## THE LEICESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, BARROW UPON SOAR, BURTON ON THE WOLDS, QUORN AND WYMESWOLD (AREA 4), DISTRICT OF CHARNWOOD) CONSOLIDATION AND AMENDMENT ORDER 2009

The Leicestershire County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1) and (2) 2(1) to (3) 4(2) 32 and 35 and Part IV of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

- This Order shall come into force on the Thirtieth day of March 2009 and may be cited as "The Leicestershire County Council (Various Roads, Barrow Upon Soar, Burton on the Wolds, Quorn and Wymeswold (Area 4) District of Charnwood) Consolidation and Amendment Order 2009".
- The exemptions contained in this Order as set out in column 1 of Schedule 1 shall hereafter be referred to by reference to the code letters given in column 2 of Schedule 1.
- 3. The Orders specified in Schedule 2 are hereby revoked and re-enacted in Schedule 3 without alteration to the restrictions imposed by those Orders.
- 4. The Order specified in Schedule 4 is hereby revoked to the extent indicated in the Schedule of that Order and re-enacted without alteration to the provisions imposed by the Order.
- 5. (1) In this Order -

"authorised cab rank" means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.2 in Schedule 6 of The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act;

"bus" means any Public Service Vehicle or bus operating a local stage carriage service as defined in the Transport Act 1985;

"bus stop area" means any area of carriageway on the sides of roads specified in this Order which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with either diagram 1025.2 or diagram 1025.3 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"C.E.O." mean a duly authorised Civil Enforcement Officer;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(Amendment) Regulations 1991; or the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000 and the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons)(England) Regulations 2000:

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons)(England and Wales)(Amendment)
Regulations 1991;

"disabled persons designated parking bay" means the part of the carriageway or side of road marked in accordance with Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 by the marking shown in diagram 1028.3 (or permitted variant thereof) and with a white broken line bounding the words "DISABLED" marked outside the bay;

"hackney carriage" has the same meaning as in section 38(1) of the Vehicles (Excise) Act 1971;

"heavy commercial vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 138 of the Act;

"market day" means any day of the week approved and authorised under a market charter for the holding of a market or such other bona fide licensed market;

"market trader" means any person duly authorised an appropriate body to trade from an authorised market stall or stand or location as from time to time may be specified by the appropriate body for the purposes of his or her trading; "motor vehicle" means any vehicle as defined by the Construction and Use Regulations 1986 (as amended) which is mechanically propelled except where otherwise provided;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No.4631:1970) but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins, or a blue badge under the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000;

"permitted parking place" means any part of a road hereby authorised by the Council for use as a parking place being a place where vehicles may wait and is indicated as such by signs and road markings;

"road / roads" means the carriageway the footway and any verges being the full width of the highway extent from one boundary to another;

"school entrance" means any area of carriageway on the side of the road where vehicles are not permitted to stop and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1027.1 of the 2002 Regulations;

"vehicle" means any Motor Vehicle as defined in this Order and any other vehicle (capable of the carriage of persons or goods) except cycles unless otherwise provided;

"4.00 p.m. to 10.00 a.m. the following morning" wherever referred to in this Order means that period of time commencing at 4.00 p.m. in the afternoon of any day and terminating at 10.00 a.m. on the morning of the next day;

"The Act" means The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, where in accordance with the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1991 and the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000

- the Badge is displayed on the vehicle's dashboard or fascia panel with the front of the Badge facing forward with the details thereon clearly visible from an external position, or
- (ii) where the vehicle has no dashboard or fascia panel or windscreen where the Badge may be exhibited or displayed it shall be exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle and

in either case a parking disc is exhibited in the relevant position prescribed in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1991 or the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000.

- 6. The following articles shall relate to the re-enacted provisions of Schedule 3 and are amended by the insertion of a reference to a "C.E.O." and by virtue of Section 32 and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 where appropriate to create permitted parking places
- 6.1 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday, in the permitted parking place specified in Schedule 3 Part 1 to this Order:-
  - (a) For a period longer than 40 minutes, or
  - (b) If a period of less than 20 minutes has elapsed since the last period of waiting by that vehicle on the same permitted parking place
- 6.2 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time, on any day, on the sides of roads specified in Schedule 3 Part 2 to this Order, except for any ambulance.
- 6.3 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday, in the permitted parking place specified in Schedule 3 Part 3 to this Order, except for disabled persons vehicle.

- 6.4 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., or in accordance with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day, on the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 Part 4 to this Order.
- 6.5 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., or in accordance with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday, on the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 Part 5 to this Order.
- 6.6 No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, a community support officer, a parking attendant or a C.E.O., or in accordance with the exemption provisions, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. on any day other than a Saturday or Sunday, on the side of road designated as a school entrance as specified in Schedule 3 Part 6 to this Order.
- 7. Except where otherwise stated, a reference in this order to a numbered Article or Schedule is reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

- (i) The east side from its junction with Leicester Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 13.7 metres.
- (ii) The west side from its junction with Leicester Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 22.9 metres.

#### HIGH STREET, BARROW UPON SOAR

(i) Both sides from the roundabout at its junction with Bridge Street/South Street for a distance of 52 metres in a northerly direction.

- (ii) Both sides from its junction with North Street in a southerly direction to the northern boundary of No. 64 High Street.
- (iii) The east side from a point 52 metres north of its junction with Bridge Street to a point 7 metres north of the southern boundary of No. 28A High Street.
- (iv) The east side from the projected northern building line of No. 60 High Street in a northerly direction to the northern boundary of No. 64 High Street.
- (v) The west side from the projected northeast building line of No. 7 High Street to the projected southern building line of No. 31 High Street.
- (vi) The west side from a point 30 metres south-west of the south kerb line of Cotes Road in a northerly direction to the northern boundary of No. 64 High Street.

#### HIGH STREET/LEICESTER ROAD, BARROW UPON SOAR

Both sides from a point on High Street 36.6 metres north-west of its junction with Church Lane to a point 14 metres north-west of the south eastern boundary (building line) of number 10 Leicester Road.

#### **HUSTON CLOSE, BARROW UPON SOAR**

- (i) The north-east side (south eastern spur) from its junction with Huston Close (south west / north east arm) in a south easterly direction to a point directly in line with the extension (in a north-easterly direction) of the northwest facing wall of number 5 Huston Close, a distance of approximately 10.5 metres.
- (ii) The north-west side from its junction with Sileby Road in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 16.8 metres.
- (iii) The south-east side from its junction with Sileby Road in a south-westerly direction to the junction centreline with the south-easterly spur of Huston Close.

#### LEICESTER ROAD, QUORN

- (i) The north-east side from a point 61 metres north-west of its junction with Wood Lane to a point 43 metres south-east of that junction.
- (ii) The north-east side from a point 1 metres south-east of the boundary of No. 10 in a south-easterly direction to a point 13 metres south-east of the north western boundary of No. 24.
- (iii) The north-east side from the boundary of Nos. 32/34 Leicester Road in a south easterly direction to a point 55 metres south-east of its junction with School Lane.

- (iv) The south-west side from a point 41 metres south-east of its junction with School Lane to a point 43 metres south-east of its junction with Wood Lane.
- (v) The south-west side from a point 14 metres north-west of the south eastern boundary (building line) of No. 10 in a south-easterly direction to a point 41 metres south-east of its junction with School Lane.

### LINK ROAD FROM A46 FOSSE WAY TO B676 MELTON ROAD, BURTON ON THE WOLDS

Both sides from its junction with Melton Road in a north easterly direction for a distance of 17 metres.

#### LOUGHBOROUGH ROAD, BURTON ON THE WOLDS

Both sides from its junction with Barrow Road for a distance of 64 metres in a westerly direction.

#### LOUGHBOROUGH ROAD, QUORN

The north-east side from a point 70 metres north-west of its junction with Barrow Road in a south easterly direction to a point 17.5 metres south-east of that junction.

#### MEETING STREET, QUORN

- (i) The north-west side from its junction with High Street in a south westerly direction for a distance of 4 metres.
- (ii) The north-west side from a point 30 metres south-west of its junction with High Street in a south westerly direction for a distance of 44 metres.
- (iii) The south-east side from its junction with Leicester Road, route A6, in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 130.8 metres.

#### MELTON ROAD, BURTON ON THE WOLDS

- (i) Both sides from a point 22 metres south-east of its junction with Paudy Lane to a point 23 metres north-west of its junction with Link Road From A46 Fosse Way To B676 Melton Road.
- (ii) Both sides from its junction with Seymour Road in an easterly direction for a distance of 96 metres.

#### MELTON ROAD, BARROW UPON SOAR

- (i) The north-west side from its junction with Grove Lane in a north-easterly direction to a point 7 metres north-east of the boundary of Nos. 93/95 Melton Road.
- (ii) The north-west side from its junction with South Street for a distance of 118 metres in a north-easterly direction.
- (iii) The north-west side from a point 14 metres north-east of the boundary of Nos. 13/15 to a point 17 metres north-east of the projected eastern kerb line of Beveridge Street.
