ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

THE COUNTY OF HEREFORD AND WORCESTER

(KING STREET, HEREFORD)

(RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 1983

The County Council of Hereford and Worcester in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), (2), (3) and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is the Local Government act 1972 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967") and of all other powers them hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967") and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 84C(1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-

1. The City of Hereford (Various Streets) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1974 is hereby varied and shall have effect as though item 35(b) of Schedule 2 was amended to read:-

Northside:- from a point 36.6m etres (120 feet) east of its junction with Aubrey Streetto its junction with Palace Yard.

Southernside:-

(i)

from a point 36.6metres(120 Feet) east of its junction with Aubrey Street, eastwards for a distance of 5.9metres (19 feet).

(ii)

from a point 52.5metres(172 feet) east of its junction with Aubrey Street, to its junction with Palace Yard.

- 2. Save as provided in Articles 3 and 4 of this Order, no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Monday to Saturday inclusive on the following side of length of road in the City of Hereford in the County of Hereford and Worcester:-
 - (a) for a longer period than one hour; and
 - b) if a period of less than one hour has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting, if any, of the vehicle in the said side of length of road:

King Street

from a point 42.5 metres (139 feet)

east of its junction with Aubrey Street for a distance of 10 metres (33 feet) (southern side) in an easterly direction.

- 3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side of length of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary:
 - to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle; (a)
 - to enable goods to be loaded onto and unloaded from the (b) vehicle;
 - to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of side of length of road referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said side of length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;
 - to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets asdefined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - for the purpose of removing furniture and effects from one office or dwellinghouse to another, or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with;
 - (g) for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes.
 - Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge to wait on the side of length of road referred to in that Article.
 - (1) In this Order:-

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631:1970), but coloured

orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; and
 - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle;
 - (b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.
- 6. This Order shall come into operation on the 5th day of September 1983 and may be cited as The County of Hereford and Worcester (King Street, Hereford) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1983.
