THE COUNTY OF HEREFORD AND WORCESTER

(ST. MARTINS AVENUE, HEREFORD)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1976

The County Council of Hereford and Worcester in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), (2), and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967"), and of all other powers then enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 843(1) of the Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-

1. The City of Hereford (Various Streets) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1974 is revoked in part insofar as it relates to St. Martin's Avenue, Hereford (north side to its junction with St. Martin's Street).
2. Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, or a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the north side of St. Martins Avenue, Hereford from a point 8.23 metres (9 yards) east of its junction with St. Martins Street in an easterly direction for a distance of 73.5 metres (80 yards).
3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the side of length of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it is in the service of or employed by the Post Office, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the side of length of road so specified or the laying erection, alteration or repair in or near to the said side of length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;

- (e) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (f) for the purpose of removing furniture and effects from one office or dwellinghouse to another or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with;
- (g) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said side of length of road.


4. The restrictions imposed by Article 2 of this Order shall not apply to the following vehicles, that is to say a disabled person's vehicle left by the driver thereof being a vehicle which displays in accordance with the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1971, as amended a badge issued under the Disabled Persons (Badge for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975, in pursuance of a scheme under Section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act, 1970.

5. The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if for the purposes of section 33 of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the Order revoked in part by Article 1 of this Order were an Act of Parliament thereby revoked insofar as it is revoked by this Order.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the 6th March 1976 and may be cited as the County of Hereford and Worcester (St. Martins Avenue, Hereford) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1976.
