THE LEICESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, BRAUNSTONE (AREA 3), DISTRICT OF BLABY) CONSOLIDATION AND AMENDMENT ORDER 2009

The Leicestershire County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1) and (2) 2(1) to (3) 4(2) 32 and 35 and Part IV of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

- This Order shall come into force on the Sixth day of April 2009 and may be cited as "The Leicestershire County Council (Various Roads, Braunstone (Area 3) District of Blaby) Consolidation and Amendment Order 2009".
- The exemptions contained in this Order as set out in column 1 of Schedule 1 shall hereafter be referred to by reference to the code letters given in column 2 of Schedule 1.
- 3. The Orders specified in Schedule 2 are hereby revoked and re-enacted in Schedule 3 without alteration to the restrictions imposed by those Orders.
- 4. The Order specified in Schedule 4 is hereby revoked to the extent indicated in the Schedule of that Order and re-enacted without alteration to the provisions imposed by the Order.
- 5. (1) In this Order -

"authorised cab rank" means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.2 in Schedule 6 of The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act;

"bus" means any Public Service Vehicle or bus operating a local stage carriage service as defined in the Transport Act 1985;

"bus stop area" means any area of carriageway on the sides of roads specified in this Order which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with either diagram 1025.2 or diagram 1025.3 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"C.E.O." mean a duly authorised Civil Enforcement Officer;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(Amendment) Regulations 1991; or the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000 and the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons)(England) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons)(England and Wales)(Amendment)
Regulations 1991;

"disabled persons designated parking bay" means the part of the carriageway or side of road marked in accordance with Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 by the marking shown in diagram 1028.3 (or permitted variant thereof) and with a white broken line bounding the words "DISABLED" marked outside the bay;

"hackney carriage" has the same meaning as in section 38(1) of the Vehicles (Excise) Act 1971;

"heavy commercial vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 138 of the Act;

"market day" means any day of the week approved and authorised under a market charter for the holding of a market or such other bona fide licensed market;

"market trader" means any person duly authorised an appropriate body to trade from an authorised market stall or stand or location as from time to time may be specified by the appropriate body for the purposes of his or her trading; "motor vehicle" means any vehicle as defined by the Construction and Use Regulations 1986 (as amended) which is mechanically propelled except where otherwise provided;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No.4631:1970) but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins, or a blue badge under the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000;

"permitted parking place" means any part of a road hereby authorised by the Council for use as a parking place being a place where vehicles may wait and is indicated as such by signs and road markings;

"permit" means a written warrant issued by or on behalf of Leicestershire County Council allowing the holder to wait in a specified location;

"permit holder" means a vehicle which displays a valid permit;

"residents' parking permit holder / residents' permit holder" means a vehicle which displays a valid permit issued to a resident of the specified location;

"road / roads" means the carriageway the footway and any verges being the full width of the highway extent from one boundary to another;

"school entrance" means any area of carriageway on the side of the road where vehicles are not permitted to stop and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1027.1 of the 2002 Regulations;

"vehicle" means any Motor Vehicle as defined in this Order and any other vehicle (capable of the carriage of persons or goods) except cycles unless otherwise provided;

"4.00 p.m. to 10.00 a.m. the following morning" wherever referred to in this Order means that period of time commencing at 4.00 p.m. in the afternoon of any day and terminating at 10.00 a.m. on the morning of the next day;

"The Act" means The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, where in accordance with the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1991 and the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000
 - (i) the Badge is displayed on the vehicle's dashboard or fascia panel with the front of the Badge facing forward with the details thereon clearly visible from an external position, or
 - (ii) where the vehicle has no dashboard or fascia panel or windscreen where the Badge may be exhibited or displayed it shall be exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle and

in either case a parking disc is exhibited in the relevant position prescribed in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1991 or the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000.

- 6. The following articles shall relate to the re-enacted provisions of Schedule 3 and are amended by the insertion of a reference to a "C.E.O." and by virtue of Section 32 and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 where appropriate to create permitted parking places.
 - 6.1 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any day, in the permitted parking place specified in Schedule 3 Part 1 to this Order:-
 - (a) For a period longer than 2 hours, or
 - (b) If a period of less than 1 hour has elapsed since the last period of waiting by that vehicle on the same permitted parking place;
 - 6.2 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., or in accordance

with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle on the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 Part 2 to this Order.

- 6.3 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., or in accordance with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day, on the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 Part 3 to this Order.
- 6.4 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer a parking attendant, or a C.E.O., or in accordance with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any heavy commercial vehicle to wait at any time on the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 Part 4 to this Order.
- No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., or in accordance with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday, on the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 Part 5 to this Order.
- 6.6 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., or in accordance with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day other than on a Saturday or a Sunday, on the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 Part 6 to this Order.
- 6.7 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., or in accordance with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. on any day other than a Saturday or Sunday, on the side of road designated as a school entrance as specified in Schedule 3 Part 7 to this Order.
- 7. Except where otherwise stated, a reference in this order to a numbered Article or Schedule is reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

NARBOROUGH ROAD SOUTH (EAST SERVICE ROAD), BRAUNSTONE

- (i) Both sides (including both carriageways) from a point 15 metres north-east of its junction with Hazel Drive in a generally south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 250 metres up to and including the new link road to Narborough Road South.
- (ii) The east side from its junction with Narborough Road South to Car Park and Superstore to its junction with Fosse Park Avenue.
- (iii) The north-west side from its junction with Fosse Park Avenue up to the new link road with Narborough Road South include the entry into Asda Superstore car park to the extent of the highway boundary for a distance of approximately 190 metres.

- (ii) The east side from its junction with Narborough Road South Service Road East in a generally southerly direction to its junction with Soar Valley Way (A563).

NARBOROUGH ROAD SOUTH (EAST SERVICE ROAD), BRAUNSTONE

- (i) Both sides (including both carriageways) from 15 metres north-east of its junction with Hazel Drive in a generally south-westerly direction for approximately 250 metres up to and including the new link road to Narborough Road South.
- (ii) The east side from its junction with Narborough Road South to Car Park and Superstore to its junction with Fosse Park Avenue.
- (iii) The north-west side from its junction with Fosse Park Avenue to its junction with the link road to Narborough Road South including the entry into Asda Superstore car park to the extent of the highway boundary for a distance of approximately 190 metres.

NARBOROUGH ROAD SOUTH, BRAUNSTONE

The east & south-west side traffic island to the south-west of the roundabout at Fosse Park Avenue and Narborough Road South for its entire length.

NARBOROUGH ROAD SOUTH (WEST SERVICE ROAD), BRAUNSTONE

The north-west side from its junction with The Crossway in a north-easterly direction to a point 26 metres south of its junction with Braunstone Lane.

RAVENHUSRT ROAD, BRAUNSTONE TOWN

- (i) The west side from a point 11 metres north-west of its junction with Stonehurst Road to a point 7.5 metres south-east of its junction with Stonehurst Road.
- (ii) The west side from a point 14.5 metres north-west of its junction with Fernhurst Road to a point 9.5 metres south-east of its junction with Fernhurst Road.
- (iii) The west side from a point 11 metres north-west of its junction with Lyndale Road to a point 11 metres south-east of its junction with Lyndale Road.

STONEHURST ROAD, BRAUNSTONE

- (i) The north side from its junction with Ravenhurst Road in a westerly direction for a distance of 11 metres.
- (ii) The south side from its junction with Ravenhurst Road in a westerly direction for a distance of 13 metres.

THE CROSSWAY, BRAUNSTONE

The north-east side from its junction with Narborough Road South (west Service Road) in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 17 metres.

OSIERS OFFICE PARK, BRAUNSTONE

- (i) The north-west side from the eastern kerbline of the slip road from A563 Lubbesthorpe Way Roundabout to A5460 in a north-east direction for a distance of 25 metres
- (ii) The north-west side from a point 55 metres from the eastern kerbline of the slip road from A563 Lubbesthorpe Way Roundabout to A5460 in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 25 metres
- (iii) The north-west side from a point 90 metres from the eastern kerbline of the slip road from A563 Lubbesthorpe Way Roundabout to A5460 in a north-east direction for a distance of 3 metres.
- (iv) The south-east side from the eastern kerbline of the slip road from A563 Lubbesthorpe Way Roundabout to A5460 in a north-east direction for its entire length approximately 93 metres.
- (v) Both sides from the northern kerbline of Osiers Business Park access road in a north westerly direction to the extent of the highway boundary.
- (vi) Both sides from the southern kerbline of the Osiers Business Park access road in a south easterly direction for the extent of the highway boundary (access to the Hillton Hotel).

HAZEL DRIVE, BRAUNSTONE

The west side from the southern kerbline of Kingsway - (Near house numbers 11 to 21 Kingway) in a southerly direction for a distance of 177 metres.

KINGSWAY (NEAR 2 TO 22 KINGSWAY), BRAUNSTONE

Both sides from its junction with Hazel Drive in an easterly direction for its entire length including the turning head.

NARBOROUGH ROAD SOUTH (EAST SERVICE ROAD), BRAUNSTONE

Both sides from a point 10.5 metres north of its junction with Kingsway - (near house numbers 11 to 21 Kingsway) in a southerly direction for a distance of 192 metres.
