

THE NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL (HUNSTANTON, VARIOUS ROADS)
(TRAFFIC REGULATION) CONSOLIDATION ORDER 2012

The Norfolk County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 122 and parts III and IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 (hereinafter referred to as "the 2004 Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. In this Order:

"motor cycle" has the same meaning as in section 136 of the Act;

"cycle" has the same meaning as in section 192 of the Road Traffic Act 1988;

"motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in section 185 of the Road Traffic Act 1988";

"Class 1, Class 2 and Class 3 vehicles" have the same meaning as in section 3 of The Use of Invalid Carriages on Highways Regulations 1988.

2. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle in any direction other than from south to north along the U20032 Church Street from its junction with the C482 Westgate to its junction with the C481 Greevegate.
3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle in any direction other than from north to south along the C499 High Street from its junction with the C481 Greevegate to its junction with the C482 Westgate.
4. Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order shall apply to the driving of any mechanical road cleansing vehicle.
5. Save as provided in Article 6, no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, drive or cause to be driven any vehicle along the U20053 Seagate from a point in line with the eastern kerbline of its junction with the U20054 Seagate Road eastwards to its junction with the U20052 Beach Terrace Road.
6. Nothing in Article 5 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent a person from causing a vehicle to be driven along the lengths of road specified in Articles 7 of this Order if the vehicle is being used:
 - (a) for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

- (c) in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that length of road or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to that length of road of any sewer, water, gas or electricity apparatus or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (d) for the provision of a universal postal service as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - (e) to obtain access to off-street parking adjacent to the length of restriction;
 - (f) for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to the length of restriction between 1600 hrs and 1100 hrs.
7. Save as provided in Article 8 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction of, or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause any motor vehicle to proceed along the U20052 Beach Terrace Road from a point 40 metres west of its junction with the B1161 Cliff Parade/Le Strange Terrace westwards and southwards for a distance of 56 metres.
8. Nothing in Article 7 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing a motor vehicle to be driven along the length of road specified in that Article if the vehicle being used:-
- (a) for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (c) in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that length of road or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to that length of road of any sewer, water, gas or electricity apparatus or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (d) for the provision of a universal postal service as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - (e) is a motor cycle accessing the motor cycle car park.
 - (f) an un-ridden cycle;
 - (g) a Class 1, Class 2 or Class 3 vehicle.
9. Save as provided in Article 10 no person shall, except upon the direction of, or with the permission of a police constable in uniform cause any vehicle to proceed along the pedestrianised area of the U20052 Beach Terrace Road from its junction with the C1161 Cliff Parade/Le Strange Terrace westwards for a distance of 40 metres.

10. Nothing in Article 9 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing a vehicle to proceed along the length of road specified in that Article if the vehicle being used:-
 - (a) is for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) is in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (c) is in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that length of road or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to that length of road of any sewer, water, gas or electricity apparatus or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (d) is for the provision of a universal postal service as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
11. This Order shall come into operation on the 2nd day of February 2012 and may be cited as The Norfolk County Council (Hunstanton, Various Roads) (Traffic Regulation) Consolidation Order 2012.
9. The following Orders will become revoked on the date of commencement of this Order as follows:-
 - “The Norfolk County Council (Church Street, Hunstanton)(One-Way Order 1991” – in its entirety;
 - “The Norfolk County Council (Beach Terrace Road and Seagate, Hunstanton)(One-Way) Order 1988” – in its entirety;
 - “The Norfolk County Council (James Street, Hunstanton)(Prohibition of Driving) Order 1984” – in its entirety;
 - “The County of Norfolk (Hunstanton)(One-Way) Order 1961” – in its entirety;
 - “The Norfolk County Council (Hunstanton, Seagate)(Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) Order 2009” – in its entirety;
 - “The Norfolk County Council (Hunstanton, Beach Terrace Road)(Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) Order 2011” – in its entirety;
 - “The Norfolk County Council (Hunstanton, Beach Terrace Road)(Prohibition of Vehicles/Pedestrianisation) Order 2011” – in its entirety;
10. Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision of any previous Order relating to the lengths of road specified in Article 1 of this Order, that provision of this Order shall prevail.
