KIRKLEES COUNCIL (TRAFFIC REGULATION) (NO. 7) ORDER 2011

ST. GEORGE'S SQUARE AND OTHER ROADS, HUDDERSFIELD TOWN CENTRE

The Council of the Borough of Kirklees ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47, 49 and 53 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act"), Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and The Road Traffic (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (Metropolitan Borough of Kirklees) Order 2006 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order which relates to roads in the Huddersfield area of the Kirklees Metropolitan District:-

PART I

1. COMMENCEMENT CITATION & REVOCATION

- 1.1. This Order shall come into operation on the 30th day of January 2012 and may be cited as the Kirklees Council (Traffic Regulation) (No.7) Order 2011
- 1.2. The Orders listed in the Fifth Schedule are hereby revoked to the extent therein stated
- 1.3. The Orders listed in the Sixth Schedule are hereby amended to the extent therein stated

2. INTERPRETATION

- 2.1. Except where the context otherwise requires any reference in this Order to a numbered Article is a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order and any reference to a numbered Schedule is a reference to the Schedule bearing that number in this Order
- 2.2. In this Order except where the context otherwise requires the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-
 - "Bank Holiday" has the same meaning as in the Banking and Financial Dealings Act 1971.

"bus stop" means a stone paviour area contrasting to the running carriageway which conforms with the requirements of paragraph 14 of the Secretary of State for Transport's authorisation of traffic signs and special directions dated 28 April 2011 (reference GT50/062/0001) and, as required by paragraph 15 of that document, using authorised sign F and, where appropriate, the road studs marking authorised by paragraph 13 of that document.

"car club" means a community car club or similar organisation (including any person or organisation acting on behalf of such club or organisation) approved in writing by the Council for the purposes of this Order

"car club parking place" means an area of highway designated as a car club parking place by virtue of Article 5.1 of this Order

"car club vehicle" means a vehicle provided for the use of persons who have paid the relevant membership fee and by means of a real-time or advance booking system has access to the vehicle for a specified period and which displays the relevant identification

"civil enforcement area" has the meaning given by Schedule 8 to the 2004 Act

"civil enforcement officer" has the meaning given by Section 76 of the 2004 Act

"disabled persons badge" has the same meaning as in the 2000 Regulations and the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended.

"disabled person's motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled person's badge and which immediately before or after any period of waiting allowed by virtue of this Order has been or is to be driven by a disabled person or has been or is to be used for carrying disabled persons as passengers.

"driver" in relation to a vehicle left in a parking bay means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking bay

"enforcement authority" means the Council

"goods" has the same meaning as in the Road Traffic Act 1988.

"hackney carriage" has the same meaning as in the Town Police Clauses Act 1847.

"motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act.

"Notice to Owner" means a notice served under regulation 19 of the General Regulations

"owner" in relation to a vehicle means the person by whom the vehicle is kept which in the case of a motor vehicle registered under the Vehicle Excise & Registration Act 1994 is presumed (unless the contrary is provided) to be the person in whose name the vehicle is registered

"parking disc" has the same meaning given by Regulation 8(5) of the 2000 Regulations.

"parking place" means the parts of the road specified in Column 1 of the Third Schedule to this Order authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place.

"penalty charge" has the meaning given by Section 92 of the 2004 Act

"penalty charge notice" has the meaning given by Regulation 8 of the General Regulations

"permitted motor vehicle" means a commercial vehicle.

"postal packets" has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

"relevant identification" means a badge or other means of identification issued and/or approved by the Council indicating that the vehicle on which it is displayed is

part of a fleet of vehicles owned and operated by a car club and valid for use in the car club parking place designated in this Order

"relevant position" in relation to a disabled person's badge has the same meaning as in Regulation 12 of the Disabled Person's (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 and the 2000 Regulations.

"relevant position" in relation to a parking disc means:

- (i) the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the motor vehicle; or
- (ii) where the motor vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the motor vehicle,

so that the period during which waiting began is clearly legible from the outside of the motor vehicle.

"return prohibition period" in relation to Article 4.5 means the period specified in Column 3 of the Third Schedule

"subordinate legislation" has the same meaning as Section 21 of the Interpretation Act 1978

"universal service provider" means the same as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

"the 2000 Regulations" means the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.

"the 2002 Regulations" means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.

"the 2004 Act" means the Traffic Management Act 2004

"the General Regulations" means the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007

PART II

3. PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS ON WAITING/LOADING AND UNLOADING

- 3.1. Save as provided in Articles 3.3, 3.4 and 3.5 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any motor vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of road specified in Columns 1 and 2 of the First Schedule
- 3.2. Save as provided in Article 3.3 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any motor vehicle to wait or load or unload at any time in any of the lengths of road specified in Columns 1 and 2 of the Second Schedule.

- 3.3. Nothing in Articles 3.1 or 3.2 shall prohibit any person from causing or permitting any motor vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road specified in the First or Second Schedule for so long as may be necessary:-
 - 3.3.1. to enable a person to board or alight from the motor vehicle;
 - 3.3.2. to enable the motor vehicle, if it cannot be conveniently used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any wedding or funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of road so specified, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus;
 - 3.3.3. if the motor vehicle is a Mobile Speed Camera Unit or an Automatic Number Plate Recognition Vehicle;
 - 3.3.4. to enable the motor vehicle, if it is in the service of the Post Office or other universal service provider to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets;
 - 3.3.5. to enable the motor vehicle to be used in any of the lengths of road so specified for police, ambulance, fire brigade, local authority or water authority purposes when used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - 3.3.6. if the motor vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the control of the driver, or to such waiting as is necessary to prevent an accident;
 - 3.3.7. for the purpose of loading or unloading the motor vehicle whilst the motor vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal or delivery of furniture to or from any premises fronting, adjoining or abutting any of the said lengths of road provided that notice is given twenty four hours in advance to the Police and their consent obtained;
 - 3.3.8. for a hackney carriage to wait at a hackney carriage stand during the hours of operation of the hackney carriage stand.
- 3.4. Nothing in Articles 3.1 shall prohibit any person from causing or permitting any motor vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road specified in the First or Third Schedules for so long as may be necessary to deliver to or collect from or load or unload goods at any premises fronting on to the said lengths of road provided that no motor vehicle so engaged shall wait for longer than 30 minutes outside the same premises without the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer and provided always that a Police Constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may at any time require the driver of a motor vehicle to move it if it is necessary for the purposes of preventing obstruction.
- 3.5. Nothing in Articles 3.1 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to wait:-
 - 3.5.1. for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from the previous period of waiting by the same motor vehicle in the same road or part of road on the same day) in any of the

lengths of road specified in the First and Third Schedules if the motor vehicle is a disabled person's motor vehicle which displays in the relevant positions:

- (a) a disabled person's badge, and
- (b) a parking disc issued by any local authority in accordance with the provisions of the 2000 Regulations, or a badge having effect under those Regulations as if it were a disabled person's badge and the driver or other person in charge of the motor vehicle marks on the parking disc the time at which the period of waiting began.

PART III

4. PARKING IN LOADING BAY

- 4.1 The part of road specified in Column 1 of the Third Schedule is authorised to be used as a parking place for the parking of permitted motor vehicles in the authorised position on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to the part of road in the said Schedule.
- 4.2 The driver of a motor vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the parking place unless it is a permitted motor vehicle.
- 4.3 Every motor vehicle using the parking place shall wait thereon in the authorised position.
- 4.4 The driver of a motor vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in Column 3 of the Schedule in relation to that parking place.
- 4.5 When a permitted vehicle has left a parking place as specified in Article 4.1 after waiting thereon, the driver shall not, with the return prohibition period specified in Column 3 of the Third Schedule, permit it to wait again upon the parking place.
- 4.6 Save as provided in Article 4.12 the driver of a motor vehicle other than a permitted motor vehicle shall not use the parking place unless authorised to do so by a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer, always provided that no motor vehicle shall use the parking place so as unreasonably to prevent access to premises adjoining the road by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance and provided always that a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may at any time require the driver of the motor vehicle to move it if it is reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing obstruction or in the case of an emergency move or cause to be moved to any place he thinks fit, any motor vehicle left in a parking place.
- 4.7 The driver of a motor vehicle shall stop the engine as soon as the motor vehicle is in position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the motor vehicle in or to depart from, the parking place.
- 4.8 The driver of a motor vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place for any purpose other than when in actual use in connection with the delivery to or collection from or loading or unloading of goods to nearby premises.

- 4.9 A person authorised by the enforcement authority may suspend the use of the parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary
 - 4.9.1 for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - 4.9.2 for the convenience of the occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from a dwellinghouse or office to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
 - 4.9.3 for the convenience of the occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions;
 - 4.9.4 for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus;
 - 4.9.5 and he has made an appropriate Order and/or given notice as may be required by legislation.
- 4.10 A person authorised by the enforcement authority suspending the use of the parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Article 4.9 shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or part thereof the use of which is suspended a traffic sign or notice indicating that waiting by motor vehicles is prohibited.
- 4.11 Save as provided in Articles 4.9 and 4.10 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be left in the parking place or part thereof, as the case may be, during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or part thereof a traffic sign or notice placed in pursuance of Article 4.10.
- 4.12 Nothing in Articles 4.1, 4.2, 4.3, 4.4 and 4.11 shall prohibit any person from causing or permitting any motor vehicle to wait in the parking place for so long as it may be necessary:-
 - 4.12.1 to enable a person to board or alight from the motor vehicle;
 - 4.12.2 to enable the motor vehicle, if it cannot be conveniently used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or any part thereof or the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or near the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus;
 - 4.12.3 to enable the motor vehicle, if it is in the service of the Post Office or other universal service provider to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets;
 - 4.12.4 to enable the motor vehicle to be used for police, ambulance, fire brigade, local authority or water authority purposes when used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

- 4.12.5 if the motor vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstance beyond the control of the driver, or to prevent an accident:
- 4.12.6 to enable the motor vehicle to be used in connection with the removal of furniture from a dwellinghouse or office to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository.
- 4.13 Subject to the proviso hereto, when a motor vehicle is left in the parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in Articles 4.1, 4.2, 4.3, 4.4 and 4.11 a person authorised in that behalf by the enforcement authority may remove the motor vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from the parking place provided that when a motor vehicle is waiting in the parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 4.3, a person authorised in that behalf by the enforcement authority may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.
- 4.14 Any person removing a motor vehicle or altering its position by virtue of Article 4.13 may do so by towing or driving the motor vehicle or such other manner as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position as the case may be.
- 4.15 When a person authorised by the enforcement authority removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a motor vehicle from the parking place by virtue of Article 4.13, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the motor vehicle and its contents.

PART IV

5. PARKING FOR CAR CLUB VEHICLES

- 5.1 The part of road in Huddersfield which is described as a parking place in Column 2 of the Fourth Schedule is hereby designated as a car club parking place.
- 5.2 The car club parking place shall have within its length not more that the maximum number of parking bays specified in Column 3 of the Fourth Schedule.
- 5.3 Subject to the maximum number the number and disposition of such parking bays in the car club parking place shall be determined from time to time by the Council.
- 5.4 The car club parking place may be used subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving of car club vehicles.
- 5.5 The limits of the car club parking place and each parking bay shall be indicated by the appropriate traffic signs or road markings for which special authorisation has been granted by the Department for Transport.
- 5.6 Every car club vehicle left in a parking bay shall so stand so that the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the parking bay.
- 5.7 Where any car club vehicle is standing in a parking bay in contravention of the provisions of Article 5.6 a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

- 5.8 Where a police constable in uniform or Civil Enforcement Officer is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in this Order have been contravened or not complied with in respect of a vehicle left in a parking bay she/he may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle from the parking bay.
- 5.9 Any person removing or altering the position of a vehicle by virtue of Articles 5.7, 5.8 or 5.11 may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as she/he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as she/he may think necessary to enable him/her to remove it or alter its position as the case may be.
- 5.10 When a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking bay she/he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.
- 5.11 A police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer may in the case of emergency move or cause to be moved to any place he thinks fit a vehicle left in a parking bay.
- 5.12 A police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer may suspend the use of a parking bay whenever she/he considers such suspension reasonably necessary always provided that adequate prior notice has been received:
 - 5.12.1 for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
 - 5.12.2 for the purpose of any building engineering or construction operation demolition or excavation adjacent to or in the parking bay
 - 5.12.3 for the purpose of maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the parking bay or the laying erection alteration or repair in or near the parking bay or car club parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Section 4(3) of the Telecommunications Act 1984 or of any traffic sign
 - 5.12.4 for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking bay on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository
 - 5.12.5 on any such occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed
 - 5.12.6 for the convenience of the occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking bay at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions
- 5.13 A police constable in uniform or Civil Enforcement Officer may suspend for not longer than twenty four hours the use of a parking bay whenever she/he considers such suspensions reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
- 5.14 A police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer suspending the use of a parking bay in accordance with the provisions of Articles 5.12 and 5.13 of this

Order shall thereupon place or cause to be placed upon the relevant part of the parking bay traffic cones (as described in the current Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions) or such other traffic cones or lights as are appropriate to indicate that waiting by vehicles is prohibited

- 5.15 Subject to the provision contained herein no person shall cause or permit any car club vehicle to be left in a parking bay during such period as there is a notice traffic cone sign or light placed within the parking bay in pursuance of Article 5.14 of this Order **PROVIDED THAT** nothing in this Article shall apply to:
- 5.15.1 any vehicle being used for Fire Brigade Ambulance or Police purposes or any Local Authority purpose or for any purpose specified in Article 5.12.1
- 5.15.2 any other vehicle if that vehicle is so left with the permission of the person who authorised the suspension of use of the parking bay in accordance with the forgoing provisions of this Article
- 5.16 Unless prior written consent has been granted by the Council no person shall:
 - 5.16.1 use a car club vehicle while it is in a parking bay in connection with the sale or advertisement of anything to persons in or near the parking bay or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services
 - 5.16.2 use any part of a parking bay with any building structure mechanical device or other physical feature therein or any car club vehicle left therein to display advertising material nor to place upon or attach to any car club vehicle in the parking bay any advertising material to induce the public to participate in or frequent any place function or gathering for the purpose of demonstration or entertainment or to buy or hire or otherwise obtain anything or the skill or services of any person and nothing shall be displayed to induce the public to engage for gain in any lottery raffle or competition
- 5.17 Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Order with respect to car club vehicles which are left in a parking bay in accordance with those provisions any other vehicle may wait in a parking bay if:
 - 5.17.1 the vehicle is waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle
 - 5.17.2 the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such other waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident
 - 5.17.3 the vehicle is a vehicle used for fire brigade purposes or an ambulance or a vehicle in the service of a local authority or a vehicle in the service of a police force in such cases being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties
 - 5.17.4 the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction of traffic
 - 5.17.5 the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any of the purposes specified in Article 5.12.2 to 5.12.6 and the use of the vehicle for any such purpose or the amount of time during which the vehicle will remain in the parking bay for that purpose does

not in the opinion of the Council warrant the suspension of use of the parking bay

5.18 A person causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in a parking bay by virtue of Article 5.17 shall take all necessary steps to ensure that the vehicle is left in accordance with Article 5.6

PART V

6. GENERAL

- 6.1 The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any Regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
- 6.2 Any reference in this Order to a Statute or Statutory Instrument shall include reference to any re-enactment or replacement thereof.
- 6.3 For the avoidance of doubt, any reference in this Order to a length of road or a parking place shall be deemed to be a reference to more than one length of road or more than one parking place where the context requires it.
- In this Order where the context requires, the masculine includes the feminine and the neuter and vice versa, the singular includes the plural and vice versa.

PART V

7. CONTRAVENTIONS OF PROVISIONS OF ORDERS

- 7.1 Where a motor vehicle is left in a parking place or in any road or length of road in contravention of any provision of this Order such contravention shall be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of the 2004 Act and any subordinate legislation made under it
- 7.2 The amount of the penalty charge for a parking contravention and where applicable, the charges for the removal, storage and disposal of a vehicle shall be as set from time to time by the enforcement authority in accordance with the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (Guidelines on Levels of Charges) (England) Order 2007 or any re-enactment or replacement thereof and published by it
