ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATIONS 1967

THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1967

(SCHEDULE 1, SCHEDULES ROAD AND TRAFFIC ACTS, 1967)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1977

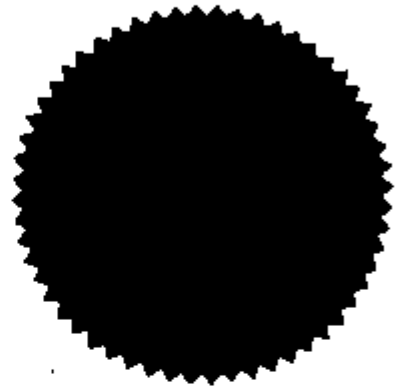
The County Council of Hereford and Worcester, in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967"), and of all other powers then enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 84(1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-

1. Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule hereto.
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary:-
  - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle;
  - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any validly operation or development, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the lengths of roads referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to the said lengths of roads of any sewer, drain, pipe or other works, or the repair or construction of any drain, sewer, pipe or other works.

- (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other way, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (e) for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 37 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
  - (f) for the purpose of removing furniture and effects from one office or dwellinghouse to another or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with;
  - (g) for the taking by any vehicle of oil, petrol, water or air from any garage situate on or adjacent to the lengths of roads.
3. The restrictions imposed by Article 1, of this Order shall not apply to the following vehicles, that is to say, a disabled person's vehicle left by the driver thereof being a vehicle which displays in accordance with the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1971, as amended a badge issued under the Disabled Persons (Groups for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975, in pursuance of a scheme under Section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act, 1970.
4. The Interpretation Act 1939 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
5. This Order shall come into operation on the 22nd day of February 1977, and may be cited as the County of Hereford and Worcester (Stanhovon Road, Sturdale Road and Laystons Avenue, Hereford) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1977.

SCHEDULE

Roads in the City of  
Hereford

Lengths of Roads

Stanberrow Road	-	both sides of Stanberrow Road from its junction with Standale Road in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 15 metres (16.4 yards).
Standale Road	-	both sides of Standale Road from its junction with Stanberrow Road in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 65 metres (71 yards), excluding that part of the highway forming a layby outside property Nos. 41-49 inclusive, Standale Road.
Leysters Avenue	-	both sides of Leysters Avenue from its junction with Standale Road in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 15 metres (16.4 yards).
