## The City Council Of Liverpool (Windsor Street And Allerton Road) (Disabled Persons Parking Places) Order, 2005

The City Council of Liverpool (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 32(1) and 35(1) to The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June 2005 and may be cited as: The City Council Of Liverpool (Windsor Street And Allerton Road) (Disabled Persons Parking Places) Order, 2005.
- 2. (1) In this Order:-
- "disabled person" means a disabled person of a description prescribed by Regulation 2(1) of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations, 2000.
- "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in Regulation 2(1) of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations, 2000.
- "disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle lawfully displaying in a conspicuous position a disabled person's badge and which is a vehicle, which, immediately before or after any period of waiting allowed by virtue of a provision of a kind required by The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 to be included in an Order under the 1984 Act, has been or is to be driven by a disabled person or, as the case maybe, has been or is to be used for carrying disabled persons as passengers.
- "driver" in relation to a vehicle left at or waiting in a Parking Place means the person who was: (a) driving the vehicle at the time it was left at; (b) is waiting at the Parking Place; or (c) by legal presumption may be regarded as the driver at such time.
- "parking attendant" means a person authorized by or on behalf of the City of Liverpool under Section 63A of the Act of 1984 to supervise and enforce the restrictions imposed by this Order.
- "parking place" means any part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place.
- "penalty charge" and "reduced penalty charge" means a charge set by the City of Liverpool under the provisions of Section 74 of The Road Traffic Act 1991 in accordance with guidance given by the Secretary of State for Transport which is to be paid in the manner described in the penalty charge notice within 28 days of the date of the notice or 14 days of the date of the notice in the case of a reduced penalty charge.
- "penalty charge notice" means a notice issued by a parking attendant pursuant to the provisions of Section 66 of The Road Traffic Act 1991.
- 2. (2) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered **Article** or **Schedule** is a reference to the **Article** or **Schedule** bearing that number in this Order.
- 3. (1) Each part of the roads specified in Column One of the Schedule to this Order: (a) is authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such classes of vehicles, in such positions and on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that part of road in the said Schedule; and (b) is designated as a parking place for disabled persons' vehicles and may be used by any person who holds a disabled driver's or passenger's badge issued in accordance with Regulation 2(1) of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations, 2000.

- 3.(2) Nothing in **paragraph** (1) of this **Article** shall restrict the power of the Council, for preventing obstruction of the streets, by Order on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination, or where the streets are throughed or liable to be obstructed, to close any parking place.
- 4. Where in the **Schedule** to this Order, a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place: (a) unless it is of the specified class; or (b) in a position other than specified.

## Schedule

## Area of Highway designated as Disabled Persons' Parking Places

Each area described below in Column One being an area forming part of the carriageway of a specified highway, is a Designated Disabled Persons' Parking Place for the parking of a Disabled Person's Vehicle, displaying a Disabled Persons Badge by a Disabled Person

All that part of the western side of Allerton Road which is bounded on the west by so much of the edge of carriageway that extends from its junction with Rose Lane in a northerly direction for a distance of 12 metres. - 5. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place: (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to ant premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons or so as to be a nuisance; or (b) when for preventing obstruction of the streets, the Council shall by Order made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination, or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that parking place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near the parking place.
- 6. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
- 7. No person shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his or her skill or services.

- 8. Subject to the proviso hereto, when a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in **Article 4** or in **Article 5** of this Order a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place; provided that when a vehicle is waiting in a parking place in contravention of the provision of **Article 4.(b)** of this Order, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that permission.
- 9. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of the last preceding **Article** of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he or she may think necessary to enable him or her to remove it or alter its position, as the case may be.
- 10. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of **Article 8** of this Order, he or she shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.
- 11. If a vehicle is left at any time in contravention of a provision of this Order a penalty charge shall be payable.
- 12. In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge is payable, a penalty charge notice showing the information required by **Section 66** of **The Road Traffic Act 1991** may then be issued by a parking attendant in accordance with the requirements of **Section 66** of that Act.
- 13. The prohibition and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.
