ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

THE COUNTY OF HEREFORD AND WORCESTER

(ST. MARTINS STREET, HEREFORD)

(PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 1982

The County Council of Hereford and Worcester, in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), (2), (3) and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is herelasfter referred to as 'the Act of 1967') and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 840(1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-

- The City of Hereford (Various Streets) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1974 is hereby varied and shall have effect as if:-
 - (a) Item 49(d) of Schedule 2 were deleted therefrom; and
 - (b) Item 49(b) of Schedule 2 were colleted therefrom; and
 (c) Item 9(c) of Schedule 6 were deleted therefrom.
- Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order, no person shall, 2. except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the side of length of St. Martins Street in the City of Hereford in the County of Hereford and Worcester specified in the First Schedule to this Order.
- 3. Save as provided in Articles 4 and δ of this Order, no person shall, except apon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of as traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Monday to Saturday inclusive in the side of length of St. Marrins Street in the City of Hereford in the County of Hereford and Worsester specified in the Second Schedule to this Order:
 - for a longer period than two hours; and (a)
 - If a period of less than two hours has elapsed since the (b) termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting of the vehicle in the said side of length of road.
- 4. Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side of length of road referred to in those Articles for so long as may be necessary:
 - to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle; (a)

- (b) to enable goods to be loaded onto and unloaded from the vehicle;
- (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or denolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the side of length of road referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said side of length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus of length of road of any sewer or electricity, or of any telegraphic line a defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;
- (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (e) for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
- (f) for the purpose of removing furniture and effects from one office or dwellinghouse to another, or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with;
- (g) for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes.
- 5. Nothing in Article 2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the side of length of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of length of road on the same day).
- 6. The restriction imposed by Article 3 of this Order shall not apply to a disabled person's vehicle left by the driver thereof being a vehicle which displays in accordance with the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1971 (Exemptions as amended, a badge issued under the Disabled Persons' (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975, in pursuance of a scheme under Section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970.

7. (1) In this Order:-

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons' (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631; 1970) but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a

period of waiting begins.


- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when -
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; and
 - (11) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle;
 - (b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window meanest to the kerb.
- This Order shall come into operation on the 14th day of January 1965 and may be cited as The County of Hereford and Worcester (St. Martins Street, Hereford) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1982.

SCHEDULE

FIRST SCHEDULE

Side of lengths of road in the City of Hereford in the County of Hereford and Worcester.

St. Martin's Street (western side) from a point 1/.1 metres (56 feet) south of its junction with Wye Street, in a northerly direction to its junction with Wye Bridge.

from a point 18.3 metres (60 feet) north of its junction with St. Martin's Avenue to a point 68.8 metres (226 feet) south of its junction with Wye Street.

SECOND SCHEDULE

St. Martin's Street (western side) from a point 17.1 metres (56 feet) south of its junction with Wye Street in a southerly direction for a distance of 51.8 metres (170 feet).
