

**HART DISTRICT COUNCIL
(OFF STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2018**

The Council of the District of Hart (hereinafter called "the Council") in exercise of its powers conferred upon them by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") as amended by the Road Traffic (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (County of Hampshire) (District of Hart) Order 2002 and also in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by The Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the 2004 Act") and all other enabling powers, with the consent of Hampshire County Council in accordance with Section 39 (3) of the 1984 Act, and after consulting the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with paragraph 20 of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order.

PART I – COMMENCEMENT AND CITATION

1. This Order shall come into force on 5 November 2018 and shall be cited as "The Hart District Council (Off Street Parking Places) Order 2018.
2. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before coming into operation of this Order, the "Hart (Off Street Parking Places) Order 2015" is hereby revoked
3. Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article is a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order, and any reference in this Order to a numbered Schedule is a reference to the corresponding Schedule to this Order.
4. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:

"authorised vehicle or vehicles" means a vehicle or vehicles authorised by the Council

"bank holidays" includes all days designated as bank or public holidays in England under the Bank and Financial Dealing Act 1971 together with such other bank or public holidays in England as shall from time to time be proclaimed by Royal Proclamation

"motor car", "car" or "motor vehicle" shall have the same meaning as assigned to it by section 136 of the 1984 Act

"caravan" means any structure designed or adapted for human habitation which is capable of being moved from one place to another

"charge", "charges" and "parking charges" means the charges which may be varied from time to time by the Council under and in accordance with Section 35C of the 1984 Act

"charging hours" in relation to any parking place means any period during which charges apply as specified in Schedule 3 during which a

motor vehicle shall not be left in a parking place unless the correct parking charge is paid or a Season Ticket or Council Permit is displayed in the relevant position

"charge Order" means the current Order made by the Secretary of State in exercise of the power conferred by paragraph 8 of Schedule 9 to the 2004 Act

"check-in and check-out" means a method of payment that requires the owner to register a motor vehicle at a parking ticket dispensing machine, in advance of payment, and payment by electronic means using a credit or debit card at the ticket dispensing machine for the period of stay on return to the motor vehicle.

"civil enforcement officer" means a person (being a person appointed under Section 76 of the Act 2004 and/or under Section 63A of the 1984 Act) authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place and act as indicated by the use of expression in any of the Articles in this Order

"coach" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for the conveyance of eight or more passengers

"council permit holder vehicle" means a permitted vehicle lawfully displaying a valid permit issued in accordance with Part V of this order

"council pool vehicle" means a motor vehicle provided by the Councils ("Councils" means Hart District Council or Hampshire County Council) for the sole use of persons in the execution of their duties on Councils business

"credit card" and **"debit card"** have the same meanings as given by Section 35A(6) of the 1984 Act, and shall be a credit card or a debit card which is shown on the ticket machine as being approved for the purposes of payment for parking charges

"disabled person's vehicle" means a motor vehicle upon which there is displayed a disabled person's badge;

"disabled person's badge" shall have the meaning assigned to it by section 2(1) of the Disable Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000

"driver" shall have the meaning assigned to it by section 142(1) of the 1984 Act

"owner" has the same meaning as Section 92 of the 2004 Act;

"parking bay" means any area within a parking place, which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle and indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place or otherwise indicated by signs or any other structure;

"parking charge" means the parking charges stipulated in Schedule 1 to be paid for the parking of motor vehicles left in a parking place

"parking contravention" shall have the meaning assigned to it in section 93 of the 2004 Act;

"parking place" means any of the places (or parts of parking places) provided by the Council under Section 32 (1) of the 1984 Act for use as a parking place as referred to by name in Schedule 3;

"parking ticket", "ticket" or "pay and display ticket" means a ticket purchased from and issued by a parking ticket dispensing machine indicating the payment of a charge that has been paid for parking in the parking place named up on it, the time at the beginning of the period for which payment was made and/or the time when it expires;

"parking permit" or "season ticket" or "council permit" means a permit or other approval in writing issued by the Council to park in a parking place or designated area for the period of time

"PCN" means a penalty charge notice and shall have the meaning assigned to it in section 92 of the 2004 Act;

"permit holder vehicle" means a permitted vehicle lawfully displaying a valid permit issued in accordance with Part VI of this order

"permitted position" means parked wholly within a parking bay or in any unmarked position in accordance with instructions given by any Civil Enforcement Officer

"permitted vehicles" means:

- (a) Motor cars within the provisions of Section 136(2)(a) of the 1984 Act; or
- (b) Motor cycles as defined in Section 136(4) of the 1984 Act; or
- (c) Motor vehicles constructed or adapted for the conveyance of goods or burden, the unladen weight of which does not exceed 3.5 tonnes.

"plug in electric vehicles" means an electric vehicle using one or more electric motors for propulsion which may also contain combustion engine either for exclusive use of supplying energy to recharge the power source and/or supplying motive power.

"plug-in hybrid electric vehicles" means a hybrid vehicle which utilizes rechargeable batteries, or another energy storage device that can be restored to full charge by connecting a plug to an external electric power source.

"registered driver" means the driver of a vehicle who has, prior to leaving his or her vehicle in a parking place, registered so many of his or her personal details with a service provider as that service provider

may require to enable the Telephone Payment Parking System to be activated in favour of the said driver

"relevant position" means displaying a badge or permit upon a motor vehicle of a parking ticket or pass as follows:

- (a) In the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, exhibited on the dashboard in such a way that the details of date of issue, issuing authority, and serial number may be read easily by civil enforcement officers;
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle.
- (c) In connection with the display upon a motor vehicle of a disabled persons badge or parking disc means the position defined in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

"service provider" means the company authorised and appointed by the Council to operate, administer and maintain the payment of parking charges using the telephone payment parking system;

"telephone payment" means a payment made using the telephone payment parking system

"telephone payment parking system" means a system to facilitate and monitor the payment of parking charges using telephone communication with the service provider in accordance with instructions indicated on signs located at each parking place where the system is in operation

"ticket machine" or **"ticket dispensing machine"** means apparatus or device of a type and design approved either specifically or generally in accordance with section 35 of the 1984 Act

5. The Council reserves the right:
 - a. to suspend the effect of all or part of this Order by means of appropriate signing;
 - b. to close a parking place, or any part of it, for any period and for any reason, and no driver of any vehicle shall use the parking place, or any part of it, when it is so closed;
 - c. to vary temporarily or permanently the classes of vehicles that may use a parking place.
6. Any reference in this Order to an enactment includes reference to that enactment as amended or replaced from time to time and to any subordinate legislation or byelaw made under that enactment

PART II – PROVISION OF OFF STREET PARKING PLACES

7. The Council in pursuance of the power conferred upon it by section 32 of the 1984 Act hereby provides the parking places detailed herein.

PART III – USE OF PARKING PLACES

8. Each area of land specified by name in Schedule 3 may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such classes of vehicles, in such positions, on such days, during such hours and subject to such waiting restrictions as are specified in relation to that area of land specified by name in Schedule 3.
9. Pedestrian access within a parking place is available only to persons driving or being conveyed in motor vehicles and entering the parking place solely for the purpose of or in connection with the parking of a motor vehicle and does not extend to pedestrians other than drivers of motor vehicles and their passengers leaving or returning to their motor vehicles and no right of way whatsoever over the parking place other than for the purpose of parking or removing motor vehicles shall be deemed to have been granted by the Council.
10. Where in Schedule 1 a parking place (or part thereof) is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place unless it is of the class and in the position specified.
11. Insofar as a vehicle is left in a parking place (or part thereof) during the charging hours, the driver thereof shall pay such charge or charges as are specified in the following provisions of this Order.
12. The driver of a plug in electric vehicle or plug-in hybrid electric vehicle shall not permit it to wait in an electric vehicle bay unless it is being charged throughout the period within which it is parked in the Electric Vehicle Parking Place.
13. The Council may upon the suspension of a parking place or any part thereof under the provisions of either Article 27 or Article 31 authorise the use of any parking place or part thereof for any purpose.
14. On days and at the times other than those stipulated in Schedule 3 when a parking place is not available for the parking of motor vehicles or is suspended no person shall park or leave or permit a motor vehicle to remain in any parking place.
15. Where on days and at the times other than those stipulated in Schedule 3 when under licence a parking place is not available for the parking of motor vehicles or is suspended no person shall park or leave or permit a motor vehicle to remain in any parking place, Part IV and VIII shall apply.
16. The Council shall not be obliged to compensate any person for any loss or inconvenience or for any other reason caused by a parking

place not being available for the parking of motor vehicles under licence or suspended or otherwise unavailable.

17. The driver of a motor vehicle shall not leave a vehicle in a parking place during charging hours for a period longer than the maximum waiting period permitted for that parking place or longer than the time or period paid for or stated on any parking permit.
18. The driver of a vehicle shall remove or cause to be removed that vehicle from the parking place, on or before the expiry of the period paid for or stated on any parking ticket or parking permit.
19. In respect of the parking places specified in the Schedules to this Order and except with the permission of the Council, every part of a trailer must be parked within the limits of one parking space, such that a vehicle with a trailer must occupy no more than two parking spaces.
20. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be left:
 - a. In those parking bays in any parking place that, by ground markings and/or notices, are reserved exclusively for disabled persons' motor vehicles unless there is displayed upon the vehicle a valid disabled persons badge and disc; or
 - b. In those parking bays in any parking place that, by ground markings and/or notices, are marked "TAXI ONLY" are reserved for the sole use of Hackney Carriage vehicles licensed as Hackney Carriage vehicles by Hart District Council Licensing Committee. The driver shall pay a parking charge if such licensed hackney carriage is left in any parking bay that is not a taxi parking bay; or
 - c. In those parking bays in any parking place that, by ground markings and/or notices, are marked " POLICE VEHICLES ONLY" are reserved for the sole use of Hampshire Constabulary vehicles
 - d. In any parking bay in any parking place that by ground markings and/or signs or notices is reserved for the charging of plug-in electric or hybrid electric vehicles unless the vehicle is in the process of receiving an electrical charge from the adjacent electricity charging point. The driver shall pay a parking charge if such electric or hybrid electric vehicle is left in any parking bay that has not got an adjacent electricity charging point and/or is not receiving an electrical charge; or
 - e. in parking bays with red road markings at Monachus Lane parking place, Hartley Wintney, no longer than advertised by signs adjacent to the parking bays

CHURCH ROAD CAR PARK, FLEET

21. Delivery goods vehicles for the businesses of 122 to 130 Fleet Road shall not stop at any point along the access road in Church Road car

park between Church Road and the service yard, or at any other location in Church Road car park, and shall be deemed to be parked as causing an obstruction and parked not in accordance with the terms and conditions of use for the parking place.

22. The driver of a delivery good vehicle shall not permit the loading or unloading of any delivery good vehicle at any point along the access road in Church Road car park between Church Road and the service yard, or at any other location in Church Road car park.

CHURCH ROAD CAR PARK SERVICE YARD, FLEET

23. The Church Road car park service yard is for the sole use of the occupiers of addresses 118 to 130 Fleet Road.
24. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be left in Church Road car park service yard behind properties with the addresses 126 to 130 Fleet Road, unless:
- a. The vehicle is being used by employees and or contractors of that displaying a parking permit in the relevant position; and
 - b. The vehicle is parked in a parking bay that matches the colour of the permit such that:
 - i. GREEN permits shall be for the sole use of Marks & Spencer in parking bays with green road markings; and
 - ii. BLUE permits shall be for the sole use of Halifax parking bays with blue road markings;

Or

- c. The vehicle is parked in a parking bay with blue road markings on a day between a Saturday from 14.00 hours until a Sunday at 21.00 hours displaying a GREEN permit; or
 - d. The vehicle is parked in the Marks & Spencer customer collection point for the sole purpose of collecting previously ordered goods from Marks & Spencer and for a period no longer than 15 minutes between and only between the dates of 1 January and 30 November in every year; or
 - e. The vehicle is a delivery goods vehicle or a vehicle that is being used in the operation of the businesses of 126 to 130 Fleet Road
25. Marks & Spencer green parking bays shall be reserved for the exclusive use of Marks & Spencer, including the marked customer collection point, and the bays immediately adjoining property 126/128 Fleet Road, Fleet, and between the dates of 1 and 31 December shall be used without a customer collection point and for the parking of permitted vehicles only or for other operational reason determined from time to time by Marks & Spencer

26. Halifax parking bays shall be reserved for the exclusive use of Halifax, with the exception that between Saturdays from 14.00 hours until Sunday 21.00 hours when it is permissible for Marks & Spencer to use the said BLUE bays for staff parking only and by vehicles displaying BLUE permits, in addition to Halifax staff parking

PART IV – SUSPENSION OF A PARKING PLACE

27. The Council may upon application by any person for any reason suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof provide the Council considers such reason necessary and such suspension may be subject to conditions including provisions in respect of the payment of lost revenue.
28. Lost revenue shall be the average daily income for that parking place multiplied by the number of days the parking place is suspended.
29. Any suspension of the use of a parking place by the Council under the provisions of Article 27 shall be effected by the service by the Council upon the applicant of a notice of suspension and the applicant has received such notice.
30. Following receipt of a notice of suspension of a parking place the applicant shall comply with any conditions imposed by the Council in respect thereof and unless such obligation is reserved by the Council the applicant shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that suspended part thereof a notice or traffic sign indicating that the use of that parking place or that part thereof is suspended and shall maintain in place such notice or traffic sign throughout the period of suspension specified within the notice if suspension and shall remove the same immediately upon expiry of the said period.
31. The Council may at its own discretion suspend the use of a parking place or any part of a parking place and thereafter may designate that part of such a parking place to be reserved for any purpose it may decide.
32. Unless authorised under the provisions of Article 13 no person shall cause or permit a motor vehicle to be left in a parking place or any part thereof during such periods that the use of that parking place or that part thereof is suspended or during such period as there is in or adjacent thereto a notice or traffic sign placed in pursuance to Article 30.

PART V – PAYMENT FOR PARKING

33. Unless either the driver or the vehicle is exempt from the requirement to pay a parking charge or the driver has displayed either a parking permit or season ticket valid for the motor vehicle and the parking place, and depending on the nature of the parking device provided by the Council in each parking place for the payment of the parking charge, the driver shall immediately upon parking a motor vehicle in a

parking place, either pay the parking charge (pay and display), or register the motor vehicle for the later payment of the parking charge (check-in check-out).

34. The parking charge for a vehicle left in a parking place during the charging hours shall be as specified in Schedule 1 of this Order or as subsequently specified from time to time in public notices made by the Council pursuant to the 1984 Act.
35. The payment of the parking charge referred to in Article 34 shall, subject to Article 14 and 15, be payable by:
 - a. the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins, credit or debit card into the apparatus or device provided, being an apparatus or device approved in accordance with Section 35 of the 1984 Act, and the provisions of Section 47 of the 1984 Act shall apply in respect of such apparatus;
 - b. means of a telephone payment by a registered driver, in those parking places where a notice or notices are displayed stating that such a facility is available;
 - c. means of registration using the check-in and check-out system by a register driver, in those parking places where a notice or notices are displayed stating that such a facility is available and instructions for use are provided; and
 - d. in each case in accordance with the conditions and instructions displayed in the parking place.
36. Where any parking apparatus is defective, it shall be the responsibility of the driver of a vehicle to obtain a ticket from an alternative parking apparatus, or by any method referred to in Article 35.
37. Any ticket issued on payment of the charge referred to in Article 35.a. or 35.c. or any season ticket issued in accordance with Article 45 may be used only in the parking place or places for which it has been issued, and any telephone payment referred to in Article 35.b. will relate only to the parking place or places for which the telephone payment was made and using the unique reference number for that parking place that is displayed adjacent to each ticket machine.
38. The Owner of a vehicle may on application to the Council purchase at a charge laid down by the Council a season ticket for use in the parking place specified on the season ticket and for the periods set out in Schedule 2 for that parking place, provided that such a season ticket shall not be valid for any part of the parking place shown by the signs and markings as being for "short-stay" parking.
39. Any parking ticket issued on payment of the charge referred to in Article 35 or any season ticket issued in accordance with Article 45 shall be displayed in a relevant position.

40. A parking ticket must be displayed on the vehicle for which the parking ticket was purchased
41. A parking ticket for a trailer or caravan must be displayed in the relevant position upon the motor vehicle by which it is drawn in addition to the parking ticket for that vehicle.

PART VI – EXEMPTIONS FROM PARKING CHARGE

42. The following motor vehicles shall be exempt in the circumstances described below from the obligation to pay a parking charge for parking a vehicle during the charging hours specified in Schedule 3 of this Order:
 - a. A disabled persons motor vehicle that lawfully displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge; or
 - b. which is being used for a purpose for which specified parking bays are reserved and the vehicle is parked in a parking bay specified as being reserved for that purpose; or
 - c. A solo motorcycle left in a solo motorcycle parking bay; or
 - d. which is in the process of receiving an electrical charge from the adjacent electricity charging point; or
 - e. Council liveried vehicle whilst left on official Council business.
43. A vehicle of which the driver has been issued a Season Ticket or Council Permit shall be exempt (as applied to the parking place or places for which the said permit is valid) from:
 - a. any limitation on the waiting time specified in Schedule 3 to this Order, other than for areas specifically marked for short stay parking.

44. Nothing in this Order shall restrict the powers of the Council to close to the public the whole, or any part, of a parking place whether temporarily or permanently or restrict the power of the Council to vary temporarily or permanently the classes of vehicles that may use specified parking places.

SEASON TICKETS

45. If the owner of a motor vehicle wishes to purchase a season ticket or permit, such owner shall apply to the Council and if the Council agrees to issue a season ticket or permit, the applicant shall pay to the council the charge specified in Schedule 2 for the appropriate parking place and the said owner shall abide by the terms stipulated by the Council for the use of such a season ticket or permit
46. The season ticket or permit may only be used in the parking place in respect of which it is issued.

47. A season ticket or permit shall be displayed in the relevant position on the motor vehicle
48. The Council may require an applicant for a permit or permit holder to produce such evidence in respect of the application as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars of information given to them
49. A season ticket or parking permit shall not be used for motor vehicles that have been let for hire or reward.
50. A permit holder may surrender a permit to the Council at any time and shall surrender a permit to the Council on the occurrence of any of the events set out in Article 52; a permit holder who surrenders a permit:
 - a. before the permit becomes valid shall be entitled to a refund of the fee paid in respect thereof;
 - b. after the permit has become valid shall be entitled to a refund of any outstanding whole months at the rate of:
 - i. for quarterly permits, one third of the relevant quarterly fee from the date of receipt of surrender of the permit; or
 - ii. for annual permits, one twelfth of the relevant annual fee from the date of receipt of surrender of the permit;

But

- c. no refund is payable if the permit is surrendered because of any of the events specified in Article 52 (d), (e), (f) or (g).
51. The Council may by notice in writing served on the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address which the Council believes to be that person's residence, withdraw a permit if it appears to the Council that any of the events set out in Article 52 has occurred, and the permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of the said notice and then after that period Article 53 shall apply
52. The events referred to in Article 50 and 51 of this Schedule are:
 - a. the permit holder ceases to be the owner of a motor vehicle of the class in respect of which a permit was issued;
 - b. the vehicle in respect of which such permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of a class specified in the application for the permit or season ticket;
 - c. the issue of a duplicate permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 55 of this Order;
 - d. the expiry of the period for which the permit was issued;

- e. a breach of any condition which may from time to time be determined by the Council and is specified on the permit and/or form referred to the application form
 - f. repeated failure by the permit holder to display the permit
 - g. the permit is mutilated or defaced or the figures or particulars on it have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, and the permit holder continues to display the permit
53. A permit shall cease to be valid on the occurrence of any of the events set out in Article 52.
54. A PCN may be issued on the occurrences of any of the events in Article 52, and/or Article 55 if a duplicate has been applied for by the owner of a motor vehicle and the original permit continues to be displayed.
55. If a permit is mutilated or defaced or the figures or particulars on it have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the permit holder shall surrender it to the Council and may then apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate permit.
56. If a permit is lost or destroyed, the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate permit.
57. The provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate permit and an application for such a permit as if it were a permit or an application for a permit
58. Any permit issued by virtue of the provisions of Articles 55 or 56 of this Order shall be marked as a duplicate, and upon the issue of a duplicate permit the permit which it duplicates shall become invalid.
59. A permit shall be in writing and include the following:
- a. the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the permit has been issued;
 - b. the parking area or areas in respect of which the permit is valid;
 - c. the period during which, the permit shall remain valid; and
 - d. an authentication that the permit has been issued by, or on behalf of, the Council

COUNCIL PERMITS

60. The Council may issue a council permit only to either employees or Councillors of the Council, and temporary permits for visitors or contractors.

PART VII – PARKING OFFENCES

61. Any person responsible for a breach of any provision within this Order shall be guilty of an offence under the provision of Section 35A (1) of the 1984 Act (Offences and proceedings in connection with parking places provided under section 32 and 33) and Section 73 of the 2004 Act (Contraventions subject to civil enforcement) shall apply to this order.
62. The Council may treat the indications given by any apparatus of parking device provide by the Council for payment of the parking charge as means to indicate the time at which a vehicle arrived at, and at the time at which it ought to leave a parking place or, one or other of those times.
63. The provisions of The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007, including those based on Version 6.5 or the most recent version of the Standard PCN Codes, apply to penalty charges for parking contraventions in respect of this Order.
64. The Council has elected for the purposes of The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (Guidelines on Levels of Charges) (England) Order 2007 to set the levels of penalty charges for parking offences as defined in the said Order.

PAYMENT OF PENALTY CHARGE AT PARKING PLACES

65. Penalty charges shall be paid in accordance with the instructions printed on the back of the PCN:

PART VIII – REMOVAL OF VEHICLES

66. On occasion when a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions of the Order a civil enforcement officer or other person authorised by the Council may remove or arrange for the vehicle to be removed from a parking place and for the safe custody of that vehicle.
67. Any person removing a vehicle by virtue of this Article may do so by lifting or towing or driving the vehicle or in such a manner as it may be considered necessary and take measures in relation to the vehicle as may be considered necessary to enable removal of the vehicle as the case may be.
68. When a vehicle has been removed from a parking place under the provisions of the Order, the costs of removal and its safe custody shall be the liability of the driver and if the driver cannot be identified or traced then the person appearing to the Council to be the owner of the vehicle shall be liable for such a charge.
69. The vehicle removal and any storage charges as provided by Article 68 shall be paid to the removal company in respect of removal of a vehicle from a parking place to the point of its safe custody.

70. If it appears to the Council that any vehicle within any parking place has been abandoned, the Council may remove it or arrange to have it removed; or, if the Council exercise its statutory powers of removal of a vehicle found abandoned within any parking place and the vehicle is subsequently disposed of by the Council then in addition to the vehicle removal charge and the vehicle storage charge the owner shall pay to the removal company the vehicle disposal charge as provide by Article 63.
71. During such times a parking place is licenced for a use other than a parking place to a third party, then vehicles may be removed from that place under licence by the third party or its agents, and the removal and storage costs will be those as shown on relevant notices placed on the land for each licence.
