The City Council of Liverpool (Strand Street) (Revocation, Prohibition Of "U"-Turn, Prohibition Of Right Turn And Reserved Bus Lane) Order, 2008

The City Council of Liverpool (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 4(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 to The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order:-

Section One - Commencement, Citation, Interpretations and General Articles

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the 10th day of March 2008 and may be cited as: The City Council of Liverpool (Strand Street) (Revocation, Prohibition Of "U"-Turn, Prohibition Of Right Turn And Reserved Bus Lane) Order, 2008.
- 2. (1) In this Order, save as otherwise defined within this Order, each and every expression shall have the meaning assigned to it by **The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002**: -
- "coach" means a public service vehicle but excluding such a vehicle when it is being used to operate a local service as defined by **The Transport Act 1985**;
- "hackney carriage" means a vehicle standing or plying for hire and holding a licence for the same under The Town Police Clauses Act, 1847.
- "pedal cycle" means a pedal bicycle or pedal tricycle, not being in either case a motor vehicle;
- "postal operator" means a person who provides the service of conveying postal packets from one place to another by post or any of the incidental services of receiving, collecting, sorting and delivering such packets.
- "postal packet" means a letter, parcel, packet or other article transmissible by post.
- "public service vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a tram car) which (a) being a vehicle adapted to carry more than eight passengers, is being used for carrying passengers for hire or reward; or (b) being a vehicle not so adapted, is being used for carrying passengers for hire or reward at separate fares in the course of a business of carrying passengers;
- "reserved bus lane" means any part of the carriageway of the sides of lengths of road referred to in the Schedule this part of the Order, which is bounded by the kerbline of the


Section Six - Contravention Of The Order

8. Any person who contravenes Article 5, Article 6 or Article 7 of this Order, or who uses a vehicle, or causes or permits a vehicle to be used in contravention of Article 5, Article 6 or Article 7 of this Order, shall be guilty of an offence.

- 2. (2) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- 3. The prohibition and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

Section Two – The Revocation Of An Existing Traffic Regulation Order Which Is Necessary To Accommodate This Order

4. The City Council of Liverpool (Strand Street) (Prohibition Of "U"-Turn, Prohibition of Right Turn And Reserved Bus Lane) Order, 2005, is hereby revoked insofar as it relates to: - (a) the right turn ban from the north west bound carriageway of The Strand into Canning Place; and (b) the reserved bus lane on Strand Street (northwest bound carriageway) (within the existing right turning facility) between the central reservation kerb line and Traffic Signs diagram 1049 - from a point 4 metres northwest from its junction with Red Cross Street continuing in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 70 metres.

Section Three - The Prohibition Of "U"-Turn To This Order

5. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle proceeding along Strand Street in a northwest direction to make a "U"-turn through the gap within the central reservation at its junction with James Street.

<u>Section Four - The Prohibition Of Right Turn To This Order</u>

6. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle other than a local public service vehicle proceeding in the north westerly direction on Strand Street to make a right turn into Canning Place.

Section Five - The Reserved Bus Lanc To This Order

7. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle other than a public service vehicle, coach, pedal cycle, hackney carriage, a vehicle being used by the Police, Ambulance, Fire Service or Statutory Services, Postal Operator or Local Authority in pursuance with their essential duties to enter, proceed or wait in the reserved bus lanes specified in Column One of the Schedule to this Order, to the extent specified in Column Two of the said Schedule, other than for the purposes of crossing it, during the hours and on the days of operation specified in Column Three of the said Schedule.
