ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE COUNTY OF HEREFORD AND WORCESTER

(A466 HEREFORD TO MONMOUTH ROAD, ST. WEONARDS)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1986

Hereford and Worcester County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-

1. Save as provided in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the east side of the A466 Hereford to Monmouth Road in the Parish of St. Weonards in the District of South Herefordshire in the County of Hereford and Worcester which extends from a point 14 metres (46 feet) north of its junction with the C1236 St. Weonards to Bagwy Llydiart Road for a distance of 89 metres (292 feet) in a southerly direction.
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the side of length of road referred to in the Article for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the side of length of road referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said side of length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (f) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of removing furniture and effects from one office or dwellinghouse to another, or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with;

- (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes.
3. Nothing in Article 1 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the side of length of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same side of length of road on the same day).
4. (1) In this Order:-
- "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;
- "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975;
- "parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631:1970), but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.
- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-
- (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when -
- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; and
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle;
- (b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.
5. This Order shall come into operation on the 2nd day of June 1986 and may be cited as The County of Hereford and Worcester (A466 Hereford to Monmouth Road, St. Weonards) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1986.

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1990

NOTICE is hereby given that on 26th April 1990 Hereford and Worcester County Council made an Order under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which is to prohibit waiting in those sides of lengths of road in the Parish of Leintwardine in the District of Leominster in the County of Hereford and Worcester specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

The Order will come into operation on 8th May 1990.

A copy of the Order as made and a copy of the relevant map can be inspected at County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester, during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant Section of the Act or on the ground that any requirement of that Section or of Parts I, II or III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 or of any regulations made under the said Part III of Schedule 9 have not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made (such date stated in this Notice) make application for the purpose to the High Court.

SCHEDULE

Sides of lengths of roads in the Parish of Leintwardine in the District of Leominster in the County of Hereford and Worcester.

1. High Street
(east side)
 - (a) from its junction with Church Street for a distance of 42 metres (138 feet) in a northerly direction.
 - (b) from its junction with Church Street for a distance of 30 metres (99 feet) in a southerly direction.
