ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE COUNTY OF HEREFORD AND WORCESTER

(UNION STREET AND ST. OWEN STREET, HEREFORD)

(STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 1994

Hereford and Worcester County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 32(1) and 35(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other powers, and after consultation with the Chief of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-

- This Order shall come into operation on the 25th day of April 1994 and may be cited as the County of Hereford and Worcester (Union Street and St. Owen Street, Hereford) (Street Parking Places) Order 1994.
- 2. The County of Hereford and Worcester (St. Owen Street, Offa Street and St. Peters Square, Hereford) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1987 is hereby varied and shall have effect as though part (f) of the First Schedule relating to the south west side of St. Peters Square was amended to read:-

"St. Peters Square (south west side)

from its junction with Offa Street for a distance of 18 metres in a south easterly direction".

- In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-
 - "driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place and as defined in the Act of 1984.
 - "parking place", means any part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place.
 - "goods vehicle", means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for the use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, or a trailer so constructed or adapted and does not include a hatchback motor car.
 - "trailer", means any vehicle other than a motor car.
 - "hatchback motor car", means a motor car equipped with a sloping door situated at the rear of the vehicle giving access to the luggage and passenger compartment.
 - "coach", has the same meaning as that defined in Regulation 3(2) of, and the Table to, the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986.
 - 4. Each of the parts of the road specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order is authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such vehicles or classes of vehicles in such positions and on such days and during such hours as specified in relation to that part in the said Schedule.

- 5. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order:-
 - (a) shall restrict the power of the Council, for preventing obstruction of the streets, by order on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination, or where the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed, to close any parking place; or
 - (b) shall authorise the use of any part of the road so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by any person entitled to the use of thereof, or so as to be a nuisance.
- 6. Where in the Schedule to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place:-
 - (a) unless it is of the specified class; or
 - (b) in a position other than that specified.
- 7. Nothing in Article 4 hereof shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any parking place for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or on any land adjacent to any parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (b) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.
- 8. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place:-

- so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons entitled to do so, or so as to be a nuisance;
- (b) when for preventing obstruction of the streets the Council shall by order made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that parking place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near the parking place.
- The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
- 10. No persons shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
- 11. When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in paragraph (a) or (b) or Article 7 or 8 of this Order a police constable in uniform, traffic warden or a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place.

- Any person removing a vehicle by virtue of the last preceding Article of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it as aforesaid.
 - 13. When a police constable in uniform, a traffic warden or a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 9 of this Order, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

- 4. Nothing in Article 3 hereof shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any parking place for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) the vehicle to be used in connection with any of the following operation, namely:-
 - (i) building or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to any parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (b) the vehicle to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (c) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (d) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.
 - 5. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place:-
 - so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the roads or the use of the roads by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance;
 - (f) when for preventing obstruction of the streets the Council shall by order made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that parking place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near the parking place.
 - 6. In this Order:-

"parking place" means any part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place.

 This Order shall come into operation on the 25th day of April 1994 and may be cited as The County of Hereford and Worcester (Union Street, St. Peters Square and Gaol Street, Hereford) (Parking Places for Disabled Persons Vehicles) Order 1994
