

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984
THE COUNTY OF HEREFORD AND WORCESTER
(GREYTREE ROAD, ROSS-ON-WYE)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1995

Hereford and Worcester County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-

1. Save as provided in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the south side of Greytrees Road in the Town of Ross-on-Wye in the District of South Herefordshire in the County of Hereford and Worcester from its junction with Nursery Road to a point 20 metres west of the centreline of that junction.
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the side of length of road referred to in the Article for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded onto and/or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the side of length of road referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said side of length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (f) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of removing furniture and effects from one office or dwellinghouse to another, or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with;
 - (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes.
3. Nothing in Article 1 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of

the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the side of length of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same side of length of road on the same day).

4. (1) In this Order:-

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, 125 millimetres square, coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-

(a) a disabled person's badge issued before 2nd March 1992 in the relevant position, when:-

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; and

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle;

(b) a disabled person's badge issued on or after 2nd March 1992 in the relevant position, when:-

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; and

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.

(c) a parking disc in the relevant position, when:-

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; and

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so

that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.

5. The restrictions, prohibitions and requirements imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption to the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment.
6. This Order shall come into operation on the 16th day of October 1995 and may be cited as The County of Hereford and Worcester (Greytree Road, Ross-on-Wye) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1995.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

(CANTILUPE ROAD, ROSS-ON-WYE)

(PARKING PLACES FOR DISABLED PERSONS VEHICLES) ORDER 1994

Hereford and Worcester County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 32(1) and 35(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers, and with the consent of every authority and person responsible for the maintenance of the roads affected by the Order and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 hereby making the following Order:-

1. (1) Each of the parts of the road specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order is authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such classes of vehicles and in such positions as are specified in relation to that part of road in the said Schedule;
- (2) Nothing in paragraph (1) of this Article shall restrict the power of the Council, for preventing obstruction of streets, by order on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination, or where the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed, to close any parking space.
2. Where in the Schedule to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver shall not permit the vehicle to wait in that parking place:-
 - (a) unless it is of the specified class; or
 - (b) in a position other than that specified.
3. Nothing in Article 2 hereof shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any parking place for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) the vehicle to be used in connection with any of the following operation, namely:-
 - (i) building or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to any parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (b) the vehicle to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (c) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (d) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.
4. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place:-
 - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the roads or the use of the roads by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance;

(b) when for preventing obstruction of the streets the Council shall by order made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that parking place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near the parking place.

5. In this Order:-

"parking place" means any part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the 25th day of April 1994 and may be cited as The County of Hereford and Worcester (Cantilupe Road, Ross-on-Wye) (Parking Places for Disabled Persons Vehicles) Order 1994
