# The City Council of Liverpool (Special Parking Area) (Traffic Order Amendments) Order, 2002

The Council of the City of Liverpool in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 19, 32, 25, 45, 46, 46A, 49 and 51 of The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to that Act and by virtue of The Road Traffic (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (City of Liverpool) Order 2002 (Statutory Instrument 2002 N°1353) made by the Secretary of State for Transport, Local Government and the Regions pursuant to Section 73 and Schedule 3 of the Road Traffic Act 1991, and all other enabling powers after consultation with the Chief Constable of Merseyside Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order: -

- This Order shall come into operation on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 2002 and may be cited as The City Council of Liverpool (Special Parking Area) (Traffic Order Amendments) Order 2002.
- The Orders specified in **Schedule 1** to this Order are varied as follows:

### (a) **Definitions**: -

(i) The following expressions and the meanings assigned to them are inserted in appropriate alphabetical order in that Article in the Orders which deals with the meanings of expressions used in the Orders:- ""Parking Attendant" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the City of Liverpool under **Section 63A** of the Act of 1984 to supervise and enforce the restrictions imposed by this Order.

"Penalty Charge" and "Reduced Penalty Charge" means a charge set by the City of Liverpool under the provisions of Section 74 of The Road Traffic Act 1991 in accordance with guidance given by the Secretary of State for Transport which is to be paid in the manner described in the penalty charge notice within 28 days of the date of the notice or 14 days of the date of the notice in the case of a reduced penalty charge.

"Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued by a parking attendant pursuant to the provisions of Section 66 of The Road Traffic Act 1991."

- (ii) The expression "**Traffic Warden**" in that Article in the Orders which deals with the meanings of expressions used in the Orders is deleted.
- (iii) Each reference to "Traffic Warden" in the Orders is replaced by "Parking Attendant".

### (b) Articles: -

The following Articles are inserted as the final Articles of each of the Orders specified in **Schedule 1**: -

- "(1) If a vehicle is left at any time in contravention of a provision of this Order a penalty charge shall be payable.
- (2) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge is payable, a penalty charge notice showing the information required by **Section 66** of **The Road Traffic Act 1991** may then be issued by a parking attendant in accordance with the requirements of **Section 66** of that Act."

Where a provision of this Order conflicts with a provision of any of the Orders specified in **Schedule 1** to this Order, that provision of this Order shall prevail.

#### Schedule 1 Orders To Be Varied

All Traffic Regulation Orders made by the Road Traffic Authority for the City of Liverpool prior to the date hereof which give effect to parking controls, waiting, or loading or unloading restrictions in car parks or roads within the area of the City of Liverpool and all other Orders made prior to the date hereof having any such effect.
