unloading are hereby designated as loading areas for such vehicles on such days during such hours subject to the provisions of this Order and as specified on the Plans.
26. Save as provided in article 27 no person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform, cause or permit any goods vehicle to wait in any loading area specified on the Plans except for the loading and unloading of goods for a period longer than specified on the Plans, if any.

#### Exemptions

27. (1) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait on a side or length of road designated as a parking place for so long as may be necessary to enable –
- (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in or in connection with any of the following operations, namely
    - (i) building, engineering or demolition operations;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of such length of road; or
    - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, such length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.
  - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a Local Authority or water company in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (c) the vehicle to be used for fire services, ambulance or police purposes or in connection with a funeral provided always that the vehicle being used for fire service, ambulance or police purposes is a liveried vehicle;
  - (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125(1) of the Postal Services Act 2000;
  - (e) the avoidance of an accident;
  - (f) the vehicle is a licensed hackney carriage applying for hire on an authorised taxi rank.
- (2) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a designated parking place if the vehicle displays in the relevant position a valid waiver certificate issued by the Council and the vehicle is waiting in accordance with the terms and conditions of the said certificate.



#### SECTION 4 – RESIDENTS PERMIT PARKING PLACES

28. The sides and lengths of road specified in the Plans (annexed to this Order) as parking for permit holders are hereby designated as residents parking areas for such vehicles on such days and during such hours subject to the provisions of this Order and as specified on the Plans.
29. Save as provided in Article 43C, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable or a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the permitted hours in the residents parking areas specified in the Plans unless a valid permit relating to that resident parking area, issued in accordance with the provisions of this order is displayed on the vehicle in the relevant position in the front windscreen.
30. Permit types available are Residents' Permits, Essential Visitor Permits, Business Visitor Permits, Residents' Carer Permits, Visitor Day Permits and Visitor Four Hour Permits.

#### **Provisions as to Residents Permits, Essential Visitor Permits, Business Visitor Permits, Residents Carer Permits, Visitor Day Permits and Visitor Four Hour Permits**

##### Display of Permit

31. At all times during which the vehicle is left in any of the residents parking areas during the restricted hours there shall be a permit displayed clearly on the front windscreen of that vehicle.
32. Where the permit has been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 31, no person, not being the driver, shall remove the permit from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of the vehicle.

##### Removal of Vehicle in an emergency

33. A Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place he thinks fit, any vehicle left in any of the residents parking areas as detailed in Article 56.

#### **Provisions as to Residents' Permits, Essential Visitor Permits and Residents' Carer Permits**

##### Surrender and Withdrawal of Permit

- (1) A permit holder may surrender a permit to the Council at any time;
- (2) The Council, may, by notice in writing served on the permit holder by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address believed to be that persons place of abode, withdraw a permit if it appears to the Council that one of the events set out in paragraphs (3)(a), (b), or (c) below, has occurred and the permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of the aforementioned notice;
- (3) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of paragraph (ii) are:-
- (a) The permit holder ceasing to be a resident;
  - (b) The permit holder ceasing to be the owner or keeper of the vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued
  - (c) The withdrawal of such permit by the Council under the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article;
  - (d) The vehicle in respect of which such permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that is more than 2 tonnes (40cwt) un-laden weight;



- (e) The issue of a duplicate permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 36;
  - (f) The permit ceasing to be valid pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article.
- (4) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Article, a permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified thereon (which period shall be that in respect of which payment has been made) or on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraphs (3)(a) – (3)(e) of this Article.

35. Duplicate/Replacement Permits

- (1) If the permit is mutilated or accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the permit holder shall either surrender it to the Council or apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate permit and the Council, upon receipt of the permit shall issue a duplicate or replacement permit, so marked and upon such issue, the original permit shall become invalid.
- (2) If the permit is lost or destroyed, the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate permit and the Council, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction, shall issue a duplicate/replacement permit so marked and upon such issue, the original permit shall become invalid. There will be an administration charge as stated in Schedule 3.
- (3) The provisions of this order shall apply to a duplicate/replacement permit and an application therefore as if it were a permit or as the case may be an application therefore.

Application for a Permit

36. Applications shall be submitted in written or electronic form and shall include the following particulars:-
- (a) The registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the permit has been issued, except for the Resident Carers permit;
  - (b) The period during which the permit intends to remain valid;
  - (c) An indication that the permit has been issued by the Council;
  - (d) An indication that the charge appropriate to the period during which the permit shall remain valid has been paid to the Council in connection with the issue of the permit; and
  - (e) The relevant area to which the permit relates.

Charges and Refund of Permits

37. The charge in connection with the issue of a permit for leaving of a vehicle in any one of the relevant parking areas on the carriageway during the restricted hours shall be as specified in Schedule 3.
38. Any resident who is also the holder of a Disabled Persons Badge shall be exempt from the charge on the presentation of the Disabled Persons Badge.
39. A permit holder may apply for a refund of the permit on the following basis:
- (1) A permit holder who surrenders a permit to the Council before the permit becomes invalid shall be entitled to a refund of the charge paid in respect of the issues thereof.

- (2) The refund of the charge paid in respect of permit cost the provisions of paragraph (3) of this Article plus an administration charge specified in Schedule 3.
- (3) The part of the charge which is refundable under the provisions of the last foregoing paragraph shall be calculated as 1/12<sup>th</sup> of each of the remaining full months that the permit is valid.

40. Provisions as to Residents' Permits

- (1) Any resident of the roads specified in Schedule 2, who is the owner or keeper of a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle under 2 tonnes in un-laden weight, may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit to allow that vehicle to wait in the relevant parking area on the carriageway within the permitted hours. Any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council, shall include the particulars and information by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by a remittance for such charge specified in Article 37 as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which the application is being made.
- (2) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a permit, or an existing permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a permit made by them as they reasonably may require to verify any particulars or information given to the Council as they may reasonably require to verify that the application or permit is valid.
- (3) On receipt of an application for a permit duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article the Council has the right to limit the allocation of permits to the maximum permits per address as specified by road in Schedule 2.

41. Provisions as to Essential Visitor Permits

- (1) Health workers may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit to park in any of the roads specified in Schedule 1, provided the vehicle is a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle under 2 tonnes (40cwt) in un-laden weight. Any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council, shall include the particulars and information by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by a remittance for such charge specified in Article 37 as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which the application is being made.
- (2) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a health worker permit, or an existing permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a permit made by them as they reasonably may require to verify any particulars or information given to the Council as they may reasonably require to verify that the application or permit is valid. Health workers are only permitted to use the permit when carrying out a visit to persons living in streets listed in Schedule 1.

42. Provisions as to Business Visitor Permits

- (1) Any business with premises specified in Schedule 2 or which operates in Fareham town centre may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit to allow the person conducting business in that area to wait in the relevant parking area for a period of up to one hour. Any such application shall be made on the form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by a remittance for such charge specified in Article 37 as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which the application is being made.
- (2) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a Business Visitor permit, or an existing permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a permit made by them as they reasonably may require to verify any particulars or information given to the Council as they may reasonably require to verify that the application or permit is valid. Business Visitor permits will normally require evidence of conducting business for visiting in that area.

43. Provisions as to Residents' Carer Permits

- (1) Any resident of the roads specified in Schedule 2, who has a carer visitor, may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit to allow the vehicle of the carer to wait in the relevant parking area within the permitted hours. Any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council, shall include the particulars and information by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by a remittance for such charge specified in Article 37 as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which the application is being made.
- (2) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a Residents' Carer permit, or an existing permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a permit made by them as they reasonably may require to verify any particulars or information given to the Council as they may reasonably require to verify that the application or permit is valid. Residents' Carer permits will normally require evidence of a health or medical requirement for visiting.

43A. Provisions as to Visitor Day Permits and Visitor Four Hour Permits

- (1) Any resident of the roads specified in Schedule 2 who is eligible for a residents parking permit can also apply to the Council for Visitor Day Permits or Visitor Four Hour Permits for their visitors. Any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council, shall include the particulars and information by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by a remittance for such charge specified in Schedule 3 as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which the application is being made.
- (2) The Council may at any time require an applicant for visitor day permits, visitor four hour permit or an existing permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a permit made by them as they reasonably may require to verify any particulars or information given to the Council as they may reasonably require to verify that the application or permit is valid.
- (3) Visitor Day Permits and Visitor Four Hour Permits may only be used:
  - (a) By persons visiting residents of the streets listed in Schedule 2;
  - (b) For the parking of passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle under 2 tonnes (40cwt) in un-laden weight.
- (4) The Council may decline to issue or restrict the number of Visitor Day Permits or Visitor Four Hour Permits issued.

43B. Suspension of a parking place

- (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of the residents parking areas or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary.
- (2) A Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform may suspend for not longer than 24 hours the use of any of the residents parking areas or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonable necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- (3) Any person suspending the use of any of the residents parking areas or any part thereof with the provisions of paragraphs (1) or (2) of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to the relevant areas or part thereof the use of which is suspended, a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.

43C. Exemptions

- (1) Nothing in Article 29 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the areas on the carriageway during the restricted hours for so long as it may be necessary to enable:
  - (a) The vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations:
    - (i) Building or demolition operations;
    - (ii) The removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) The maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the area;
    - (iv) The laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the area of any sewer, or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus.
  - (b) The vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (c) The vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125(1) of the Postal Services Act 2000;
  - (d) The vehicle to be used by a registered Medical Practitioner, Nurse or Home Help in the course of his/her professional duties;
  - (e) The vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
  - (f) There is a maximum observation period of five minutes for vehicles under 2 tonnes (40cwt) in un-laden weight;
  - (g) The vehicle is being in use in connection with the removal of furniture from one dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
  - (h) For the conveyance of occupiers of premises adjacent to the relevant area at times of weddings or funerals;
  - (i) disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge.
- (2) Except as provided in the foregoing provisions of this Article, no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any residents parking area during the permitted hours.

43D. It is not unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a residents parking area if the vehicle displays in the relevant position a valid waiver certificate issued by the Council and the vehicle is waiting in accordance with the terms and conditions of the said certificate.

SECTION 5 – WAIVER CERTIFICATE

44. The Council may issue a waiver certificate on receipt of written application with at least 5 working days notice and may impose terms and conditions as appropriate.
45. A charge may be made for a waiver certificate as determined by the Council.

46. A waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid. Notification of such cancellation shall be in writing to the holder of the waiver certificate at any address that the Council believes to be that person's address and the waiver certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council.

#### SECTION 6 – CONTRAVENTION OF ORDER

47. If a vehicle is left in a parking area during the permitted hours or in any road or length of road in contravention or without complying with the requirements of this Order and as specified on the Plans a contravention shall have occurred and a penalty charge shall be payable and/or the vehicle may be removed from that location.

##### Penalty Charge Notice

48. In the case of vehicles in respect of which a penalty charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of the Civil Enforcement Officer to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars:
- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
  - (b) the grounds on which the Civil Enforcement Officer believes that a Penalty Charge is payable in respect of that vehicle;
  - (c) the amount of Penalty Charge required to be paid;
  - (d) that if the penalty charge is paid before the end of the period of 14 days beginning with the date of the notice, the amount of the penalty charge will be reduced by the specified proportion or amount;
  - (e) that if the penalty charge is not paid before the end of the 28 day period a Notice to Owner may be served by the Council on the person appearing to be the owner of the vehicle;
  - (f) the address to which payment of the Penalty Charge must be sent;
  - (g) the name of the enforcement authority;
  - (h) the date on which the is served; and
  - (i) the manner in which the penalty charge must be paid.

##### Manner of Payment of Penalty Charge and Reduced Penalty Charge

49. The owner of a vehicle in respect of which the Penalty Charge has been incurred shall pay the Penalty Charge to the Council by cheque or postal order which shall be delivered or sent by post so as to reach the Council's Offices within 28 days of the issue of the penalty charge OR in cash in person at the Council's Offices not later than as aforesaid OR by credit card or debit card OR electronically through the Council's web site.
50. If the Penalty Charge is paid before the end of the period of 14 days beginning with the date of the Penalty Charge Notice, the amount of the Penalty Charge will be reduced by 50%, or 21 days in the case of a Penalty Charge Notice served by post.
51. Payment shall be received not later than 1600 hours on the 28<sup>th</sup> day following the day on which such Penalty Charge was incurred if the reduced charge is paid PROVIDED THAT if the said 28<sup>th</sup> or 14<sup>th</sup> day falls upon a day on which the Councils Offices are closed the



period within which payment of the said Penalty Charge shall be made to the Council shall be extended until 1600 hours on the next full day on which the Councils Offices are open.

52. If the owner fails to pay the penalty charge by the end of the 28 day period, a Notice to Owner may be served; and if the charge is not paid within a further 28 days it may be increased by 50% on the issue of a Charge Certificate in accordance with the provisions of Part 6 of The Traffic management Act 2004.
53. Continuing failure to pay the penalty charge may result in a debt being registered in the County Court against the owner to enable the Council to recover the payments due.

#### Indications as Evidence

54. The particulars given in the penalty charge notice attached to a vehicle in accordance with Article 48 shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay such penalty charge.

#### Restriction on Removal of Notices

55. Where a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 48, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, a Police Constable in uniform, a Civil Enforcement Officer or some other person duly authorised by the Council, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the keeper of the vehicle.

#### Removal of vehicle

56. Where a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform has removed or caused to be removed a vehicle in accordance with Articles 39 or 47:-
- (a) he shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle;
  - (b) the Council shall be entitled to recover from the person responsible such charges in respect of removal, storage and disposal of the vehicle as it might prescribe from time to time;
  - (c) the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended shall apply to the disposal of any such vehicle removed by or on behalf of the Council pursuant to this Article.

Nothing in this Article shall apply in respect of a vehicle displaying in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge issued by any local authority.

#### 57. Derogation and Precedence over other Orders

- (1) The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any Regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.
- (2) Where the provisions of any Order made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 which imposes any prohibition or restriction on waiting by vehicles or grant any exemption from such prohibition or restriction relate to a length of road designated as a parking place in this Order the provisions of the parking place in this Order shall prevail.
