



**THE FYLDE BOROUGH (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER  
2007 – AMENDMENT ORDER NO. 4 (2018)**

**NOTICE OF MAKING**

**NOTICE** is hereby given that the Fylde Borough Council has made an Order under Sections 32, 33 and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to amend the The Fylde Borough (Off-Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2007 (the 2007 Order) to allow overnight parking of motor homes at the North Beach Car Park, Lytham St Annes and to change the charging structure as shown in the column 'New Charges' in the table below. Otherwise the restrictions in the 2007 Order (as previously amended) will continue to apply.

The reason the Council proposes to make the Order is to address current off-street parking requirements at North Beach Car Park and the Order shall be known as The Fylde Borough (Off-Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2007 – Amendment Order No. 4 (2018).

The Order will come into force on 29<sup>th</sup> March 2018

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or of any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
