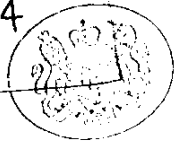

THE TRUNK ROAD (A40 WILTON ROAD, ROSS-ON-WYE)
(RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 1980

Coming into operation

29 February 1980

The Minister of Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 (a) (which said Act of 1967 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967") and now vested in him (b) and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on 29th February 1980, and may be cited as the Trunk Road (A40 Wilton Road, Ross-on-Wye) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1980.

2. (1) In this Order -

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975 (c);

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975 (d);

"parking disc" means a disc issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No 4 1970) but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins; and

"the trunk road" means the Hungerford to Hereford Trunk Road (A40)

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying

(a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position when -

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle, and

(b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards on the front or immediately behind the windscreen or side windows nearest to the driver.

(3) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

(4) In this Order all measurements of distance are measured along the route of the trunk road

3. Save as provided in Article 4 no person shall, except on the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the south side of that length of the trunk road known as Wilton Road, Ross-on-Wye, in the County of Hereford and Worcester, from a point opposite its junction with Eade Cross Street for a distance of 231 feet in a westerly direction.

4. (1) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road or on the side of the road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -

(a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;

(b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely -

(i) building, industrial or demolition operations;

(ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

(iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road or side of road; or

(iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths of road or side of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878 (a);

(c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

(d) the vehicle to be used for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes.

(2) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle.

(3) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the side of the road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road on the same day).



5. The Restriction imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1967 or by any other enactment.
