

COTSWOLD DISTRICT COUNCIL
(OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2007

THE COTSWOLD DISTRICT COUNCIL ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 32, 35 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and under the Road Traffic Act 1991 as amended (whether generally or in relation to the area of the Council) ("the 1991 Act") and of all other enabling powers, with the consent of the Gloucestershire County Council in accordance with Section 39(3) of the 1984 Act and after consulting with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with paragraph 20 of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby make the following Order:-

PART I
GENERAL

Commencement and Citation

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 5th day of November 2007 and may be cited as The Cotswold District Council (Off-Street Parking Places)(Consolidation) Order 2007.

Interpretation

2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:

"Articulated Vehicle" has the same meanings as in Section 138 (3) of the 1984 Act

"Bank Holiday" means Easter Monday, the last Monday in May, the last Monday in August, Christmas Day, 26 December, if it is not a Sunday, and 27 December, when 25 or 26 December is a Sunday;

"Charging Hours" means the hours specified in column 5 of the Schedule to this Order in respect of any Parking Place

"the Designated Parking Space Licences" means the twenty-two annual parking licences to be issued by the Council in respect of the Chipping Car Park at Tetbury only to a person or persons nominated by the Feoffees in respect of a specific vehicle or vehicles

"Driver" in relation to a Vehicle waiting in a Parking Place means an able-bodied person driving the Vehicle at the time it was left in a Parking Bay or the person deemed to be the Driver under the terms of this Order

"Disabled Persons' Badge" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons (England) Regulations 2000

"Expiry time" is the time indicated [as paid until] on the pay and display ticket and is the time by which the vehicle must leave the parking place;

"the Feoffees" means The Feoffees of the Lordship of the Manor of Tetbury [acting by such person as the Feoffees shall nominate from time to time]

"Goods Vehicle" has the same meanings as in Section 138 (3) of the 1984 Act

"Motor Car" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for the carriage of persons and/or goods and having an unladen weight not exceeding 2540kg

"Motor Cycle" has the meaning assigned to it by Section 136 of the 1984 Act

"Motor Vehicle" has the meaning assigned to it by Section 136(1) of the 1984 Act

"Owner" means the person in whose name the vehicle was at that time registered under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994;

"Parking Attendant" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise the parking places and enforce the restrictions imposed by this Order

"Parking bay" means an area of a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle of a class specified and indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place or signed or otherwise indicated by signs in the parking place;

"Parking Place" means any area of land specified by name in the Schedules and provided by the Council pursuant to Section 32(1) of the Act for use as an off-street car park and not closed (in part or in whole) by a Notice erected thereon by authority of the Council;

"Pay and Display ticket" means a ticket issued by a ticket machine located in the parking place in which the vehicle has been left or issued by a person nominated by the Council on payment of a charge and valid for a parking period as detailed in the Schedule

"Penalty Charge" means the charge set by the Council under Section 43 and Section 82(1) of the 1991 Road Traffic Act, which is to be paid to the Council following the issue of a Penalty Charge Notice and within 28 days of the issue of that Notice;

"Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued by or served by a Parking Attendant pursuant to the provisions of Section 43 and Section 66 of the 1991 Road Traffic Act;

"Public Service Vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981

"Relevant Position" means that the Ticket is exhibited in a conspicuous position facing forward inside the Vehicle and can easily be viewed by the Parking Attendant from the front of the Vehicle

"Season Ticket" means a ticket purchased from the Council and issued subject to certain conditions, valid for the period specified on the ticket and in the parking place specified on the ticket

"Ticket Machine" means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the Secretary of State for Transport for the purpose of this order, being apparatus designed to indicate the time by a clock and to issue parking tickets which show that a payment has been made of an amount or for a period specified thereon and which specify the date and, either the time of such payment, or the time at which the vehicle must leave the parking place.

"Trailer" means a vehicle drawn by a Motor Vehicle and includes a caravan or boat trailer

3. Except where the context requires otherwise, any reference in this Order to an Article or Schedule shall be construed as a reference to that Article or Schedule in this Order.
4. Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
5. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order.

PART II

DESIGNATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES

Designation

6. Each area of land referred to in Schedule 1 may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, as a place to leave vehicles of such classes, in such positions, on such days, during such hours, for such period and on payment of such charges as are specified in relation thereto in the Schedule.

Class and position of vehicle

7. Where in the Schedule a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or vehicles to be left in a specified location, no person shall permit a vehicle to wait in that parking place or in any parking bay within the parking place,
 - (i) unless it is of the specified class;
 - (ii) unless it is wholly within a marked parking bay; or
 - (iii) in a position other than that specified.

Maximum period of stay

8. Where in the Schedule a parking place is described as available on specified days, during specified hours or for a maximum period of stay, no person shall permit a vehicle to wait in that parking place on any day, during such hours or for any period other or longer than those specified.

Period of no return

9. Where in the Schedule a parking place is described as having a period within which a vehicle may not return, no person shall permit a vehicle to wait in that parking place on any day, during such hours within which the vehicle is excluded from waiting in the parking place.

Season Ticket

10. Nothing in Articles 8 and 9 shall preclude a vehicle displaying a valid Season Ticket in the relevant position from being parked without payment of the daily charge in the relevant parking places specified in the Schedule up to a maximum period of 7 consecutive days.

Designated Parking Space Licence

11. Nothing in Articles 8 and 9 shall preclude a person who has purchased a Designated Parking Space Licence from parking a vehicle in a Designated Parking Place in the Chipping Car Park at Tetbury without payment of the daily charge.

Disabled person's parking bays

12. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to park in a parking bay marked for Disabled Persons unless the vehicle displays a Disabled Person's Badge and Clock in the relevant position and immediately before or immediately after the act of parking the vehicle has been or is about to be used by the person(s) in respect of whom the badge has been issued

Motor cycle parking bays

13. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to park in a parking bay marked for motor cycles unless the vehicle is a motor cycle.

Loading and Unloading of Goods

14. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to park in a parking bay reserved for the loading and unloading of goods unless the vehicle is being used exclusively for the active loading or unloading of goods for no longer than is necessary for that purpose.

For the purposes of this Article "active loading or unloading" means goods are at the time being carried to or from the vehicle by the Driver or his assistant

Power to close or suspend parking places

15. Nothing in this Order shall prevent the Council by notice, sign or barrier displayed in the parking place:
 - (i) from closing the parking place or any part thereof for any period; and/or
 - (ii) from setting aside the parking place or any part or parts thereof on all days or on certain days or during certain parts of days for use only by particular vehicles or organisations.
16. Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Article 15 shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof a notice or traffic sign indicating that the use of that parking place or that part thereof is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
17. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a parking place or any part thereof during such periods that the use of that parking place or that part thereof is suspended or during such period as there is in or adjacent thereto a notice or traffic sign placed by or on behalf of the Council in pursuance of the preceding Article.

PART III
CHARGES FOR PARKING

Payment

18. The driver of a vehicle using a parking place shall upon leaving the vehicle in the parking place pay the appropriate charge (if any) in accordance with the scale of charges specified in the Schedule.

Pay and Display parking places

19. The driver of a vehicle using a Pay and Display parking place shall upon leaving the vehicle in the parking place, and on payment of a charge, purchase a Pay and Display Ticket at the level of charge and for the period required in accordance with the instructions on the machine and the scale of charges specified in the Schedule.

Means of payment

20. The charge referred to in the preceding Article shall be payable by the insertion of an appropriate coin, coins or banknotes, or other approved method of payment together making up the amount of the charge into the ticket machine situated in that parking place or by payment to a person nominated by the Council.

Availability and Validity of Advance Credit Card for payment of parking charges at a Parking Place

21. A Ticket Machine may contain a credit card reader being a device able to accept payment for a Ticket by means of decrementing credit card or similar and a person may on application to the Council purchase a decrementing credit card for whichever Parking Place the Council may prescribe and at whatever charge the Council may from time to time determine.

Display of ticket

22. The driver of the vehicle shall
- (i) display the Pay and Display Ticket issued on payment of the charge in the relevant position on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued, and
 - (ii) ensure that a Pay and Display Ticket is purchased and displayed to cover the entire period that the vehicle is parked in the parking place.

Validity of Pay and Display Tickets

23. A Pay and Display Ticket is not transferable from one vehicle to another.
24. A Pay and Display Ticket is valid only in the parking place in which it was issued. This is defined by the reference code of the parking ticket machine located in that parking place printed on the Pay and Display Ticket.

Expiry of parking period

25. the expiry time is the time exhibited on the Pay and Display Ticket displayed on a vehicle. The period will have expired when the time indicated on the clock of the parking ticket machine that issued the ticket is later than the time indicated on the Pay and display ticket

No ticket displayed

26. If at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place no Pay and Display Ticket is displayed on that vehicle in the relevant position and in accordance with the provisions of Article 17, it shall be deemed that the charge has not been paid.
27. If at the time when a vehicle is left during the permitted hours in a parking place and on the nearest ticket machine in that parking place there is a notice placed by any person duly authorised by the Council, indicating that the said ticket machine is out of order, or the parking ticket machine displays "not in use", then a pay and display ticket shall be obtained from another machine (where provided).
28. Where no valid Pay and Display Ticket can be obtained and displayed vehicles may be left in a parking place but may not be left for longer than the maximum period of waiting in that parking place as specified in the Schedule.

Season Tickets

29. Season Tickets are available at the appropriate fee, for a vehicle of a specific class and for the parking places as specified in the Schedule subject to conditions determined from time to time by the Council.
30. The driver shall abide by the terms stipulated by the Council for the use of the Season Ticket.
31. A Season Ticket is only valid in the parking place in respect of which it was issued and up to the date of expiry shown on the season ticket.
32. A Season Ticket remains the property of the Council and must be surrendered on request. In such instances where a refund fee is appropriate this will be provided in accordance with the Council's policies.

Display of Season Ticket

33. The driver of the vehicle shall display the Season Ticket in the relevant position on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued at all times during which the vehicle is left in the parking place during the hours of operation.

Replacement Season Tickets

34. Damaged or lost Season Tickets will be replaced on application to the Council and on payment of an administration fee of £10.00. The damaged or lost Season Ticket will then become immediately invalid.

Surrender of Season Ticket

35. A holder of an annual Season Ticket on surrendering the ticket shall be entitled to a refund based upon the number of complete months remaining un-expired from the beginning of the calendar month following the date on which the Council receives the surrendered ticket. The refund will be one twelfth of the annual rate for each un-expired calendar month less a £10.00 administration fee.

Designated Parking Space Licences

36. Designated Parking Space Licences are available to persons nominated by the Feoffees at the appropriate fee for a vehicle of a specified class for the Chipping Car Park at Tetbury only subject to conditions determined from time to time by the Feoffees

Restriction on removal

37. When a Pay and Display Ticket or Season Ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle in the relevant position no person shall remove the Pay and Display ticket or season ticket or permit from the vehicle until the vehicle is removed from the parking place.

PART IV

EXEMPTIONS FROM DAILY CHARGES

38. No daily charge shall be payable in respect of;
- (i) a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a valid Disabled Person's Badge and Clock provided that the vehicle immediately before or after the act of parking has been used or is about to be used by the person(s) in respect of whom the badge is issued;
 - (ii) a motor cycle which is left in a parking bay specified for such vehicles (if any);

- (iii) a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a Season Ticket valid for that parking place;
- (iv) a vehicle parked in a Designated Parking Space in the Chipping Car Park at Tetbury by a person who has purchased a Designated Parking Space Licence
- (v) a vehicle belonging to the emergency services attending an emergency

Absence of ticket machine

39. If at the time when a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours there is no ticket machine at the parking place, or all the ticket machines at that parking place carry notices placed upon them by a person duly authorised by the council indicating that they are out of order or display "not in use", the driver of that vehicle shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket.

PART V

RELOCATION AND REMOVAL OF VEHICLES

Relocation of a vehicle

40. Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of this Order, or is left in such a manner so as to cause danger or obstruction a Parking Attendant or a person authorised by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle.

Removal of a vehicle

41. Where a Parking Attendant or a person authorised by the Council is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in this Order have been contravened or not complied with in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place he/she may, using such measures as are appropriate, remove or cause to be removed the vehicle from the parking place.

Emergencies

42. A Parking Attendant, a person authorised by the Council or a Police Constable in uniform may, using such measures as are appropriate, move or cause to be moved in the case of an emergency to any place he/she thinks fit, any vehicle left in a parking place.

Safe keeping

43. Any person removing a vehicle from a parking place under the preceding Articles shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary to provide for the safe keeping of the vehicle

PART VI OTHER PROVISIONS

Stop engine and apply brakes

44. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in the parking bay and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place;
45. The driver of a vehicle using a parking place shall, except in the case of a motor cycle, set or apply the braking system of the vehicle so as to prevent effectually at least two, or in the case of a vehicle with three wheels or less, one, of the wheels from revolving when the vehicle is not being driven or is left unattended

Manner of parking of trailers

46. The driver of a vehicle drawing a trailer shall not permit the vehicle or the trailer to wait in a parking place unless they have been disconnected, and for the purposes of this Order the vehicle and the trailer shall be deemed to be separate vehicles and the driver of the leading vehicle shall be deemed to be the driver of both of the vehicles.

Repair of vehicles in parking places

47. No person shall, while a vehicle is in a parking place, permit the carrying out of any work of maintenance or repair thereto except such as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be moved from the parking place.

Vehicle Tax and Insurance

48. No person shall permit any vehicle to wait in a parking place:
- (i) unless the vehicle displays a current licence issued in accordance with the provisions of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994;

- (ii) unless there is in relation to the use of the vehicle by the driver such a policy of insurance as complies with requirements of the Road Traffic Act 1988;

Entry and Exit

49. Where signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of indicating the entrances to or exits from the parking place; or indicating that a vehicle proceed in a specified direction, no person should drive or cause to be driven any vehicle;
- (i) so that it enters the parking place otherwise than by an entrance, or leaves the parking place otherwise than by an exit;
 - (ii) in a direction other than that specified, as the case may be;
 - (iii) In a manner or at a speed so as to cause danger to other users of the parking place.

Use of vehicles and parking places

50. No person shall in a parking place:
- (i) without the express written permission of the Council, use a vehicle, in connection with the sale of any article, including the vehicle itself, to any person in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of skill or services in any other capacity;
 - (ii) sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place;
 - (iii) except with the permission or at the direction of a Parking Attendant or a person authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform, drive any vehicle other than for the purpose of leaving the vehicle in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place or for the purpose of visiting any amenity site in the parking place;
 - (iv) use any part of the parking place or a vehicle in a parking place without the express written permission of the Council for;
 - (a) sleeping or camping purposes;
 - (b) cooking purposes;
 - (c) the purpose of washing, valeting or servicing any vehicle
 - (d) the transfer of goods of any description from one vehicle to another or the loading and unloading of goods

- (v) use that parking place solely as a means of passage proceeding from one road to another;
- (vi) deposit or leave any vehicle, trailer, or anything which formed part of a vehicle or trailer, or any rubbish, litter or anything with the purpose of abandoning it there.
- (vii) wantonly shout or otherwise make any noise to cause disturbance or annoyance of users of the parking place or residents or other occupiers of adjacent premises;
- (viii) act in a manner to cause nuisance or danger to any car park user, resident or other person;
- (ix) without the express written permission of the Council, erect or cause or permit to be erected, any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure;
- (x) light or cause to be lit a fire;
- (xi) play any ball game or participate in any sporting or recreational activity.
- (xii) use any threatening, abusive or insulting language, gesture or conduct with the intent to put any person in fear or so as to occasion a breach of the peace or whereby a breach of the peace is likely to be occasioned
- (xiii) carry on any trade or business of whatever description without the prior written consent of the Council
- (xiv) distribute, allow to be or cause to be distributed or place on any vehicle any literature, advertising material or handbill except with the prior written consent of the Council and upon payment of a fee determined by the Council
- (xv) transfer fuel out of or into a Vehicle except where necessary to allow the Vehicle to be driven away
- (xvi) No person shall drive a Vehicle in a Parking Place at a speed in excess of 10 miles per hour.
- (xvii) Use a vehicle in contravention of the directions of a Parking Attendant

Animals and Parking Places

- 51. no dog or other animal shall be allowed to foul a Parking Place other than in area set aside for that purpose (if any).
- 52. animals shall be kept under control
- 53. sufficient ventilation and other comforts shall be provided if an animal is left in a Vehicle in a Parking Place

54. where it is considered by the Parking Attendant or a person authorised by the Council or a Police Constable in uniform that an animal is suffering due to being kept in an enclosed Vehicle in hot or inappropriate conditions it shall be the duty of that person to take whatever action is considered necessary to relieve that suffering including the breakage of window, glass or locks of the Vehicle
55. large animals such as horses and farm livestock shall not be permitted to enter a Parking Place except as herein reserved

Emergency Services Vehicles

56. All Vehicles belonging to the emergency services when attending any emergency may use a Parking Place and be exempt from compliance with any of the conditions specified in this Order.

PART VIII

LIABILITIES / PENALTIES

Liability

57. The Council accepts no liability for the loss or damage to vehicles or other property left in any of the Council's parking places to which this Order applies.

PART VII

CONTRAVENTION AND PENALTY CHARGE

Contravention

58. If a vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in the Schedule without complying with the requirements of this Order, a contravention shall have occurred and a penalty charge shall be payable. A Penalty Charge Notice showing the information required by the 1991 Road Traffic Act may then be issued by a Parking Attendant in accordance with the requirements of the 1991 Road Traffic Act.

Notice of penalty charge

59. In the case of a vehicle in respect of which the penalty charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a Parking Attendant to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a Notice which shall include the following particulars:

- (i) The grounds on which the Parking Attendant believes that a penalty charge is payable with respect to the vehicle;
- (ii) The amount of the penalty charge which is payable;
- (iii) That the penalty charge must be paid before the end of the period of 28 days beginning with the date of the Notice;
- (iv) that if the penalty charge is paid before the end of the period of 14 days beginning with the date of the Notice, the amount of the penalty charge will be reduced by the specified proportion;
- (v) that if the penalty charge is not paid before the end of the 28 day period a Notice to the owner may be served by the Local Authority on the person appearing to them to be the owner of the vehicle;
- (vi) the address to which payment of the penalty charge must be sent.

Restriction on removal of notices

60. A penalty charge Notice fixed to a vehicle in accordance with the preceding Article shall not be removed or interfered with except by or under the authority of:

- (i) the owner, or person in charge of, of the vehicle;
- (ii) a Parking Attendant or some other person duly authorised by the Council.

Payment of penalty charge

61. The owner of a vehicle in respect of which the penalty charge has been incurred shall pay the penalty charge to the Council by cheque or postal order which shall be delivered or sent by post so as to reach the cash office of the Council within 28 days of the issue of the penalty charge OR in cash in person at the said cash office not later than as aforesaid OR by credit card or debit card OR electronically through the Council's web site.

62. If the penalty charge is paid before the end of the period of 14 days beginning with the date of the Notice, the amount of the penalty charge will be reduced by the specified proportion.

63. If the penalty charge remains unpaid after 56 days from the date the penalty charge notice was issued and a charge certificate is issued the penalty charge issued shall be increased by 50%
64. Payment shall be received not later than 1600 on the 28th day following the day on which such Penalty Charge was incurred or the 14th day following the day on which the Charge was incurred if the reduced charge is paid.
- Provided that if the said 28th or 14th day falls upon a day on which the Council's Offices at Trinity Road Cirencester or other nominated place are closed, the period within which payment of the said Penalty Charge shall be made to the Council shall be extended until 1600 on the next full day on which the Council's Offices at Trinity Road Cirencester or other nominated place are open.

Indications as Evidence

65. The particulars given in the Penalty Charge Notice attached to a vehicle in accordance with this Article shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay such Penalty Charge.

PART VIII

NOTICES

66. Where under the foregoing provisions of this Order a Notice is required to be or may be sent to a person the Notice shall be sent by prepaid post.

PART IX

REVOCATIONS

Revocations

67. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done before the coming into force of this Order, the following Orders and all their amendments are hereby revoked:
- 1 The Cotswold District Council (The Chipping Car Park Tetbury) (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2000;
 - 2 The Cotswold District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2001

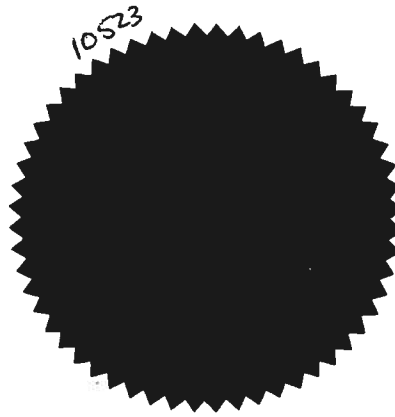
