**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

**THE HAMPSHIRE (FAREHAM) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND PARKING PLACES) CONSOLIDATION ORDER 2020**

Hampshire County Council in exercise of its powers and duties under sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47, 49, 51, 53, 122 (1) and 122 (2) of the Act, Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act, and of all other enabling and amending legislation and powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:

**PART 1**

**GENERAL**

**Citation and commencement**

1. This Order shall come into operation on 29<sup>th</sup> August 2020 and may be cited as The Hampshire (Fareham) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2020.
2. The map schedules attached hereto in Schedule 7 ("the map schedules") are incorporated into this Order.
3. All the traffic regulation orders and parts of traffic regulation orders imposing waiting prohibitions and restrictions and all on street parking places orders which relate to roads in the Borough of Fareham made prior to this Order and listed in Schedule 1 to this Order are hereby revoked. This Order consolidates all the contents of those orders in this Order.

**Definitions**

4. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:
  - "the Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
  - "the Council" means Hampshire County Council or, as the case may be, Council acting as Hampshire County Council's agents;
  - "the Regulations of 2016" means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016
  - "Area identifier" means an alpha and or alpha/numeric identifier specified in Column 1 of Schedule 3, applicable to the type of parking places specified in Column 2, which indicates the Residents Parking Area specified in Column 3 and is used on permits to identify the permit parking places for which they are valid and on signs at relevant parking places and in the map tile labels and/or map schedule legend in the map schedule to indicate the permits valid at those parking places;

"Business Visitor Permit" shall mean a permit issued to businesses which comply with the conditions listed in Article 37;

"Carriageway" means a way constituting or comprised in a highway being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles;

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person in uniform authorised by or on behalf of the Council;

"Clearway" means the main carriageway of any of the sides or lengths of roads specified in the map schedules where stopping is prohibited during the restricted hours provided that the expression clearway shall not include any lay-by or parking place;

"Designated Parking Places" means the designation of on-street parking places, parking bays, or parking areas, as the case may be, in the provisions of this Order;

"Disabled Coach" means a Public Service Vehicle as defined in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981, displaying in the Relevant Position a Disabled Person's Badge;

"Disabled Person's Badge" means either:

- (a) a badge in the form prescribed by Regulation 11 of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000; or
- (b) a replacement badge issued in accordance with Regulation 7 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000.

"Disabled person's vehicle" has the same meanings as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"Driver" in relation to a Vehicle means the person driving the Vehicle at the time it was left in the Parking Place or the contravention occurred (as the case may be);

enactment means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment;

"Goods" includes postal packets of any description and cash over five kilograms in weight or one thousand pounds value; and "delivering" and "collecting" in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"Goods Vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Regulations of 2016;

"Grass Verge" means any unmetalled area between the edge of the carriageway and the highway boundary;

"Health Worker" shall mean those carrying out health and medical related activities, such as doctors, nurses and midwives;

"invalid carriage" has the same meaning as that in Section 136 of the Act;

"Layby" means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a traffic sign of the type shown in diagram 1010 of Schedule 11, Part 4 of the 2016 Regulations, and partly by the outer edge of that carriageway on the same side of the road as that on which the sign is placed;

"Loading" means the loading or unloading of Goods to or from a Vehicle;

"Loading Bay", "Loading Place" or "Loading Area" means any of the sides or lengths of roads as specified on the map schedules as being for loading and/or unloading of specified classes or vehicles at specified periods, subject to the provisions of this Order;

"Local service" has the same meaning as in the Regulations of 2016;

"map schedule" means the map tiles attached to this Order in Schedule 7 and listed in Schedule 2, which depict the stopping, waiting and loading prohibitions and restrictions and parking places, loading places and parking areas designated by this Order, and in conjunction with the map schedule legend and/or map tile label, identifies the type of each particular type of prohibition, restriction, parking place, loading place or parking area and certain of its governing provisions;

Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the map schedule and where a prohibition, restriction, parking place, loading place or parking area is depicted on the map schedule, that provision continues to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data;

"map schedule legend" means the map schedule legend to this Order which, when used in conjunction with a map tile as listed in Schedule 2, identifies the specific types of prohibitions and restrictions of stopping, waiting, loading and the parking places, loading places or parking areas designated by this Order and, where appropriate, certain of their governing provisions;

"map tile" means an individual map with a specific tile reference, being part of the map schedules as listed in Schedule 2 to this Order;

"map tile label", where shown on a map tile forming part of the map schedule in relation to a prohibition or restriction of stopping, waiting or loading, or a designated parking place, loading place or parking area, means a label which indicates the type of provision and, if appropriate, certain of its governing conditions;

"Motor Car" has the same meaning as that in Section 136 of the Act;

"Motor Cycle" has the same meaning as that in Section 136 of the Act;

"Motor Vehicle" has the same meaning as that in Section 136 of the Act;

"No Loading Hours" means in relation to any No Loading Road the hours during which loading is prohibited as specified on the map schedules;

"No Loading Road" means any of the sides or lengths of roads identified on the map schedules where loading is restricted during the no loading hours save that the expression "No Loading Road" shall not include any Parking Place so authorised pursuant to Part 3 of this Order;

"No Stopping Hours" means in relation to any No Stopping Restriction or Road the hours during which stopping is restricted or prohibited as specified on the map schedules;

"No Stopping Road" means any of the sides or lengths of roads (including clearways) identified on the map schedules where stopping is prohibited or restricted during the No Stopping Hours as specified in the map schedules, provided that the expression "No Stopping Road" shall not include any parking place;

"Owner" in relation to a Vehicle means the registered keeper under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 at the time of the contravention;

"Parking Disc" means a device which:

- (a) is 125 millimetres square and coloured blue;
- (b) has been issued by a Local Authority and has not ceased to be valid; and
- (c) is capable of showing the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting has begun in accordance with Regulation 8(5) of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.

"Parking Place" or "Parking Area" means any part of a road or an area designated as a parking place or parking area by this Order, and identified as such in the map schedules to this Order, which is provided by the Council for the leaving of a vehicle or vehicles under the provisions of this Order, and is indicated, where applicable, by the appropriate traffic signs;

"Passenger Vehicle" means a Vehicle (other than a Motor Cycle or invalid carriage) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than 12 passengers exclusive of the Driver and not drawing a trailer;

"Pedal Cycle" means a unicycle, bicycle, tricycle, or a cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle of such class as is to be treated as not being a Vehicle;

"Penalty Charge" and "Reduced Penalty Charge" means a charge set by the Council under the provisions of Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 which is to be paid to the Council within 28 days beginning with the date of the Penalty Charge Notice, or 14 days in the case of a Reduced Penalty Charge, following the issue of a Penalty Charge Notice, or 21 days in the case of a

Penalty Charge Notice sent by post (Postal PCN);

"Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued or served by a Civil Enforcement Officer pursuant to the provisions of Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 Act containing the particulars therein required;

"Permit" means a device issued by The Council under the provisions of this Order to allow the authorised use of a parking place or area;

"Permit Holder" means a person to whom a permit or virtual parking permit has been issued under the provisions of the Order;

"Permit Parking Area" has the same meaning as in the 2016 regulations;

"Permit Parking Place" means any part of a road identified in the map schedules to this Order, which is provided by the Council for the leaving of a vehicle under the provisions of this Order, and is indicated by the prescribed traffic signs;

"Permitted Hours" means in relation to any of the roads listed in Schedule 4 to this Order the hours during which waiting or loading is permitted as specified on the map schedules;

"Prohibited hours", in relation to:

- (a) any prohibited road, pedestrian zone or restricted zone, being the hours during which a vehicle may not wait whilst complying with the relevant provisions of this Order, means the hours shown by or on a traffic sign in the vicinity of or at the entrance to such parking controls and the hours as specified on the map schedules in relation to such controls;
- (b) a school keep clear entrance marking, means the time indicated on a traffic sign placed in the vicinity of that school keep clear entrance marking and as specified on the map schedules, in relation to that school keep clear entrance marking;
- (c) a taxi rank means the time indicated on a traffic sign placed in the vicinity of that taxi rank and as specified on the map schedules, in relation to that taxi rank, as the case may be;

"Prohibited Road" means any of the sides or lengths of roads identified on the map schedules as having a prohibition of waiting, or a prohibition of waiting and loading, or as a restricted parking zone, during the prohibited hours, save that the expression "Prohibited Road" shall not include any Parking Place so authorised pursuant to Part 3 of this Order;

"Public Service Vehicle" has the meaning given in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981;

"Relevant Position" means:

- (i) A Vehicle displays a Disabled Person's Badge in the Relevant Position if:

- (a) the badge is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the Vehicle, or
- (b) where the Vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle.

so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the Vehicle.

(ii) A Vehicle displays a Parking Disc in the Relevant Position if:

- (a) the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the Vehicle, or
- (b) where the Vehicle does not have a dashboard or fascia, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle.

so that, when marked to show the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from the outside of the Vehicle.

(iii) A Vehicle displays a permit or Waiver Certificate in the Relevant Position if:

- (a) in the case of a Vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the permit or Waiver Certificate is exhibited thereon so that the details shown on the front of the permit or Waiver Certificate are legible from outside the Vehicle;

Or

- (b) in the case of a Vehicle not so fitted, the permit or Waiver Certificate is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle so that the details shown on the front of the permit or Waiver Certificate are legible from outside the Vehicle.

"Residents' Carer Permit" shall mean a permit issued to a resident carer of any person who is a resident of the roads listed in Schedule 5 who complies with the conditions listed in Article 36;

"Residents Parking Area" means a named area listed in Schedule 3, and includes those roads and parts of roads specified in Schedule 5 that contain permit parking places or areas so indicated in the map schedule, where the Area identifier indicated for such parking places or areas indicates the Residents Parking Area to which those parking places belong;

"Residents' Permit" shall mean a permit issued to any person who is a resident of the roads listed in Schedule 5 and who complies with the conditions listed in Article 35;

"Restricted Hours" means in relation to any Restricted Road the hours during which waiting is restricted as specified on the map schedules;

"Restricted parking zone" has the same meaning as in Part 2, Schedule 1 of the 2016 Regulations;

"Restricted Road" means any of the sides or lengths of roads identified on the map schedules where waiting is restricted or specified activities are restricted during the Restricted Hours save that the expression "Restricted Road" shall not include any Parking Place so authorised pursuant to Part 3 of this Order;

"Road" means any length of highway or any other length of road to which the public has access, and includes bridges over which a road passes;

"School keep clear entrance marking" means a marking outside a school entrance where vehicles must not stop, which is marked on the carriageway as prescribed by diagram 1027.1 in the 2016 Regulations;

"Service provider" means the contractor authorised by the Council to accept payment of the parking charge, either for a parking ticket, or a permit or both, on its behalf and to keep a record of that parking charge and the vehicle, parking place or area and the parking period in respect of which payment has been made using the telephone or electronic payment system;

"Taxi" has the same meaning as Hackney Carriage in Section 38 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847;

"Taxi rank " has the same meaning as in the Regulations of 2016;

"Telephone or electronic payment system" means an electronic system, using a telephone connection or electronic application set up and maintained by the service provider whereby;

- (a) the driver of a vehicle, or some other person authorised by that driver on their behalf, uses a telephone or electronic device to communicate with the service provider and make payment of the parking charge in respect of a specified vehicle and parking place in which the vehicle is left and for a specified parking period by use of a credit or debit card; and
- (b) the service provider, on behalf of the Council, accepts payment of the parking charge by the method referred to in paragraph (a) of this definition and records such payment together with the parking period for which payment has been made, the parking place in which the vehicle is left and the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which payment has been made;

"Undertaker" has the meaning given by Section 48(4) of the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991;

"Vehicle" means motor vehicle as defined in Section 136 of the Act;

"Visitor Day Permit" shall mean a permit issued to a visitor or a resident who lives in any of the roads listed in Schedule 5 and who complies with the conditions listed in Article 38. The Visitor Day Permit allows parking for up to 24 hours by visitors in the relevant Residents Parking Area;

"Virtual parking permit" means an electronic record of a permit or waiver issued and confirmed by the Council to exempt a vehicle from a restriction under the terms and charges applicable at the time of issue;

"Waiver Certificate" means a certificate duly issued on behalf of the Council permitting a Vehicle to wait in specified circumstances on a length or lengths of roads where waiting of that Vehicle would otherwise be prohibited;

Reference to the masculine shall include the feminine;

5. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
6. A reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule having that number in this Order and any reference to map schedules is a reference to the map tiles and map schedule legend making up the map schedules incorporated into this Order.
7. In the event of a dispute as to the meaning of any heading used in any part of this Order, any Schedule to this Order or any map schedule attached to this Order, the substantive wording in the Order or Schedule shall prevail over the heading. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any Regulations or Orders made or having effect as if made under the Act, or by or under any other enactment.

## **PART 2**

### **PROHIBITION, RESTRICTION AND LIMITED WAITING**

#### **Prohibition of Waiting**

8. Save as provided in Article 12 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit a Vehicle to wait at any time on the side and lengths of a Prohibited Road as identified on the map schedules.

#### **Restriction of Waiting**

9. Save as provided in Article 12 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit a Vehicle to wait on the sides and lengths of a Restricted Road during the Restricted Hours as specified on the map schedules.

#### **Limited Waiting**

10. Save as provided in Article 12 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit a Vehicle of the specified class to wait on any Restricted Road in respect of which there is specified on the map schedules a period during the Restricted Hours in which waiting is allowed, for a period longer than specified on the map schedules or if a period less than that specified on the map schedules as being the period in which the Vehicle shall not return has elapsed since a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle on the same side and same length of road.

#### **Prohibition of Motor Vehicles and Cycles On Grass Verges**



11. Save as provided in Article 12 no person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, drive or park any Motor Vehicle or Pedal Cycle on the areas of Grass Verges in the side and lengths of roads specified in the map schedules.

### Exemptions

12. (1) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait on a side or length of road specified as a Prohibited Road, Restricted Road or No Stopping Road for so long as may be necessary to enable -
- (a) a person to board or alight from the Vehicle except in locations where stopping is prohibited;
  - (b) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in or in connection with any of the following operations, namely
    - (i) building, engineering or demolition operations;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of such length of road; or
    - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, such length of road of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.
  - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority, the Environment Agency or a water or sewerage undertaker within the meaning of the Water Act 1989 Part II, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (d) the Vehicle to be used for fire and rescue services, ambulance or police purposes;
  - (e) to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a licensed universal postal service provider for the purpose of sorting, delivering or collecting postal packets in the course of the provision of a universal postal service as defined in Part 3 of the Postal Services Act 2011;
  - (f) the Vehicle to be used in the delivery or collection of Goods or Loading except in respect of a No Loading Road.
  - (g) in the case where the person in control of the vehicle –
    - (i) is required to stop by law;
    - (ii) is waiting owing to the driver being obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident;

- (iii) is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control;
  - (iv) is directed or given the permission of a police constable in uniform.
- (h) a registered Medical Practitioner, Midwife or a District Nurse in the course of their professional duties
  - (i) the delivery or collection of money or valuable property carried in a vehicle that is especially constructed or adapted for such use and is being used for those purposes in relation to the premises in the vicinity
  - (j) the Vehicle to wait at or near any premises situated on or adjacent to the said side of road for so long as is reasonable necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral;
  - (k) to enable a public service vehicle being used in the operation of a local service to wait at any authorised stopping place for the purpose of
    - (i) allowing a person to board or alight from the vehicle or pay a fare, or
    - (ii) allowing the vehicle to wait, if it arrives at the stopping place in advance of the advertised time for a period not exceeding 2 minutes;
  - (l) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said sides of road;
- (2) Nothing in Article 8 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle to wait on a side or length of Restricted Road for a period not exceeding 3 hours if -
- (a) the Vehicle displays a valid Disabled Person's Badge and a Parking Disc in the Relevant Position
  - (b) the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting commenced on the Parking Disc; and
  - (c) a period of at least 1 hour separated the commencement of the period of waiting from any previous period of waiting on that length of road on the same day.
- (3) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait on a side or length of Prohibited or Restricted Road if the Vehicle displays in the Relevant Position a valid Waiver Certificated or permit issued by the Council and the Vehicle is waiting in accordance with the terms and conditions of the said certificate or permit.

### Prohibition/Restriction of Loading

13. Save as provided in Article 15 no person shall cause or permit the Loading of any Vehicle on the sides and lengths of a No Loading Road during the No Loading Hours as specified in the map schedules.
14. No person shall cause or permit a Disabled Persons Vehicle to wait on the sides and lengths of a No Loading Road during the No Loading Hours as specified on the map schedules.
15. Nothing in this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to wait on a side or length of road identified as a No Loading Road during the No Loading Hours specified in the map schedule, provided the vehicle is being used for any of the purposes specified in Article 12 (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (g), (h), (i), (j), (k), (l) or the Vehicle displays in the Relevant Position a valid Waiver Certificate issued by the Council and the Vehicle is waiting in accordance with the terms and conditions of the said certificate.

### No Stopping

16. Save as provided in Article 12 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit a Vehicle to stop on the sides and lengths of a No Stopping Restriction or Road during the No Stopping Hours as specified on the map schedules.
17. No person shall cause or permit a Disabled Persons Vehicle to wait on the sides and lengths of a No Stopping Restriction or Road during the No Stopping Hours as specified on the map schedules.
18. Nothing in this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to wait on a side or length of road identified as a No Stopping Restriction or Road during the No Stopping Hours specified in the map schedule, provided the vehicle is being used for any of the purposes specified in Article 12 (b), (c), (d), (g), (h), (i), (j), (k), (l) or the Vehicle displays in the Relevant Position a valid Waiver Certificate issued by the Council and the Vehicle is waiting in accordance with the terms and conditions of the said certificate.

### Other Prohibitions of Waiting or Stopping

19.
  - (1) Nothing in this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a taxi licensed by Fareham Borough Council to wait or to stop in any duly authorised Taxi Rank identified in the map schedule attached to this Order, whilst attended and available for hire during the time the restrictions are in effect; or
  - (2) any vehicle to wait or stop provided it is being used for any of the purposes specified in Article 12 (b), (c), (d), (g), (j), (k), (l).

### PART 3

#### DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES OR AREAS

##### Authorisation and use of Parking places

20. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this order, each of the parts of a road marked out and/or signed and identified on the map schedules to this Order as a parking place are hereby designated as a parking place for such classes of vehicles, on such days, during such hours and for such maximum periods as are specified as appropriate by way of a map tile label and/or the map schedule legend in relation to that part of the road.
- (2) Subject to the following provisions of this order, each of the parts of a road signed and identified on the map schedules to this Order as a parking area are hereby designated as a parking area for such classes of vehicles, on such days, during such hours and for such maximum periods as are specified as appropriate by way of a map tile label and/or the map schedule legend in relation to that part of the road.
- (3) Nothing in paragraphs (1) or (2) of this article shall restrict the power of the Council to close any parking place.
- (4) Unless otherwise so identified, a parking place shall be bounded on one side of its length by the edge of the carriageway and be an area marked out to a road marking and/or depicted by a traffic sign, either in accordance with the Regulations of 2016 or, if applicable, by virtue of any special authorisation given by the Secretary of State for Transport.
- (5) Unless otherwise so identified, a parking area shall be bounded on one side of its length by the edge of the carriageway and be an area depicted by a traffic sign, either in accordance with the Regulations of 2016 or, if applicable, by virtue of any special authorisation given by the Secretary of State for Transport.
21. Where in the map schedules to this order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class, the driver of the vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place:
- (a) unless it is of the specified class; and
- (b) unless it is positioned within the parking place defined by white lines on the surface of the road and the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than fifty centimetres.

##### Vehicles for which parking places are designated

22. Subject to the provisions of this Order, each type of parking place or parking area identified as such in the in the map schedule to this Order, may be used for the leaving of the specified class of vehicles during the permitted hours as follows:

- (a) Taxi ranks may be used, subject to Articles 23, 24 and 25, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles as are licenced taxis.
- (b) Disabled persons' parking place may be used, subject to Articles 26 and 27, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles as display in the relevant position a disabled persons' blue badge;
- (c) Disabled Coaches parking places may be used subject to Article 28, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles as are Disabled Coaches
- (d) Parking places for loading or unloading by goods vehicles may be used, subject to Article 29, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles as are goods carrying vehicles;
- (e) Motorcycle parking place may be used, subject to Article 30, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles as are motorcycles;
- (f) Permit parking place or permit parking area for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles which display in the manner specified in Articles 46 and 47 a valid parking permit or in respect of which there has been granted a valid virtual parking permit which exempts them from displaying a permit; or
- (g) Nothing in this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle, which displays in the relevant positions a valid and legible disabled person's badge and a parking disc to park in a parking place or parking area.

#### **PART 4**

#### **PARKING PLACES**

##### **Parking Places for Taxis**

- 23. Save as provided in Article 31 no person shall except upon the direction of a Police Officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any Vehicle other than a taxi to wait in a Parking Place for taxis.
- 24. No person shall cause or permit a taxi to wait in a Parking Place for taxis during the period of operation of the taxi rank as specified on the map schedules other than for the purpose of paying for hire.
- 25. No person shall cause or permit a taxi or other Vehicle to wait in a Parking Place for taxis outside the period of operation of the taxi rank as specified on the map schedules.

##### **Parking Places For Disabled Person's Vehicles**

- 26. Save as provided in Article 31 no person shall except upon the direction of a Police Officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in a Parking Place for Disabled Person's Vehicles on such days and during such hours as specified in the map schedules.

27. It is not unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait in a Parking Place for Disabled Person's Vehicles for the period not exceeding that specified in the map schedules.
- (a) if the Vehicle displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Person's Badge and, where a time limit applies, a Parking Disc;
  - (b) where a time limit applies the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting commenced is marked on the Parking Disc; and
  - (c) where a period of not less than that specified on the map schedules has elapsed since the previous period of waiting on the same length of road by the same Vehicle on the same day.

#### Parking Places For Disabled Coaches

28. Save as provided in Article 31 no person shall except upon the direction of a Police Officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit a Vehicle other than a Disabled Coach to wait in a Parking Place for Disabled Coaches on such days and during such hours as specified on the map schedules.

#### Parking Places for Loading by Goods Vehicles

29. (a) Save as provided in Article 31 no person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in any Parking Place for Loading except for Loading by a Goods Vehicle for a period not longer than that specified in the map schedules, if any.
- (b) Loading or unloading has to be continuous while the vehicle is parked and includes taking goods into premises, waiting for them to be checked and documents signed. Once the delivery process has been completed the vehicle must be moved.

#### Parking Places for Motor Cycles

30. Save as provided in Article 31, each area on a highway designated as a parking place for Motor Cycles only and is indicated as such in the map schedule attached to this Order, may be used by vehicles to wait without any limitation on time, except where signs indicate otherwise, provided the vehicle is a motor cycle.

#### Exemptions

31. (1) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait on a side or length of road identified as a parking place or parking area and so authorised or designated under Part 3 of this Order for so long as may be necessary to enable -
- (a) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in or in connection with any of the following operations, namely
    - (i) building, engineering or demolition operations;

- (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
  - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of such length of road; or
  - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, such length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.
- (b) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority, the Environment Agency or a water or sewerage undertaker within the meaning of the Water Act 1989 Part II, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (c) the Vehicle to be used for fire services, ambulance or police purposes provided always that the Vehicle being used for fire service, ambulance or police purposes is a liveried Vehicle.
  - (d) For the conveyance of occupiers of premises adjacent to the relevant area at times of weddings or funerals.
  - (e) to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a licensed universal postal service provider for the purpose of sorting, delivering or collecting postal packets in the course of the provision of a universal postal service as defined in Part 3 of the Postal Services Act 2011;
  - (f) the avoidance of an accident.
  - (g) The Vehicle to be used by a Registered Medical Practitioner, Nurse or Home Help in the course of his/her professional duties.
  - (h) The Vehicle is being in use in connection with the removal of furniture from one dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository.
- (2) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait in an authorised parking place or parking area if the Vehicle displays in the Relevant Position a valid Waiver Certificate issued by the Council and the Vehicle is waiting in accordance with the terms and conditions of the said certificate.

## **PART 5**

### **PERMIT PARKING PLACES**

32. The sides and lengths of road identified in the map schedules as Permit Parking Places or Permit Parking Areas are hereby designated as parking places or parking areas for Permit Holders for such Vehicles on such days and during such hours subject to the provisions of this Order and as specified on the map

schedules.

33. Save as provided in Article 51, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait between the Permitted Hours in a Permit Parking Place or Permit Parking Area specified in the Map schedules unless a valid permit relating to that Permit Parking Place or Area, issued in accordance with the provisions of this Order is displayed on the Vehicle in the Relevant Position or the parking permit holder has obtained a valid virtual parking permit which exempts them from displaying a parking permit .
34. Permit types available are Residents' Permits, Business Visitor Permits, Resident's Carer Permits and Visitor Day Permits.

#### Permits for permit parking places

##### Resident permits

35. (1) Any resident of the roads specified in Schedule 5, who is the Owner or keeper of a Passenger Vehicle or a Goods Vehicle under 2 tonnes in unladen weight, may apply to the Council for the issue of a virtual Residents' parking permit to allow that Vehicle to wait in the relevant Permit Parking Place or Permit Parking Area on the carriageway within the Permitted Hours. Any such application shall be made using the telephone or electronic payment system, and shall be accompanied by a remittance for such charge specified in Article 49 as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which the application is being made.
- (2) On receipt of an application for a Resident permit duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article the Council has the right to limit the allocation of permits to the maximum number of permits per address according to the road as specified in Schedule 5.

##### Residents Carer Permits

36. (1) Any resident of the roads specified in Schedule 5, who has a carer visitor, may apply to the Council for the issue of a virtual Residents Carer parking permit to allow the Vehicle of the carer to wait in the relevant Permit Parking Place or Permit Parking Area within the Permitted Hours. Any such application shall be made using the telephone or electronic payment system, and shall be accompanied by a remittance for such charge specified in Article 49 as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which the application is being made.
- (2) Applicants for Residents' Carer Permits will normally require prior evidence of a health or medical requirement for visiting.

##### Business Visitor permits

37. (1) Any business with premises in the roads specified in Schedule 5 or which operates in Fareham town centre may apply to the Council for the



issue of a virtual Business Visitor parking permit to allow the person conducting business in that area to wait in the relevant Permit Parking Place or Permit Parking Area for a period of up to one hour. Any such application shall be made using the telephone or electronic payment system, and shall be accompanied by a remittance for such charge as specified in Article 49 as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which the application is being made.

- (2) Business Visitor Permits will require evidence of conducting business or visiting in that area in accordance with Article 37(1).

#### Visitor Day Permits

38. (1) Any resident of the roads specified in Schedule 5 who is eligible for a Residents' Permit shall also be eligible for 100 virtual Visitor Day Permits for their visitors. Any such application for a virtual Visitor Day parking permit shall be made using the telephone or electronic payment system, and shall be accompanied by a remittance for such charge specified in Article 49 as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which the application is being made.
- (2) Visitor Day Permits may only be used:
  - (a) By persons visiting residents of the streets listed in Schedule 5.
  - (b) For the parking of Passenger Vehicle or a Goods Vehicle under 2 tonnes (40 cwt) in un-laden weight.
- (3) The Council may decline to issue or restrict the number of Visitor Day Permits issued.

#### Application for and issue of permits for the use of permit parking places

39. Applications for permits shall be submitted in electronic form and all permit applications in respect of a virtual parking permit are to be made using the telephone or electronic payment system and shall include the particulars and information required for such application to be supplied.
40. The Council may at any time require an applicant for a permit, or an existing Permit Holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a permit made by them as they reasonably may require to verify that the application or permit is valid. In respect of a virtual parking permit the officer of the Council can access the record of the virtual parking permit by a hand held device, on the electronic database approved by the Council.
41. On receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article and upon receipt of the appropriate charge specified in Article 49, the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant and the class of vehicle as the case may be are both as identified in Articles 35, 36, 37 and 38 for the type of permit being applied for, may issue a virtual parking permit to:

- (1) an eligible resident applying for a Resident Permit, which the Council may limit to the maximum number of permits per address according to the road as specified in Schedule 5, for the leaving of the vehicle to which such permit relates, by the owner of such vehicle, during the permitted hours in any parking place or parking area identified in Article 42;
- (2) an eligible resident applying for a Residents Carer Permit for a carer visitor, for the leaving of the carers vehicle to which such permit relates, by the owner of such vehicle, during the permitted hours in any parking place or parking area identified in Article 42;
- (3) an eligible business applying for a Business Visitor Permit for the leaving of the vehicle to which such permit relates, by the owner of such vehicle, for up to one hour in any parking place or parking area identified in Article 42;
- (4) an eligible resident who is also eligible for a Residents' Permit who is applying for Visitor Day Permits for their visitors for the leaving of the vehicle to which such permit relates, by the owner of such vehicle, during the permitted hours in any parking place or parking area identified in Article 42;

42. The parking places or parking areas in which a permit is valid as referred to in Article 41 are identified in Schedule 6 for each type of permit set out in Column 2 for the type of parking places or parking areas set out in Column 1 and subject to the conditions set out in Column 3 of that Schedule.

#### **Provisions as to Residents' Permits and Residents' Carer Permits**

##### **Surrender and Withdrawal of Permit**

43. (1) A Permit Holder may surrender a permit to the Council at any time.
- (2) The Council, may, by notice in writing served on the Permit Holder by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to the Permit Holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address believed to be that persons place of abode, withdraw a permit if it appears to the Council that one of the events set out in paragraphs (3) below, has occurred and the Permit Holder shall surrender the permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of the aforementioned notice.
- (3) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of paragraph (2) are:-
  - (a) The Permit Holder ceasing to be a resident.
  - (b) The Permit Holder ceasing to be the Owner or keeper of the Vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued.
  - (c) The Vehicle in respect of which such permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that is more than 2 tonnes (40cwt approx) un-laden weight.

- (d) The issue of a duplicate permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 44.
  - (e) The permit ceasing to be valid pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article.
- (4) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Article, a permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified thereon (which period shall be that in respect of which payment has been made) or on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraphs (3)(a) - (3)(e) of this Article.

#### Duplicate/Replacement Permits

- 44.
- (1) If the permit is mutilated or accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the Permit Holder shall either surrender it to the Council or apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate virtual parking permit and the Council, upon receipt of the permit and a remittance for such charge specified in Article 49 as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which the application is being made, shall issue a duplicate or replacement virtual parking permit on an electronic database approved by the Council, and upon such issue, the original permit shall become invalid.
  - (2) If the permit is lost or destroyed, the Permit Holder may apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate virtual parking permit and the Council, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction and upon receiving a remittance for such charge specified in Article 49 as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which the application is being made, shall issue a duplicate/replacement virtual parking permit on an electronic database approved by the Council and upon such issue, the original permit shall become invalid.
  - (3) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate/replacement permit.

#### **Provisions as to Residents' Permits, Business Visitor Permits, Residents' Carer Permits and Visitor Day Permits**

##### Form of Permits

45. A permit shall be in writing, or electronic form in respect of a virtual parking permit, and shall include the following particulars: -
- (a) The registration mark of the Vehicle in respect of which the permit has been issued, except for the Resident Carers Permit.
  - (b) The period during which the permit intends to remain valid.
  - (c) The relevant Residents Parking Area to which the permit relates.

##### Display of Permit

46. At all times during which the Vehicle is left in a Permit Parking Place or Area during the Permitted Hours there shall be a permit displayed in the Relevant Position unless the parking permit holder has obtained a virtual parking permit which exempts them from displaying a parking permit.
47. Where the permit has been displayed on a Vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 46, no person, not being the Driver, shall remove the permit from the Vehicle unless authorised to do so by the Driver of the Vehicle.

#### Removal of Vehicle in an emergency

48. A Police Officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place he thinks fit, any Vehicle left in any of the Permit Parking Places or Areas as detailed in Article 73.

#### Charges of Permits

49. The charge in connection with the issue of a permit for leaving of a Vehicle in any one of the relevant Permit Parking Places or Areas on the carriageway during the Permitted Hours shall be as specified in Schedule 4.
50. Any resident who is also the holder of a Disabled Persons Badge shall be exempt from the charge on the presentation to the Council of the Disabled Persons Badge.

#### Exemptions

51. (1) Nothing in Article 33 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait in a Permit Parking Place or Area authorised by this Part 5 of this Order during the Permitted Hours for so long as it may be necessary to enable:
- (a) The Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in or in connection with any of the following operations, namely
    - (i) Building, engineering or demolition operations;
    - (ii) The removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) The maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the area;
    - (iv) The laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the area of any sewer, or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus.
  - (b) The Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority, the Environment Agency or a water or sewerage undertaker within the meaning of the Water Act 1989 Part II, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

- (c) To enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a licensed universal postal service provider for the purpose of sorting, delivering or collecting postal packets in the course of the provision of a universal postal service as defined in Part 3 of the Postal Services Act 2011;
- (d) The Vehicle to be used by a Registered Medical Practitioner, Nurse or Home Help in the course of his/her professional duties.
- (e) The Vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.
- (f) The Vehicle is being in use in connection with the removal of furniture from one dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository.
- (g) For the conveyance of occupiers of premises adjacent to the relevant area at times of weddings or funerals.
- (h) The avoidance of an accident.
- (i) It is not unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait in a Residents Parking Area if the Vehicle displays in the Relevant Position a valid Waiver Certificate issued by the Council and the Vehicle is waiting in accordance with the terms and conditions of the said certificate.

## **PART 6**

### **GENERAL PROVISIONS AND SUSPENSIONS RELATING TO A PARKING PLACE OR AREA**

#### **Suspension of a Parking Place or Area**

- 52.
- (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place, parking area or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary.
  - (2) A Police Officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer may suspend for not longer than 24 hours the use of any of parking place, parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonable necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
  - (3) Any person suspending the use of any parking place, parking area or any part thereof pursuant to the provisions of paragraphs (1) or (2) of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to the relevant parking places, parking areas or part thereof the use of which is suspended, a traffic sign indicating that waiting by Vehicles is prohibited.

- (4) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a parking place, parking area or part of a parking place during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place, parking area or part thereof a sign placed in pursuance of Article 52(3) of this Order.

### General Provisions

53. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place or parking area:
  - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance;
  - (b) when the Council has closed that parking place or parking area.
54. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place or parking area shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place or parking area, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place or parking area.
55. No person shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place or parking area, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or parking area, or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
56. A vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge shall be exempt from any limitation on time specified for a parking place or parking area in the map schedules to this order.

### Manner of Standing

57. A vehicle left in a parking place or parking area in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be positioned so that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking place or parking area.
58. If a vehicle (or any other thing) is left in a parking place or parking area in contravention of any of the provisions of this order a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place or parking area; provided that when a vehicle is waiting in a parking place or parking area in contravention of the provision of Article 21(b) of this order, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.
59. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of the last preceding article of this order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position, as the case may be.
60. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place or parking area by virtue of Article 58 of this order, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

## **PART 7**

### **WAIVER CERTIFICATE**

61. The Council may issue a Waiver Certificate on receipt of written application with at least 5 working days' notice and may impose terms and conditions as appropriate.
62. A charge may be made for a Waiver Certificate as determined by the Council from time to time.
63. A Waiver Certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid. Notification of such cancellation shall be in writing to the holder of the Waiver Certificate at any address that the Council believes to be that person's address and the Waiver Certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council.

## **PART 8**

### **CONTRAVENTION OF ORDER**

64. Any vehicle failing to comply with the provisions of this Order shall be in contravention and a Penalty Charge shall be payable and/or the Vehicle may be removed from the location.

#### **Penalty Charge Notice**

65. In the case of Vehicles in respect of which a contravention has occurred pursuant to Article 64 it shall be the duty of the Civil Enforcement Officer to attach to the Vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars.
  - (a) the registration mark of the Vehicle or, where the Vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the Vehicle.
  - (b) the grounds on which the Civil Enforcement Officer believes that a Penalty Charge is payable in respect of that Vehicle.
  - (c) the amount of Penalty Charge required to be paid.
  - (d) that if the Penalty Charge is paid before the end of the period of 14 days beginning with the date of the notice, the amount of the Penalty Charge will be reduced by the specified proportion or amount.
  - (e) that if the Penalty Charge is not paid before the end of the 28 day period a Notice to Owner may be served by the Council on the person appearing to be the Owner of the Vehicle.
  - (f) the address to which payment of the Penalty Charge must be sent.
  - (g) the name of the enforcement authority.
  - (h) the date on which the notice is served; and
  - (i) the manner in which the Penalty Charge must be paid.

### Manner of Payment of Penalty Charge and Reduced Penalty Charge

66. The Owner of a Vehicle in respect of which the Penalty Charge has been incurred shall pay the Penalty Charge to the Council by cheque or postal order which shall be delivered or sent by post so as to reach the Council's Offices within 28 days of the issue of the Penalty Charge OR in cash in person at the Council's Offices not later than as aforesaid OR by credit card or debit card OR electronically through the Council's website.
67. If the Penalty Charge is paid before the end of the period of 14 days beginning with the date of the Penalty Charge Notice, or 21 days in the case of a Penalty Charge Notice served by post, the amount of the Penalty Charge will be reduced by 50%. If the 14th or the 21st day (whichever the case may be) falls upon a day on which the Council's offices are closed the period will be extended until 1600 hours on the next day on which the Council's offices are open.
68. Payment shall be received not later than 1600 hours on the 28th day following the day on which such Penalty Charge was incurred PROVIDED THAT if the said 28th day falls upon a day on which the Council's offices are closed the period within which payment of the said Penalty Charge shall be made to the Council shall be extended until 1600 hours on the next day on which the Council's offices are open.
69. If the Owner fails to pay the Penalty Charge by the end of the 28 day period, a Notice to Owner may be served; and if the charge is not paid within a further 28 days it may be increased by 50% on the issue of a Charge Certificate in accordance with the provisions of Part 6 of The Traffic Management Act 2004.
70. Continuing failure to pay the Penalty Charge may result in a debt being registered in the County Court against the Owner to enable the Council to recover the charges due.

### Indications as Evidence

71. The particulars given in the Penalty Charge Notice attached to a Vehicle in accordance with Article 65 shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay such Penalty Charge.

### Restriction on Removal of Notices

72. Where a Penalty Charge Notice has been attached to a Vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 64, no person, not being the Driver of the Vehicle, a Police Officer in uniform, a Civil Enforcement Officer or some other person duly authorised by the Council, shall remove the notice from the Vehicle unless authorised to do so by the Owner of the Vehicle.

### Removal on Vehicle

73. Where a Civil Enforcement Officer has removed or caused to be removed a Vehicle in accordance with Articles 48 or 64:-
  - (a) he shall provide for the safe custody of the Vehicle;



- (b) the Council shall be entitled to recover from the person responsible such charges in respect of removal, storage and disposal of the Vehicle as it might prescribe from time to time;
- (c) the provisions of the Act as amended shall apply to the disposal of any such Vehicle removed by or on behalf of the Council pursuant to this Article.

Nothing in this Article shall apply in respect of a Vehicle displaying in the Relevant Position a valid Disabled Person's Badge issued by any local authority.

**Derogation and Precedence over other Orders**

74. (1) The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any Regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
- (2) Where the provisions of any order made or having effect as if made under the Act which imposes any prohibition or restriction on waiting by Vehicles or grant any exemption from such prohibition or restriction relate to a length of road designated as a Parking Place in this Order the provisions of this Order shall prevail.

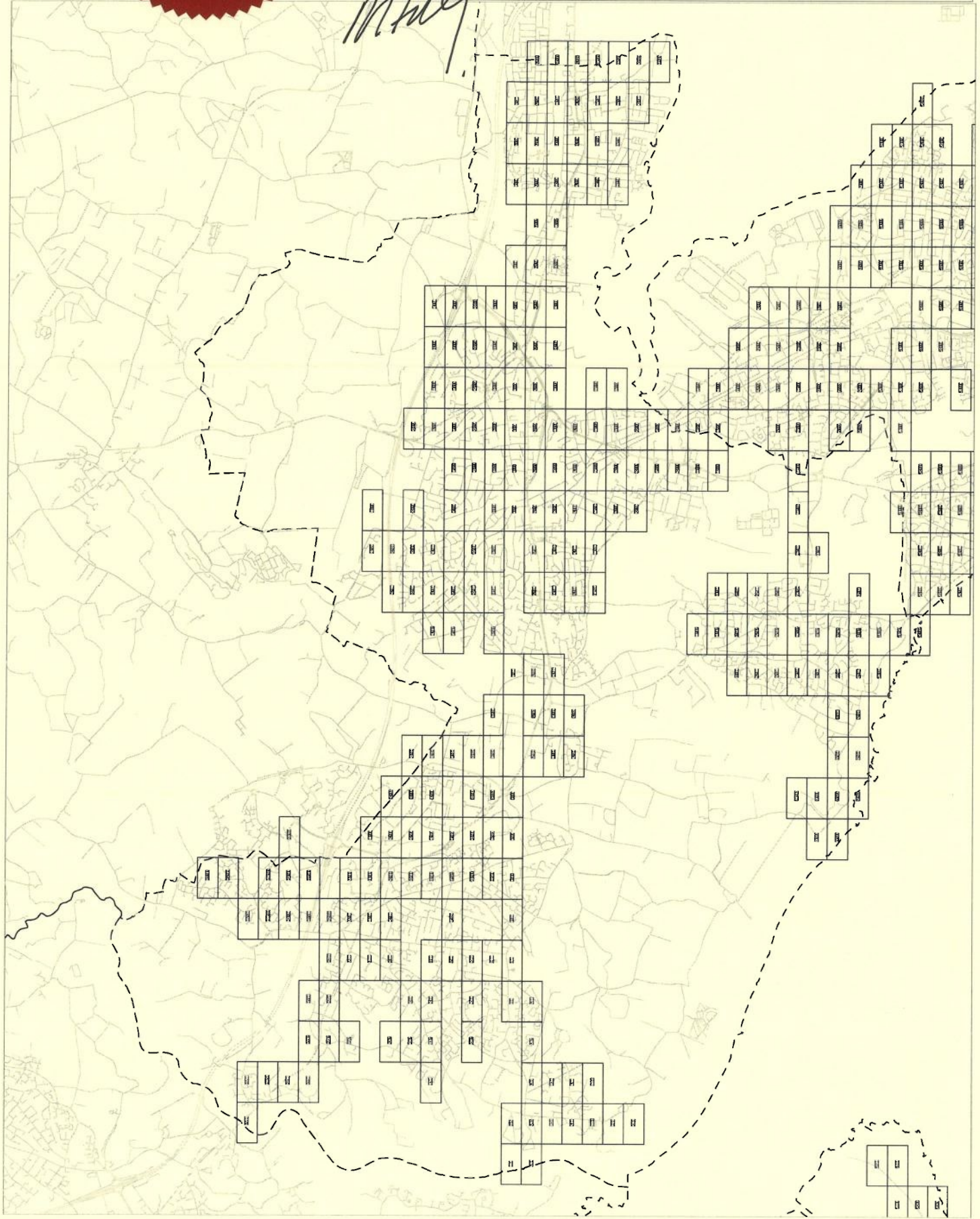

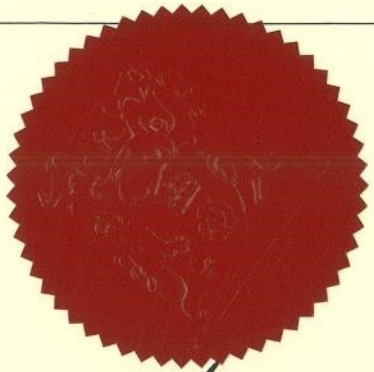
