ST. OWEN STREET AND ST. PETER'S SQUARE, HEREFORD

(STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 1987

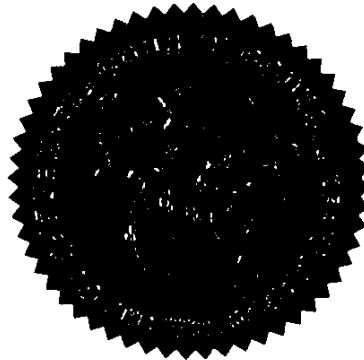
Hereford and Worcester County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 32 and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other powers from enabling in that behalf, and with the consent of every authority and person responsible for the maintenance of the roads affected by this Order and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 23rd day of November 1987 and may be cited as St. Owen Street and St. Peter's Square, Hereford (Street Parking Places) Order 1987.
2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-
 - "driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place and as defined in the Act of 1984;
 - "parking place" means any part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place.
3. Each of the parts of the road specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order is authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such vehicles or classes of vehicles in such positions and on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that part in the said Schedule.
4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order:-
 - (a) shall restrict the power of the Council, for preventing obstruction of the streets, by Order on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination, or where the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed, to close any parking place; or
 - (b) shall authorise the use of any part of the road so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by any person entitled to the use thereof, or so as to be a nuisance.
5. Where in the Schedule to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place:-
 - (a) unless it is of the specified class; or
 - (b) in a position other than that specified.

6. The driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place:-
 - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons entitled to do so, or so as to be a nuisance;
 - (b) when for preventing obstruction of the streets the Council shall by Order made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that parking place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near the parking place.
7. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
8. No person shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
9. When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in paragraph (a) or (b) of Article 5 or 6 of this Order a police constable in uniform, a traffic warden or a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place.
10. Any person removing a vehicle by virtue of the last preceding Article of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it as aforesaid.
11. When a police constable in uniform, a traffic warden or a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 9 of this Order, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.
