THE COUNTY OF HEREFORD AND WORCESTER

(HOMS ROAD, ROSS-ON-WYE)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1980

The County Council of Hereford and Worcester, in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967"), and of all other powers then enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 84C(1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-

1. Save as provided in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in that length of Homs Road, Ross-on-Wye, in the District of South Herefordshire in the County of Hereford and Worcester which extends for a distance of 112 metres (370 feet) in a generally northern direction from the centre of Greytrees Bridge and for a distance of 112 metres (370 feet) in a generally southern direction from the centre of Greytrees Bridge.
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the length of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded and unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of road referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to the said length of road of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
 - (f) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of removing furniture and effects from one office or dwellinghouse to another or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they impose are complied with;
 - (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes

3. Nothing in Article 1 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the length of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same length of road on the same day).

4. (1) In this Order:-

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631 : 1970), but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-

(a) a disabled persons' badge in the relevant position, when -

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle and

(b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the Kerb.


(3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the 23rd day of May 1980 and may be cited as the County of Hereford and Worcester (Homs Road, Ross-on-Wye) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1980.

PUBLIC NOTICE

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 16th May 1980, the County Council of Hereford and Worcester made an Order under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, and of all other enabling powers, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting on either side of Homs Road, Ross-on-Wye in the District of South Herefordshire in the County of Hereford and Worcester from a point 112 metres (370 feet) north of the centre of Greytrees Bridge to a point 112 metres (370 feet) south of the centre of Greytrees Bridge.

The Order will come into operation on 23rd May 1980. A copy of the Order as made and a copy of the relevant map can be inspected at Hereford and Worcester County Council offices at the County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester, between 9.30 a.m. - 12.30 p.m. and 2.00 p.m. - 4.00 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant Section of Act or on the ground that any requirement of that Section or of Section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act of 1967 or of any regulations made under the said Section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made (such date stated in this Notice) make application for the purpose to the High Court.

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631 : 1970), but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-

(a) a disabled persons' badge in the relevant position, when -

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle and

(b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the Kerb.

(3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a number Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the 23rd day of May 1980 and may be cited as the County of Hereford and Worcester (Homs Foed, Ross-on-Wye) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1980.
