

THE BOROUGH OF HAVANT
(HAYLING ISLAND: HAVANT ROAD AND HAVANT ROAD SERVICE ROAD)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) AND (ONE WAY TRAFFIC) ORDER 2011

The Council of the Borough of Havant ("the Council") pursuant to arrangements made under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 with the County Council of Hampshire in exercise of the powers conferred on that County Council under Sections 1 (1) 2 (1) and (2) and 4 (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of July 2011 and may be cited as "The Borough of Havant (Hayling Island: Havant Road and Havant Road Service Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) and (One Way Traffic) Order 2011.
2. (1) In this Order -
 - "authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act;
 - "delivering" and "collecting" in relation to any goods includes clicking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;
 - "disabled person's badge" or "blue badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 682;
 - "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000;
 - "Council" means the Council of the Borough of Havant;
- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge or a parking disc in the relevant position when and only when they are displayed in accordance with Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;
- (3) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
3. Save as provided in Article 4 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads specified in the First Schedule to this Order.
4. (1) Subject to the provisions in Article 5 nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other roads to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely -
 - (i) building industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads; or
 - (iv) the laying erection alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of

any main pipe or cable or other apparatus for the provision of gas water electricity or telecommunications by a utility organization attending their apparatus in pursuance of their statutory powers or duties; or

- (v) in pursuance of a local authority's highways management, works, maintenance, waste collection or street cleansing.
- (c) the vehicle if it is a Universal Service Provider as defined in Section 4(3) of the Postal Services Act 2000 used for the delivering or collecting of postal packets;
- (d) the vehicle to take in petrol oil water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads;
- (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
- (f) the vehicle if it is being used by the emergency services in pursuance of their statutory powers or duties; or
- (g) the vehicle if it is required by law to stop or obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident or prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond its control.
- (h) the vehicle to wait for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle.

(2) Nothing in Articles 3 and 4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which validly displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge in the circumstances prescribed in Regulations 7, 8 or 9 and subject to the limitation set out in Regulation 6(2) of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 683 to wait in the lengths of road referred to therein.

5. Those vehicles described in Article 4 (1) (a) to (h) are subject to the provision that:-
 - (a) there is no reasonable alternative place to stop or wait; and
 - (b) they only stop and wait for so long as is necessary.
6. Save as provided in Article 7, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed along the length of road specified in the Second Schedule to this Order in a direction other than that specified in column 2 of the said Schedule.
7. Nothing in Article 6 shall apply:
 - (a) to any vehicle being driven upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.
 - (b) to any vehicle being used for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes in an emergency.
6. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

FIRST SCHEDULE
(Prohibition Of Waiting At All Times)

Lengths of roads in Hayling Island

Havant Road (A3023)

South East side:-

- from its junction with the Havant Road Service Road, measured from the centreline, north-eastwards for a distance of 25 metres and;
- from a point 68 metres north-east from its junction with Havant Road Service Road, measured from the centreline, north-eastwards for a distance of 20 metres.

Havant Road Service Road

North side:-

- from its junction with Havant Road (A3023), in an eastwards direction for a distance of 47 metres.

SECOND SCHEDULE
(One Way Traffic)

Length of road in Hayling Island

Direction of Traffic

Havant Road Service Road


at its northern end, from a point approximately 103 metres east then north of its junction with Kings Road, measured from the centreline, a distance of approximately 13 metres to its junction with the southbound carriageway of the Havant Road (A3023).

North-westwards thence south-westwards to join the southbound carriageway of the Havant Road (A3023)
