ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

THE COUNTY OF HEREFORD AND WORCESTER

(GRANDSTAND ROAD, HEREFORD)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1978

The County Council of Hereford and Worcester, in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967"), and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 84C (1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-


1. Save as provided in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the sides of lengths of road specified in the Schedule hereto;
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the sides of lengths of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) to enable goods to be loaded and unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the sides of lengths of road referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to the said sides of lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;
 - (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
 - (f) for the purpose of removing furniture and effects from one office or dwellinghouse to another or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with;

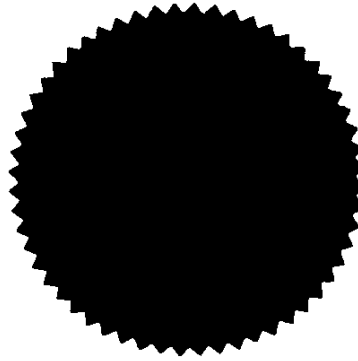
(g) for the taking by any vehicle of oil, petrol, water or air from any garage situate on or adjacent to the sides of lengths of road.

3. The restrictions imposed by Article 1, of this Order shall not apply to a disabled person's vehicle left by the driver thereof being a vehicle which displays in accordance with the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1971, as amended a badge issued under the Disabled Persons (Badge for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975, in pursuance of a scheme under Section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act, 1970.
4. The Interpretation Act, 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
5. This Order shall come into operation on the 25th day of July 1978, and may be cited as the County of Hereford and Worcester (Grandstand Road, Hereford) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1978.

SCHEDULE

Sides of lengths of Road in the City of Hereford
in the County of Hereford and Worcester

Side of Road
Grandstand Road, Hereford

Length

Southern	-	From the south-eastern boundary of No. 33 to the boundary of Nos 49 and 51 (a length of 55 metres (60 yds.))
Northern	-	From the northern boundary of No. 78 eastwards to a point opposite the boundary of Nos. 37/39, (a distance of 770 metres (842 yards.))
