

THE BOROUGH OF HAVANT
(BEDHAMPTON: AURIOL DRIVE, BEDHAMPTON HILL, FORTUNES WAY, GLEBE
PARK AVENUE, PENK RIDGE AND SPINNAKER VIEW) (PROHIBITION AND
RESTRICTION OF WAITING) AND (PROHIBITION OF WAITING ON FOOTWAYS
AND VERGES) ORDER 2012

The Council of the Borough of Havant hereby gives notice that pursuant to arrangements made under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 with the Council of the County of Hampshire in exercise of the powers conferred on that County Council under Sections 1 (1) 2 (1) and (2) and 4 (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of March 2013 and may be cited as " The Borough of Havant (Bedhampton: Auriol Drive, Bedhampton Hill, Fortunes Way, Glebe Park Avenue, Penk Ridge and Spinnaker View) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) and (Prohibition of Waiting on Footways and Verges) Order 2012.
2. (1) In this Order –
 - "authorised parking place"** means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act;
 - "Civil Enforcement Officer"** means a person (being a person appointed under Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and/or under Section 63A of the 1984 Act) authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place and act as indicated by the use of the expression in any of the Articles in this Order;
 - "Council"** means the Council of the Borough of Havant;
 - "delivering"** and **"collecting"** in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;
 - "disabled person's badge"** or **"blue badge"** has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 682;
 - "disabled person's vehicle"** has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000;
 - "footway"** has the same meaning as in Section 329 of the Highways Act 1980;
 - "loading"** means the loading or unloading of goods to or from a vehicle;
 - "verge"** means any grassed or ungrassed strip of land within any carriageway and forming part of the highway;
- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge or a parking disc in the relevant position when and only when they are displayed in accordance with Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;
- (3) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
3. Save as provided in Article 7 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads specified in the First Schedule to this Order.

4. Save as provided in Article 7 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 10.00a.m. and 4.00p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive, in the lengths of roads specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.
5. Save as provided in Article 6 no person shall except with the permission of a police officer in uniform, or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any footway or verge in the lengths of road specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.
6. Nothing in Article 5 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any footways or verges on the lengths of road specified in the Third Schedule to this Order for so long as may be necessary to load or unload.
7. (1) Subject to the provisions in Article 8 nothing in Articles 3 and 4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other roads to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely -
 - (i) building industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads; or
 - (iv) the laying erection alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main pipe or cable or other apparatus for the provision of gas water electricity or telecommunications by a utility organization attending their apparatus in pursuance of their statutory powers or duties; or
 - (v) in pursuance of a local authority's highways management, works, maintenance, waste collection or street cleansing.
 - (c) the vehicle if it is a Universal Service Provider as defined in Section 4(3) of the Postal Services Act 2000 used for the delivering or collecting of postal packets;
 - (d) the vehicle to take in petrol oil water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads;
 - (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
 - (f) the vehicle if it is being used by the emergency services in pursuance of their statutory powers or duties; or
 - (g) the vehicle if it is required by law to stop or obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident or prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond its control.
 - (h) the vehicle to wait for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle.

(2) Nothing in Articles 3 and 4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which validly displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge in the circumstances prescribed in Regulations 7, 8 or 9 and subject to the limitation set out in Regulation 6(2) of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 683 to wait in the lengths of roads referred to therein.

8. Those vehicles described in Articles 7 (1) (a) to (h) are subject to the provision that:-
- (a) there is no reasonable alternative place to stop or wait; and
 - (b) they only stop and wait for so long as is necessary.
9. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

FIRST SCHEDULE
(Prohibition Of Waiting At All Times)

Lengths of roads in Bedhampton

A2030 Havant Road

Both sides:-

from a point 57 metres east of the centreline of its junction with Rectory Avenue, eastwards to its junction with Bedhampton Hill.

Auriol Drive

West and east sides:-

- From its junction with Penk Ridge, southwards for distances of 9.5 metres and 10 metres respectively.

East side:-

- From its junction with Auriol Drive (west-east section), northwards for a distance of 23.5 metres.

North side:-

- From its junction with Fortunes Way, westwards and eastwards for distances of 43.5 metres and 13.5 metres respectively.
- From its junction with Auriol Drive (north-south section adjoining Penk Ridge) westwards and eastwards for distances of 46.5 metres and 20 metres respectively.
- From a point 25.5 metres east of its junction with Fortunes Way, eastwards thence north-eastwards for a total distance of 21.5 metres.

South side:-

- From its eastern junction with Havant Road, northwards, eastwards thence north-eastwards for a total distance of 85 metres.

- From eastern its junction with Havant Road, northwards thence westwards for a total distance of 18.5 metres.
- From its western junction with Havant Road, northwards and westwards for a total distance of 43 metres.
- From its western junction with Havant Road, northwards and eastwards for a total distance of 63 metres.

West side:-

- From its junction with Auriol Drive (west-east section), northwards for a distance of 17 metres.

Bedhampton Hill

North-east side:-

- From a point 39.5 metres north-east of its junction with Glebe Park Avenue, north-eastwards, eastwards thence south-westwards, following the kerbline, for a total distance of 70 metres.

Fortunes Way

East and North-east sides:-

- From its eastern junction with Auriol Drive, northwards thence north-westwards for a total distance of 43 metres.

East side:-

- From its western junction with Penk Ridge, northwards for a distance of 15 metres.

South-west side:-

- From the centreline of its eastern junction with Penk Ridge, north-westwards and south-eastwards for distances of 17 metres and 28.5 metres respectively.

South and West side:-

- From a point 6 metres east of the property boundary of numbers 2 and 4 Fortunes Way, westwards thence southwards to a point opposite the property boundary of numbers 7 and 9 Fortunes Way.

West and South-west sides:-

- From its eastern junction with Auriol Drive, northwards thence north-westwards for a total distance of 47.5 metres.

Glebe Park Avenue

West side:-

- From its western junction with Penk Ridge, northwards for a distance of 28.5 metres.

East side:-

- From a point 64 metres north-west of its junction with Bedhampton Hill, for a distance of 50.5 metres in a northerly direction.
- From its junction with Portsdown Hill Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 51 metres.
- From a point 146 metres north of its junction with Bedhampton Hill, northwards for a distance of 8.3 metres.

North-east side:-

- From a point 31 metres north-west of its junction with Bedhampton Hill, north-westwards for a distance of 11 metres.

South-west side:-

- From a point 42 metres north-west of its junction with Bedhampton Hill, northwards for a distance of 65.5 metres.

West side:-

- From its junction with Portsdown Hill Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 57.5 metres.

Penk Ridge

East side:-

- From its junction with Fortunes Way, southwards thence westwards, following the kerbline for a total distance of 28.5 metres.

North side:-

- From the centreline of its western junction with Fortunes Way, westwards and eastwards for distances of 12 and 12.5 metres respectively.

South side:-

- From a point opposite the centreline of its western junction with Fortunes Way, westwards and eastwards for distances of 6.5 metres and 21 metres respectively.

- From its junction with Auriol Drive, westwards and eastwards for distances of 20.5 metres respectively.

West side:-

- From its eastern junction with Fortunes Way, southwards thence westwards, following the kerbline for a total distance of 34 metres.

SECOND SCHEDULE

(Waiting prohibited Monday to Friday inclusive 10.00am-4.00pm)

Lengths of roads in Bedhampton

Glebe Park Avenue

West side:-

- From the centreline of its junction with Spinnaker View, northwards and southwards for distances of 146 metres and 47 metres respectively.

Spinnaker View

North and south sides:-

- From its junction with Glebe Park Avenue, westwards for distances of 12.5 metres and 25 metres respectively.

THIRD SCHEDULE

Waiting prohibited on Footways and Verges except for Loading/Unloading

Lengths of road in Bedhampton

Auriol Drive

South side:-

- From the westernmost point of Auriol Drive, north-eastwards for a distance of 46 metres.
- From a point 139 metres north-east of the westernmost point of Auriol Drive, north-eastwards for a distance of 238.5 metres.
