GLOUCESTER ROAD, ROSS-ON-WYE
(STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 1999

Order

The County of Herefordshire District Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 32(1) and 35(1) and part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-

1. The Trunk Road (Gloucester Road, Ross-on-Wye) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1971 is hereby varied and shall have effect as though parts 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 1 relating to Gloucester Road were hereby deleted therefrom.

2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-

"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place and as defined in the Act of 1984.

"parking place", means any part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place.

"goods vehicle", means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for the use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, or a trailer so constructed or adapted and does not include a hatchback motor car.

"hatchback motor car", means a motor car equipped with a sloping door situated at the rear of the vehicle giving access to the luggage and passenger compartment.

"disabled person's vehicle", has the meaning as detailed in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986.

"public service vehicle" means a vehicle within the meaning of Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981.

"coach" means a large bus with a maximum gross weight of more than 7.5 tonnes and with a maximum speed of 60 mph as defined in Regulation 3(2) of and the Table to the Road Vehicle (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986.

3. Each of the parts of the road in the Town of Ross-on-Wye in the County of Herefordshire specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order is authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such vehicles or classes of vehicles in such positions and on such days and during such hours as specified in relation to that part in the said Schedule.

4. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order:-

- (a) shall restrict the power of the Council, for preventing obstruction of the streets, by order on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination, or where the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed, to close any parking place; or
- (b) shall authorise the use of any part of the road so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by any person entitled to the use of thereof, or so as to be a nuisance.

5. Where in the Schedule to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place:-

- (a) unless it is of the specified class; or
- (b) in a position other than that specified.

6. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place:-

- (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons entitled to do so, or so as to be a nuisance;
- (b) when for preventing obstruction of the streets the Council shall by order made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that parking place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near the parking place.

7. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.

8. No persons shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skills or services.

9. When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in paragraph (a) or (b) or Article 5 or 6 of this Order, a police constable in uniform, traffic warden or a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place.

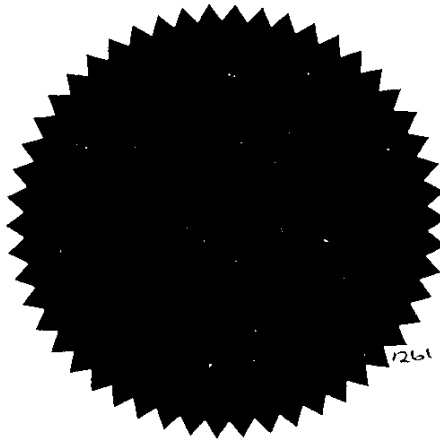
10. Any person removing a vehicle by virtue of the last preceding Article of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it as aforesaid.

11. When a police constable in uniform, a traffic warden or a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 9 of this Order, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the 8th day of December 1999 and may be cited as the County of Herefordshire District Council Gloucester Road, Ross-on-Wye (Street Parking Places) Order 1999.
