

# THE BOROUGH OF HAVANT (HAVANT; VARIOUS ROADS) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2007

The Council of the Borough of Havant ("the Council") pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Hampshire in exercise of the powers conferred on that County Council under Sections 1 (1) 2 (1) and (2) and 4 (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

- This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of September 2007 and may be cited as "The Borough of Havant (Havant: Various Roads) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2007."
- 2. (1) In this Order -

"authorised hackney carriage stand" means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with Diagram 1028.2 in Schedule 6 to The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act;

"delivering" and "collecting" in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982 as amended;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986 as amended;

"hackney carriage" has the same meaning as in Section 38(1) of the Vehicles Excise and Registration Act 1994;

"Parking Attendant" means a person authorised by the Council to enforce the restrictions imposed by this Order;

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge or a parking disc in the relevant position when and only when they are displayed in accordance with Regulation 2A of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales)

Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a (3) numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order. Save as provided in Article 6 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads specified in the First Schedule to this Order. Save as provided in Article 6 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays inclusive in the length of road specified in the Second Schedule to this Order. Save as provided in Article 6 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 3.30 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays inclusive (excluding Public and Bank Holidays) in the lengths of roads specified in the Third Schedule to this Order. Nothing in Articles 3, 4 and 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or (1) permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -

a person to board or alight from the vehicle;

the said lengths of roads; or

following operations namely -

statutory powers or duties;

the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose

the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of

the laying erection alteration or repair in or in land

adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the provision of gas

in any other road to be used in connection with any of the

building industrial or demolition operations;

the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

water electricity or telecommunications;

to enable a vehicle of (and bearing a livery used by) a

Postal Services Act 2000 to be used for the purpose of

the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose

in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority the Environment Agency or a water or sewerage undertaker within the meaning of the Water Act 1989 in pursuance of

- delivering or collecting postal packets in the course of the provision of a universal postal service as defined in the Act;
- the vehicle to take in petrol oil water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads;
- (f) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
- (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes.
- (2) Nothing in Articles 3, 4 and 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle in the lengths of roads specified in the Stated Schedules to this Order at any time on any day.
- (3) Nothing in Articles 3, 4 and 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle -
  - (a) to wait upon an authorised parking place or
  - (b) being a hackney carriage to wait upon an authorised hackney carriage stand.
- (4) Nothing in Articles 3, 4 and 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the lengths of roads referred to in the Stated Schedules to this Order for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day).
- 7. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by under any other enactment.

### FIRST SCHEDULE (Waiting prohibited at all times)

#### Lengths of roads in Havant

Barncroft Way

a) east side:-

from a point 58 metres north of its junction with New Road, to a point 76 metres north-west from its junction with Stockheath Lane (north-east section), measured from the centreline.

- b) west side:-
  - from a point 32 metres north of its junction with Trosnant Road, measured from the centreline, to a point 115 metres north-west from its junction with Stockheath Lane (south-west section), measured from the centreline.
  - ii) from a point 34 metres south of the centreline of its junction with Trosnant Road, southwards for a distance of 43 metres.

Georgia Close

a) both sides:-

from its junction with Barncroft Way, south-westwards for a distance of 11 metres.

Nicholson Way

a) both sides:-

from its junction with Barncroft Way, eastwards for a distance of 14 metres.

Stockheath Lane (south-west section)

a) north-west side:-

from its junction with Barncroft Way, south-westwards, for a distance of 90 metres.

b) south-east side:-

from its junction with Barncroft Way, south-westwards, for a distance of 18 metres.

Stockheath Lane (north-east section)

a) north-west side

from its junction with Barncroft Way, north-eastwards for a distance of 60 metres.

b) south-east side:

from its junction with Barncroft Way, north-eastwards for a distance of 43 metres.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE (Waiting prohibited between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive)

#### Length of road in Havant

Stockheath Lane (north-east section) a) south-east side:-

from a point 43 metres north-east of its junction with Barncroft Way, north-eastwards for a distance of 31 metres.

## THIRD SCHEDULE (Waiting prohibited between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 3.30 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive (Except Public and Bank Holidays))

#### Length of roads in Havant

Brookfield Close

a) west and south sides:-

from its junction with Trosnant Road, southwards and eastwards for a distance of 81 metres

- b) east side:-
  - i) from its junction with Trosnant Road, southwards for a distance of 14 metres
  - ii) from a point 29 metres south of its junction with Trosnant Road, southwards and eastwards for a distance of 12 metres

Trosnant Road

a) north side:-

from a point 23 metres west of its junction with Barncroft Way, westwards for a distance of 33 metres.

b) west and north sides:-

from a point 77 metres west of its junction with Barncroft Way, southwards and westwards to its junction with Stockheath Lane.

c) south side:-

from a point 22 metres west of its junction with Barncroft Way, westwards for a distance of 38 metres.

d) east and south sides:-


from a point 90 metres west and south of its junction with Barncroft Way, southwards and westwards to its junction with Stockheath Lane.
