ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE COUNTY OF HEREFORDSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL

GLOUCESTER ROAD, ROSS-ON-WYE  
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING, LOADING AND UNLOADING) ORDER 1999

The County of Herefordshire District Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1 and 124 and part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-

1. The County of Hereford and Worcester (Various Roads, Ross-on-Wye) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1996 is hereby varied and shall have effect as though part 3 of the second schedule was deleted therefrom.
2. Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait or to load and unload at any time on those lengths of road in the Town of Ross-on-Wye in the County of Herefordshire specified in the schedule to this Order.
3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the sides of length of road referred to in those Articles for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
  - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the sides of length of road referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said sides of length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
  - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
  - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of removing furniture and effects from one office or dwellinghouse to another, or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with;
  - (f) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes.
4. Nothing in Article 2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the said sides of length of road referred to in Article 2 for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same sides of length of road on the same day)

- 5. The restrictions, prohibitions and requirements imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption to the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment.
- 6. This Order shall come into operation on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of December 1999 and may be cited as The County of Herefordshire District Council Gloucester Road, Ross-on-Wye (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1999.

SCHEDULE

Lengths of roads in the Town of Ross-on-Wye in the County of Herefordshire.

Gloucester Road, north side

- OK — from a point opposite the centre line of the junction with Chase Road for a distance of 66 metres in a westerly direction;
- from a point 90 metres west of the centre line of the junction with Chase Road for a distance of 7 metres in a westerly direction;
- OK — from a point 132.5 metres west of the centre line of the junction with Chase Road for a distance of 40.5 metres in a westerly direction;
- OK — from a point 186 metres west of the centre line of the junction with Chase Road for a distance of 2 metres in a westerly direction;
- OK — from a point 204 metres west of the centre line of its junction with Chase Road to its junction with Broad Street.

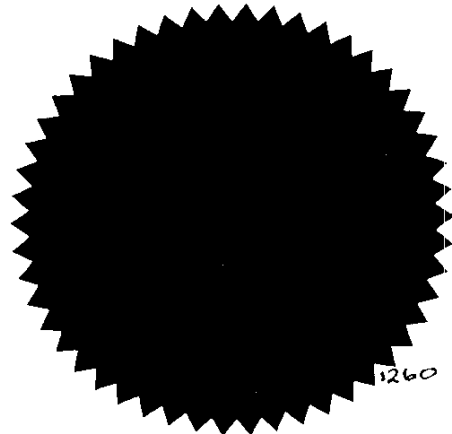
Gloucester Road, south side

- OK — from the western kerblineline of Chase Road for a distance of 19 metres in a westerly direction;
- OK — from a point 39 metres west of the western kerblineline of Chase Road for a distance of 25 metres in a westerly direction;
- OK — from a point 88 metres west of the western kerblineline of Chase Road for a distance of 3 metres in a westerly direction;
- OK — from a point 130.5 metres west of the western kerblineline of Chase Road for a distance of 3 metres in a westerly direction;
- from a point 157 metres west of the western kerblineline of Chase Road for a distance of 8.5 metres in a westerly direction;
- from a point 189.5 metres west of the western kerblineline of Chase Road to its junction with Copse Cross Street.
