

THE BOROUGH OF HAVANT
(HAVANT: CROSSLAND DRIVE, FARRINGDON ROAD, NEW LANE AND ST
ALBANS ROAD) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER
2011

The Council of the Borough of Havant ("the Council") pursuant to arrangements made under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 with the County Council of Hampshire in exercise of the powers conferred on that County Council under Sections 1 (1) 2 (1) and (2) and 4 (2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of March 2013 and may be cited as " The Borough of Havant (Havant: Crossland Drive, Farringdon Road, New Lane and St Albans Road) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2011.

2. The parts of Order specified in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

3. (1) In this Order -

"Council" means the Council of the Borough of Havant;

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person (being a person appointed under Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and/or under Section 63A of the 1984 Act) authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place and act as indicated by the use of the expression in any of the Articles in this Order;

"delivering" and **"collecting"** in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"disabled person's badge" or **"blue badge"** has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 682;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986 as amended;

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge or a parking disc in the relevant position when and only when they are displayed in accordance with Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

(3) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

4. Save as provided in Article 6 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.

5. Save as provided in Article 6 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 7.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive (excluding public and bank holidays) in the lengths of road specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.
6. (1) Subject to the provisions in Article 7 nothing in Articles 4 and 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely -
 - (i) building industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads; or
 - (iv) the laying erection alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main pipe or cable or other apparatus for the provision of gas water electricity or telecommunications by a utility organization attending their apparatus in pursuance of their statutory powers or duties; or
 - (v) in pursuance of a local authority's highways management, works, maintenance, waste collection or street cleansing.
 - (c) the vehicle if it is a Universal Service Provider as defined in Section 4(3) of the Postal Services Act 2000 used for the delivering or collecting of postal packets;
 - (d) the vehicle to take in petrol oil water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads;
 - (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
 - (f) the vehicle if it is being used by the emergency services in pursuance of their statutory powers or duties; or
 - (g) the vehicle if it is required by law to stop or obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident or prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond its control.
 - (h) the vehicle to wait for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle.

(2) Nothing in Articles 4 and 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which validly displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge in the circumstances prescribed in Regulations 7, 8 or 9 and subject to the limitation set out in Regulation 6(2) of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 683 to wait in the lengths of roads referred to therein.

7. Those vehicles described in Article 6 (1) (a) to (h) are subject to the provision that:-
- (a) there is no reasonable alternative place to stop or wait; and
 - (b) they only stop and wait for so long as is necessary.
8. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

SECOND SCHEDULE
(Prohibition Of Waiting At All Times)

Lengths of roads in Havant

New Lane

West side:

throughout its entire length.

East side:

From its junction with Eastern Road, northwards for a distance of 65 metres.

From the centreline of its junction with Crossland Drive, north and south for distances of 62 and 71 metres respectively.

From a point 19 metres south of the centreline of its junction with Farrington Road, northwards to its junction with Bartons Road.

Farrington Road

North side:

From its junction with New Lane, westwards for a distance of 31.5 metres.

South side:

From its junction with New Lane, westwards for a distance of 29 metres.

Crossland Drive

North side:

From its junction with New Lane, westwards for a distance of 77 metres.

South side:

From its junction with New Lane, westwards for a distance of 82 metres.

St Albans Road

East side:

From its junction with Crossland Drive, northwards for a distance of 32 metres.

West side:

From its junction with Crossland Drive, northwards for a distance of 33.5 metres.

New Lane (Access to Haywards Business Centre)

Both sides:

From its junction with New Lane, eastwards for a distance of 6 metres.

New Lane Service Road – North section (Access Road to Colt International)

East side:

From its junction with New Lane for a distance of 60 metres.

West side:

From its junction with New Lane for a distance of 67 metres.

New Lane Service Road – South Section (Access Road to Marsh Plant)

East side:

From its junction with Farringdon Lane, northwards for a distance of 24 metres.

West Side:

From its junction with Farringdon Lane, northwards for a distance of 43 metres.

THIRD SCHEDULE

Waiting prohibited Monday to Friday inclusive between the hours of 7am and 6pm (excluding Public and Bank Holidays)

Length of road in Havant

New Lane

East side:

From a point 65.5 metres north of its junction with Eastern Road, to a point 71 metres south of the centreline of its junction with Crossland Drive.

From a point 62 metres north of the centreline of its junction with Crossland Drive, north-eastwards to a point 41 metres north of its junction with Stanbridge Road.
