THE CITY COUNCIL OF LIVERPOOL

(ST. MICHAEL'S ROAD, AIGBURTH) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER, 1969

The City Council of Liverpool, in exercise of its powers under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

- Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of St. Michael's Road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in either of the lengths of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary—
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any wedding, funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas or water or electricity or any telegraphic line, as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878;
 - (d) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road;
 - (e) to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

- 3. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967 or by or under any other enactment.
- 4. The Interpretation Act, 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 5 This Order shall come into operation on the 14th day of July, 1969, and may be cited as "The City Council of Liverpool (St. Michael's Road, Aighurth) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1969."

SCHEDULE

Lengths of St. Michael's Road in the City of Liverpool

1. north west side from its junction with Aigburth Road to its junction with Bryanston Road

2. south east side from its junction with Aighurth Road in a south westerly direction for a distance of 50 feet.
