ROAD TRAFFIC

THE B4260 TRUNK ROAD (WILTON ROAD ROSS ON WYE) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 199

Made	19
Coming into force	19

The Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into force on _____ and may be cited as the B4260 Trunk Road (Wilton Road, Ross on Wye) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 19

2. - (1) In this Order -

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No 4631: 1970), but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

"the trunk road" means the Hungerford-Hereford (B4260) Trunk Road being on part of Wilton Road, Ross on Wye in the District of South Herefordshire in the county of Hereford and Worcester;

"the water authority" means a water or sewerage undertaker within the meaning of the Water Act 1989(b).

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -

(a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when -

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forward on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and

- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle, and

- (b) a parking disk in the relevant position, when the disk is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.

(3) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Save as provided in article 4 no person shall, except on the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day in the trunk road on its north side from its junction with Edde Cross Street for a distance of 105 metres in a south-westerly direction on its south side from a point opposite its junction with Edde Cross Street to its junction with Royal Parade.

4. - (1) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on a side of a length of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -

- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely -
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that length of road; or
 - (iv) the laying erection, alteration or repair in, or on the land adjacent to, that length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line or telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984(a);



- (v) the removal of furniture and effects from one office or dwelling house to another, or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with;
- (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953(a); or
- (e) the vehicle to be used for police, ambulance, or fire brigade purposes.

(2) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle on a side of all lengths of the trunk road specified in that article at any time on any day.

(3) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on a side of a length of road referred to in that article for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in that length of road in the same day).

5. The Trunk Road (A40 Wilton Road, Ross on Wye) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1980(b) and the County of Hereford and Worcester (Wilton Road, Ross-on-Wye) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1990 are hereby revoked.
