The Leicestershire County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and in accordance with The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

- This Order shall come into force on the 3rd day of May 2006 and may be cited as "The Leicestershire County Council (Various Roads, South Wigston (Area 1), District of Oadby and Wigston, Consolidation) Order 2006".
- The Orders specified in the Schedule are hereby revoked to the extent of the individual provisions and re-enacted without alternation to the restrictions imposed by those Orders
- 3. Where any Order specified in the Schedule contains or refers to restrictions which are not referred to in this Order, those provisions and / or restrictions shall remain in force by virtue of the original Order.
- 4. Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article is reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order.

From a point 4.5 metres east of its junction with Saffron Road, a point in line with the main west building line of No. 1 Marstown Avenue in an easterly direction to a point 12 metres east of the rear boundary of No. 45

Marstown Avenue and the rear boundary of

No. 15 Kenilworth Road.

SAFFRON ROAD (east side)

From a point 9 metres north of the centre line of Marstown Avenue adjacent to the boundary between No. 50 Saffron Road and No. 2 Marstown Avenue in a northerly direction to a point 5.5 metres north of the boundary between

Nos. 56 and 58 Saffron Road.

SAFFRON ROAD (east side)

From a point 8 metres south of the centre line of Marstown Avenue being a point 5 metres north of the boundary between No. 48 Saffron Road and No. 1 Marstown Avenue in a southerly direction to a point 3 metres south of the boundary between Nos. 40 and 42 Saffron Road.

EXEMPTIONS

For vehicles to allow people to board or alight.

For vehicles used in connection with:-

- building, industrial or demolition operations;
- (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

- (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of roads or:
- (iv) the laying, erection, alternation or repair on, or in land adjacent to the said sides of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984

For vehicles to be used in the service of a local authority or a water undertaker in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

For vehicles to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953 by any universal service provider.

For vehicles to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said sides of roads for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral.

For vehicles to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

For goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle on the sides of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order at any time on any day.

For vehicles:

- (a) to wait upon an authorised parking place, or
- (b) being a hackney carriage, to wait upon an authorised cab rank.

For a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the length and side of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length or on the same side of road on the same day).

Where the person in control of the vehicle is directed or given permission to stop by a police constable in uniform or by a traffic warden.
