

**THE BOROUGH OF HAVANT**  
**(HAVANT: CONNAUGHT ROAD, GROVE ROAD, JUNIPER SQUARE, MONTGOMERY ROAD, OAKLANDS ROAD, ORCHARD ROAD AND SOUTH STREET) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2012**

The Council of the Borough of Havant hereby gives notice that pursuant to arrangements made under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 with the Council of the County of Hampshire in exercise of the powers conferred on that County Council under Sections 1 (1) 2 (1) and (2) and 4 (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of January 2013 and may be cited as " The Borough of Havant (Havant: Connaught Road, Grove Road, Juniper Square, Montgomery Road, Oaklands Road, Orchard Road and South Street) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2012.
2. The parts of Order specified in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.
3. (1) In this Order –
  - "ambulance"** has the same meaning as in the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994;
  - "authorised parking place"** means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act;
  - "Civil Enforcement Officer"** means a person (being a person appointed under Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and/or under Section 63A of the 1984 Act) authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place and act as indicated by the use of the expression in any of the Articles in this Order;
  - "Council"** means the Council of the Borough of Havant;
  - "delivering"** and **"collecting"** in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;
  - "disabled person's badge"** or **"blue badge"** has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 682;
  - "disabled person's vehicle"** has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000;
  - "loading"** means the loading or unloading of goods to or from a vehicle;
- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge or a parking disc in the relevant position when and only when they are displayed in accordance with Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;
- (3) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
4. Save as provided in Article 8 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.
5. Save as provided in Article 8 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or

permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00a.m. and 6.00p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive, in the lengths of roads specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.

6. No person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.
7. Nothing in Article 6 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the length of road specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order for so long as may be necessary to enable a vehicle to be used by the emergency services in pursuance of their statutory powers or duties.
8. (1) Subject to the provisions in Article 9 nothing in Articles 4 and 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -
  - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other roads to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely -
    - (i) building industrial or demolition operations;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads; or
    - (iv) the laying erection alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main pipe or cable or other apparatus for the provision of gas water electricity or telecommunications by a utility organization attending their apparatus in pursuance of their statutory powers or duties; or
    - (v) in pursuance of a local authority's highways management, works, maintenance, waste collection or street cleansing.
  - (c) the vehicle if it is a Universal Service Provider as defined in Section 4(3) of the Postal Services Act 2000 used for the delivering or collecting of postal packets;
  - (d) the vehicle to take in petrol oil water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads;
  - (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
  - (f) the vehicle if it is being used by the emergency services in pursuance of their statutory powers or duties; or
  - (g) the vehicle if it is required by law to stop or obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident or prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond its control.
  - (h) the vehicle to wait for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle.
- (2) Nothing in Articles 4 and 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which validly displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge in the circumstances prescribed in Regulations 7, 8 or 9 and subject to the limitation set out in Regulation 6(2) of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 683 to wait in the lengths of road referred to therein.

9. Those vehicles described in Article 8 (1) (a) to (h) are subject to the provision that:-
- (a) there is no reasonable alternative place to stop or wait; and
- (b) they only stop and wait for so long as is necessary.
10. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

**SECOND SCHEDULE**  
**(Prohibition Of Waiting At All Times)**

Lengths of roads in Havant

Connaught Road

West side:

- from a point 102 metres north from its junction with Oaklands Road, northwards to its junction with Montgomery Road.

Grove Road

South side:

- from the centreline of its junction with Orchard Road, eastwards and westwards for distances of 8 metres and 39 metres, respectively.

North side:

- from a point 67 metres east from its junction with Town Hall Road, measured from the centre line, eastwards to its termination as publicly maintainable highway.

Juniper Square

North side:

- from a point 8 metres east from its junction with South Street, eastwards for a distance of 3 metres.
- from a point 37 metres east from its junction with South Street, eastwards for a distance of 8 metres.

## Montgomery Road

### South side:

- from its western end, eastwards for a distance of 5 metres.
- from a point 60 metres east from its junction with Bellair Road, measured from the centre line, eastwards to its junction with Connaught Road.

### North side:

- from its western end, eastwards for a distance of 6.5 metres.

### West side:

- Across its western end.

## Oaklands Road

### North-west and north-east sides:

- from a point 18.5 metres north-east from the boundary between number 89 and number 91 Oaklands Road, north-eastwards thence south-eastwards for a total distance of 9.5 metres.

### North side:

- from its junction with Bellair Road, eastwards for a distance of 15 metres.

### South side:

- from its junction with Bellair Road, eastwards for a distance of 47 metres.
- from a point 63 metres east from its junction with Pine Grove, measured from the centreline, in an easterly direction for a distance of 13 metres.

### Both sides of the access road:

- from a point 23 metres north-east from the boundary between number 89 and number 91 Oaklands Road, north-eastwards to its termination as publicly maintainable highway.

### North-eastern end of the access road:

- at the delineation point of publicly maintainable highway, between properties 101 and 103 Oaklands Road.

## Orchard Road

### West side:

- from its junction with Grove Road, southwards for a distance of 47 metres.

Orchard Road

East side:

- from its junction with Grove Road, southwards for a distance of 12 metres.
- from a point 32 metres south from its junction with Grove Road, southwards for a distance of 15 metres.

South Street

East side:

- from its junction with Twittens Way, southwards to the northern boundary of number 21 South Street.

### **THIRD SCHEDULE**

#### **Waiting prohibited Monday to Saturday inclusive 8.00am –6.00pm**

#### Lengths of road in Havant

Connaught Road

East side:

- from a point 110 metres north from its junction with Oaklands Road, northwards to its junction with Montgomery Road.

South Street

East side:

- from a point 21 metres south of its crossroads junction with West Street, North Street and East Street, southwards to its junction with Twittens Way.

Montgomery Road

North side:-

from a point 1 metre east from the boundary between number 19 and number 21 Montgomery Road, eastwards to its junction with Connaught Road.

Oaklands Road

North and west sides:

- from a point 2 metres east from the boundary between number 17 and number 19 Oaklands Road, eastwards thence northwards to a point 17 metres south of the boundary between number 21 and number 23 Oaklands Road, a distance of 26 metres.

West and north sides:

- from a point 33 metres north from the boundary between number 23 and number 25 Oaklands Road, northwards and eastwards for a total distance of 18 metres.

Oaklands Road

East and south-east sides:

- from the northern boundary of number 77 Oaklands Road, northwards thence north-eastwards to the boundary between number 73 and number 75 Oaklands Road.

East and north-east sides:

- from the boundary between number 83 and number 85 Oaklands Road, southwards thence south-eastwards for a total distance of 17 metres.

**FOURTH SCHEDULE**

**Waiting prohibited at all times except for ambulances**

Length of road in Havant

Oaklands Road

North side:

- from a point 15 metres east from its junction with Bellair Road, eastwards for a distance of 11 metres.
