

(ST PETER'S STREET, HIGH TOWN AND COMMERCIAL STREET, HEREFORD)

(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) ORDER 1988

Hereford and Wordester County Council in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1) and (2), Z(1) to (3) and 3(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act is hereinofter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:—

- 1. Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed or wait in the roads and length of road in the City of Hereford in the County of Hereford and Worcester specified in the Schedule to this Order on Monday to Saturday inclusive before 10.30 am and after 4.30 pm and all day Sunday.
- 2. Save as provided in Article 3(a)-(f) of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed or wait in the roads and length of road in the City of Hereford in the County of Hereford and Worcester specified in the Schedule to this Order between the hours of 10.30 am and 4.30 pn on Monday to Saturday inclusive.
- 3. Nothing in Articles 1 and 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit the following vehicles to proceed or wait along the length of road referred to in that Article:-
 - (a) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;
 - (b) a vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (c) a vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the roads and length of road referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said roads and length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (d) any road cleansing venicle.
 - (e) a vehicle being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;



- (g) a vehicle requiring access to land or premises fronting the said roads and length of road to which there is not a satisfactory alternative access;
- (h) a vehicle being used in connection with goods to be loaded onto and/or unloaded from the vehicle;
- any pedal cycle or tricycle;
- (j) a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc, to gain access to the designated disabled persons parking places, during the days and hours of operation of such parking places.

(i) In this Order:-

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;

. "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No.4631:1970), but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during with a period of waiting begins.


- (ii) For the Purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-
 - (1) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when:-
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the bacge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; and
 - (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle;
 - (2) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the 23rd April 1988 and may be cited as The County of Hereford and Wordester (St Peter's Street, High Town and Commercial Street, Hereford) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1988.

SCHEDULE

Roads and Length of road in the City of Hereford in the County of Hereford and Wordester.

(a) St Peter's Street

From its junction with Offa Street to its junction with Commercial Street and High Town, being defined as:-

- (i) the western limit of the service lane to the west of "The Old House"; and
- (ii) to its junction with Commercial Street to the east of "The Old Rouse".

(b) High Town

Eastern end — from its junction with the western limit of St. Peter's Street service (and (to the west of "The Old House") and its junction with Commercial Street for a distance of 18 metres (59 feet) in a westerly direction.

(c) Commercial Street

From its junction with St. Peter's Street and High Town to its junction with Commercial Square.
