THE LEICESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, ANSTEY, CROPSTON, NEWTOWN LINFORD AND WOODHOUSE EAVES (AREA 3), DISTRICT OF CHARNWOOD) CONSOLIDATION AND AMENDMENT ORDER 2009

The Leicestershire County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1) and (2) 2(1) to (3) 4(2) 32 and 35 and Part IV of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

- This Order shall come into force on the Thirtieth day of March 2009 and may be cited as "The Leicestershire County Council (Various Roads, Anstey, Cropston, Newtown Linford and Woodhouse Eaves (Area 3), District of Charnwood) Consolidation and Amendment Order 2009".
- 2. The exemptions contained in this Order as set out in column 1 of Schedule 1 shall hereafter be referred to by reference to the code letters given in column 2 of Schedule 1.
- 3. The Orders specified in Schedule 2 are hereby revoked and re-enacted in Schedule 3 without alteration to the restrictions imposed by those Orders.
- 4. The Order specified in Schedule 4 is hereby revoked to the extent indicated in the Schedule of that Order and re-enacted without alteration to the provisions imposed by the Order.
- 5. (1) In this Order -

"authorised cab rank" means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.2 in Schedule 6 of The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act;

"bus" means any Public Service Vehicle or bus operating a local stage carriage service as defined in the Transport Act 1985;

"bus stop area" means any area of carriageway on the sides of roads specified in this Order which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with either diagram 1025.2 or diagram 1025.3 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002:

"C.E.O." mean a duly authorised Civil Enforcement Officer;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1991; or the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 and the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000:

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons)(England and Wales)(Amendment)
Regulations 1991;

"disabled persons designated parking bay" means the part of the carriageway or side of road marked in accordance with Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 by the marking shown in diagram 1028.3 (or permitted variant thereof) and with a white broken line bounding the words "DISABLED" marked outside the bay;

"hackney carriage" has the same meaning as in section 38(1) of the Vehicles (Excise) Act 1971;

"heavy commercial vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 138 of the Act;

"market day" means any day of the week approved and authorised under a market charter for the holding of a market or such other bona fide licensed market;

"market trader" means any person duly authorised an appropriate body to trade from an authorised market stall or stand or location as from time to time may be specified by the appropriate body for the purposes of his or her trading; "motor vehicle" means any vehicle as defined by the Construction and Use Regulations 1986 (as amended) which is mechanically propelled except where otherwise provided:

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No.4631:1970) but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins, or a blue badge under the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000;

"permitted parking place" means any part of a road hereby authorised by the Council for use as a parking place being a place where vehicles may wait and is indicated as such by signs and road markings;

"road / roads" means the carriageway the footway and any verges being the full width of the highway extent from one boundary to another;

"school entrance" means any area of carriageway on the side of the road where vehicles are not permitted to stop and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1027.1 of the 2002 Regulations;

"vehicle" means any Motor Vehicle as defined in this Order and any other vehicle (capable of the carriage of persons or goods) except cycles unless otherwise provided;

"4.00 p.m. to 10.00 a.m. the following morning" wherever referred to in this Order means that period of time commencing at 4.00 p.m. in the afternoon of any day and terminating at 10.00 a.m. on the morning of the next day;

"The Act" means The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, where in accordance with the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1991 and the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000

- the Badge is displayed on the vehicle's dashboard or fascia panel with the front of the Badge facing forward with the details thereon clearly visible from an external position, or
- (ii) where the vehicle has no dashboard or fascia panel or windscreen where the Badge may be exhibited or displayed it shall be exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle and

in either case a parking disc is exhibited in the relevant position prescribed in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1991 or the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000.

- 6. The following articles shall relate to the re-enacted provisions of Schedule 3 and are amended by the insertion of a reference to a "C.E.O." and by virtue of Section 32 and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 where appropriate to create permitted parking places.
 - No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day, in the permitted parking place specified in Schedule 3 Part 1 to this Order:-
 - (a) For a period longer than 30 minutes, or
 - (b) If a period of less than 1 hour has elapsed since the last period of waiting by that vehicle on the same permitted parking place
 - 6.2 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 7.00 p.m. on any day other than on a Sunday, in the permitted parking place specified in Schedule 3 Part 2 to this Order:-
 - (a) For a period longer than 1 hour, or
 - (b) If a period of less than 1 hour has elapsed since the last period of waiting by that vehicle on the same permitted parking place

- 6.3 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday, in the permitted parking place specified in Schedule 3 Part 3 to this Order, except for disabled persons vehicle.
- 6.4 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., or in accordance with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day, on the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 Part 4 to this Order.
- No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., or in accordance with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday, on the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 Part 5 to this Order.
- 6.6 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., or in accordance with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. on any day other than a Saturday or Sunday, on the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 Part 6 to this Order.
- 7. Except where otherwise stated, a reference in this order to a numbered Article or Schedule is reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

- (ii) The west side from its junction with Stadon Road to the building line with No. 2, approximately 42 metres north.

HOLLOW ROAD, ANSTEY

Both sides from its junction with Bradgate Road for a distance of approximately 8.7 metres north.

LATIMER STREET, ANSTEY

- (i) The east side from its junction with Leicester Road to its southern extremity.
- (ii) The west side from a point approximately 134.2 metres south of its junction with Leicester Road and its southern extremity, including the turning head.
- (iii) The west side from its junction with Leicester Road southwards to a point 13 metres north of the northern boundary of house (building line) No. 1, a distance of approximately 27 metres.

LEICESTER ROAD, ANSTEY

Both sides from its junction with The Nook in a south-easterly direction to a point 118 metres south-east of the southern boundary of No 22 Leicester Road, Anstey.

LEICESTER ROAD (THE SPUR), ANSTEY

- (ii) Both sides from a point approximately 55 metres south of its junction with Leicester Road to its southern extremity, including the turning head.

- (v) The south-west side from a point 169 metres north-west of the centreline of its junction with Groby Lane/Bradgate Road in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 86 metres.
- (vi) The south-west side from a point 61 metres south-east of the centreline of its junction with Markfield Lane in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 129 metres.
- (vii) The south-west side from its junction with Beacon Road in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 33 metres.

MAPLEWELL ROAD, WOODHOUSE EAVES

The north-west side from its junction with Main Street in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 163 metres.

MARKFIELD LANE, NEWTOWN LINFORD

- The north side from its junction with Main Street in a westerly direction for a distance of 178 metres.
- (ii) The south side from its junction with Main Street in a westerly direction for a distance of 188 metres.

MEADOW ROAD, WOODHOUSE EAVES

- (i) The north-west side from its junction with Main Street in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 38 metres.
- (ii) The north-west side from a point 58.5 metres north-east of its junction with Main Street in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 63 metres.
- (iii) The south-east side from its junction with Church Hill in a north easterly direction for a distance of 6 metres.

NED LUDD CLOSE, ANSTEY

Both sides from a point 56 metres west of the centre line of Station Road in an easterly direction to its junction with Cropston Road.
