The Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 1(1), (2), (3) and (3B) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967(a), as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 (b), and by Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 (c), and now vested in him (d), and of all other enabling powers hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Trunk Road (Victoria Street, Hereford) (Box Junction) Order 1975 and shall come into operation on 6th October 1975.

2.--(1) In this Order references to "the boxed area" are references to an area of the carriageway of that length of the Ross-Beaconsfield Trunk Road (149) known as Victoria Street in the District of Hereford in the County of Hereford and Worcester being the area at the junction of Victoria Street with Biga Street while is marked by traffic signs consisting of cross-hatched yellow lines bounded by a yellow line placed on the carriageway and authorised by the Secretary of State under Section 54 of the said Act of 1967.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1939(c) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, drive a vehicle into the boxed area and thereafter drive it in such direction that it becomes necessary, owing to the presence of stationary vehicles for any part of the vehicle to remain at rest within the area:

Provided that no driver of a vehicle which is caused to remain at rest within the boxed area shall be guilty of an offence if at the time he drove into the area he had reasonable cause to believe that he would immediately thereafter be able to drive the vehicle wholly out of the area.

4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall apply -
 (a) so as to prohibit the driving of a vehicle into the boxed area by a person who thereafter drives it into a position where he can conveniently make a right-hand turn and who is then prevented from driving out of the area by reason only of the presence of other stationary vehicles in or near the area; or
 (b) to vehicles being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes

- (d) is being used in an emergency for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes;
 - (e) is to be garaged, services or repaired at any premises situate on or adjacent to the lengths of roads;
 - (f) is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
3. The Council are satisfied that, for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the lengths of roads specified in Article 4 of this Order it is requisite that Section 1(5) of the said Act of 1967 should not apply in relation to this Order.
 4. The Interpretation Act, 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
 5. This Order may be cited as the County of Hereford and Worcester (Honddu Glose and Greencroft, Hereford) (Prohibition of Through Traffic) Order, 1976, and shall come into operation on 30th January, 1976.
