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**The Parking Places And Controlled
Parking Zone (Liverpool) Order, 2009.**

The City Council of Liverpool in exercise of its powers under **Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 9, 19, 32, 35, 38, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53** and **Part IV of Schedule 9** to **The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984** and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with **Part III of Schedule 9** to **The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984** hereby makes the following Order:-

Commencement, Citation and Revocations

1.1 This Order shall come into operation on the 4th day of May 2009 and may be cited as **The Parking Places and Controlled Parking Zone (Liverpool) Order 2009**.

1.2 The traffic orders specified in **Column 1 of Schedule 19** to this Order are hereby revoked to the extent specified in **Column 2 of Schedule 19** of this Order.

Interpretation

2.1 In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"the Act of 1984" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

"Ambulance" means a marked motor vehicle constructed or adapted for the carriage of sick or injured people.

"Ambulance Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 29 of this Order.

"Baltic Triangle Area" means the area bounded by and including Park Lane, Sparling Street, Wapping and Liver Street, Liverpool.

"Business Parking Permit" means a parking permit issued by the Council pursuant to Article 46.

"Business Visitor Parking Voucher" means a parking voucher issued by the Council pursuant to Article 49.

"Car Club" means a formally constituted car-sharing scheme approved of by the Council to operate within its boundaries.

"Car Club Parking Bay" means a space marked out and provided in a car club parking place for the leaving of a single Car club vehicle.

"Car Club Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 32 of this Order.

"Car Club Parking Space" means a space in a car club parking place which is provided for the leaving of car club vehicles.

"Car Club Parking Permit" means a parking permit issued by the Council pursuant to Article 52.

"Car Club Permit Holder" means the person or organisation to which a car club parking permit has been issued under the provisions of this Order.

"Car Club Vehicle" means a car club vehicle (the overall height of which does not exceed 2.28 metres and the overall length of which does not exceed 5 metres) displaying a valid car club permit.

"Carers Parking Permit" means a parking permit issued by the Council pursuant to Article 47.

"Chair Lift Minibus Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 9 to this Order.

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person authorized by or on behalf of the City of Liverpool under Section 76 of The Traffic Management Act 2004 to supervise and enforce the restrictions imposed by Traffic Regulation Orders made by the Council.

"Coach" means a public service vehicle but excluding such a vehicle when it is being used to operate a local service as defined by the Transport Act 1985;

"Coach Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 11 to this Order.

"Coach Parking Places (Restricted Hours)" means any area of highway described in Schedule 27 to this Order.

"Cruise Liner Coach Parking Permit" means a parking permit issued to a Coach Operator by the City Council under the provisions of Article 53 of this Order; **NEW INTERPRETATION GOING IN FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010**

"Cruise Liner Coach Parking Place" means any area of highway specifically described as such within Schedule 11 to this Order; **NEW INTERPRETATION GOING IN FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010**

"Drop-Off/Pick-Up Places For Coaches" means any area of highway described in Schedule 36 to this Order.

"the Council" means Liverpool City Council.

"Disabled Person" means a disabled person of a description prescribed by Regulation 5 of the Disabled persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982 as amended by the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1991.

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in Regulation 2(1) of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations, 2000, as amended by Regulation 10 of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) (Amendment) Regulations, 2007 and issued by a local authority for display on a Motor Vehicle driven by a Disabled Person or used for the carriage of a Disabled Person or of several Disabled Persons including a duplicate badge issued pursuant to the above Regulations.

"Disabled Persons Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 5, Schedule 6, Schedule 7, Schedule 25 and Schedule 31 to this Order.

"Disabled Residents Parking Permit" means a parking permit issued by the Council pursuant to Article 50.

"Disabled Residents Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 8 to this Order.

"Doctors Parking Permit" means a parking permit issued by the Council pursuant to Article 51.

"Doctors Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 12 to this order.

"Driver" in relation to a vehicle left at or waiting in a Parking Place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left at or is waiting at the Parking Place.

"Dual Purpose Vehicle" means a vehicle constructed or adapted for the carriage both of passengers and of Goods or burden of any description being a vehicle of which the unladen weight does not exceed 2 tonnes.

"Dwelling House" means a Dwellinghouse or part of a Dwellinghouse used for residential occupation.

"Exhibition" means any exhibition of goods or services or both; **NEW INTERPRETATION GOING IN FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010**

"Goods Vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of Goods or burden of any description or a Trailer so constructed or adapted.

"Hackney Carriage" has the same meaning as in Section 38(1) of the Vehicles (Excise) Act 1971.

"Hackney Carriage Clearway" means any area of highway described in Schedule 33 of this Order in which stopping or stopping for the purpose of loading and unloading at any time is prohibited for any vehicle other than a hackney carriage.

"Initial Charge" means the sum specified in Article 34.

"Initial Period" means the period of time specified in Column 1 of Article 34.1, 34.2 and 34.3 which corresponds to the amount of the Initial Charge specified in Column 2 of Article 34.1, 34.2 and 34.3 respectively.

"inner Zone" means those parking places specified in Part I of Schedule 1 to this Order.

"Invalid Carriage" means a mechanically propelled vehicle of which the weight unladen does not exceed 254 kilograms and which is specially designed and constructed (and not merely adapted) for the use of a person suffering from some physical default or disability and is solely used by such a person.

"Layover Period" means either:- (a) the period during which a Public Service Vehicle being used in the operation of a local service is required to wait at a bus stop to adhere to the requirements of the bus service timetable or (b) the period specified in column 2 during the times specified in Column 3 of Schedule 4 to this order whichever is the shorter period.

"Loading and Unloading" means the transference from (or to) a vehicle to (or from) premises adjacent to where the vehicle is parked of heavy or unmanageable Goods that are not designed to be carried by hand other than over a very short distance.

"Loading Bay" means any area of highway described in Schedule 3 and Schedule 31 to this Order.

"Long Stay Pay and Display Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Part III of Schedule 1 to this Order.

"Lord Mayors/Lady Mayoress's Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 13 to this order.

"Motor Cycle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle (not being an Invalid Carriage) with fewer than 4 wheels of which the weight unladen does not exceed 410 kilograms.

"Motor Cycle Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 10 to this Order

"Multi-use Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Part II of Schedule 1 to this Order.

"One-Way Street" means a highway in which the driving of vehicles otherwise than in one direction is prohibited at all times.

"Outer Zone" means those parking places specified in Part II of Schedule 1, Part III of Schedule 1 and the whole of Schedule 2 to this Order.

"Owner" in relation to a car club vehicle, means the person or organisation by whom such a car club vehicle is kept and used.

"Parking Place" means each of the areas on a highway described in Schedules 1-13 inclusive and Schedules 25 to 27 inclusive, Schedule 29, Schedule 32 and Schedules 35-36 inclusive where vehicles may park subject to the restrictions and provisions set out in this Order.

"Parking Space" means a space provided for a vehicle to park in a Parking Place and which shall not exceed 5 metres in length.

"Parking Ticket" means a ticket or consecutively numbered tickets issued by a Pay and Display Machine installed at a Pay and Display Parking Place or a Multi-use Parking Place.

"Parking Zone" means Zone I, Zone J, Zone K, Zone L and Zone N.

"Passenger Vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a Solo Motor Cycle) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than 12 passengers exclusively of the driver and not drawing a Trailer.

"Pay and Display Machine" means an apparatus approved by the Secretary of State for the purpose of this Order to indicate the time by clock and to issue numbered tickets indicating the payment of a Charge, the period in respect of which it has been paid and the day on which it was paid.

"Pay and Display Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Part I and Part II of Schedule 1 to this Order.

"penalty charge" and "reduced penalty charge" means a charge set by the City of Liverpool under the provisions of Section 77 of The Traffic Management Act 2004 in accordance with guidance given by the Secretary of State for Transport which is to be paid in the manner described in the penalty charge notice not later than the last day of the period of 28 days beginning with the date on which the Penalty Charge Notice was served or 14 days of the date the notice was served in the case of a reduced penalty charge.

"penalty charge notice" means a notice issued by a civil enforcement officer pursuant to the provisions of The Traffic Management Act 2004 and any Statutory Instruments made by the Secretary of State there under.

"Permit" means a Parking Permit issued by the Council under the provisions of Part IV this Order.

"Permit Holder" means the person to whom a permit has been issued under the provisions of this Order.

"Permitted Hours" means:- (a) in respect of Parking Places (except "Doctors Parking Places", "Coach Parking Places (Restricted Hours)", and "Bus Stop Clear Way") the period between 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on Mondays to Sundays inclusive; (b) in respect of each "Doctors Parking Places" specified in Column 1 of Schedule 12 means the period specified in the corresponding part of Column 6 of Schedule 12; (c) in respect of each "Coach Parking Places (Restricted Hours)" specified in Column 1 of Schedule 27 means the period specified in the corresponding part of Column 4 of Schedule 27; (d) in respect of each "Bus Stop Clear Way" the period specified in the corresponding part of Column 4 of Schedule 28; (e) at any time in relation to each "Car Club Parking Place" specified in Schedule 32; (f) at any time in relation to each "Hackney Carriage Clearway specified in Schedule 33; and (g) in respect of each Street Traders Parking Place specified in Schedule 35 the period between 9.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on Mondays to Sundays inclusive **EXISTING INTERPRETATION COMING OUT FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010**

"Permitted Hours" means:- (a) in respect of Parking Places (except "Doctors Parking Places", "Coach Parking Places (Restricted Hours)", "Bus Stop Clear Way", "Car Club Parking Place", "Hackney Carriage Clearway", "Street Traders Parking Place" and "Cruise Liner Coach Parking Place") the period between 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on Mondays to Sundays inclusive; (b) in respect of each "Doctors Parking Places" specified in Column 1 of Schedule 12 means the period specified in the corresponding part of Column 6 of Schedule 12; (c) in respect of each "Coach Parking Places (Restricted Hours)" specified in Column 1 of Schedule 27 means the period specified in the corresponding part of Column 4 of Schedule 27; (d) in respect of each "Bus Stop Clear Way" the period specified in the corresponding part of Column 4 of Schedule 28; (e) at any time in relation to each "Car Club Parking Place" specified in Schedule 32; (f) at any time in relation to each "Hackney Carriage Clearway" specified in Schedule 33; (g) in respect of each "Street Traders Parking Place" specified in Schedule 35 the period between 9.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on Mondays to Sundays inclusive; and (h) at any time in relation to each "Cruise Liner Coach Parking Place" specifically described as such within Schedule 11; **NEW INTERPRETATION GOING IN FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010**

"Permitted Parking Area" means any area of highway specifically described as such within Schedule 2 to this Order.

"Principal Place of Residence" means a place where the applicant for a permit or vouchers stays over night for at least four nights per week during a period of at least 10 months per year.

"Police Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 26 to this Order.

"postal operator" means a person who provides the service of conveying postal packets from one place to another by post or any of the incidental services of receiving, collecting, sorting and delivering such packets.

"postal packet" means a letter, parcel, packet or other article transmissible by post.

"Prescot Street Area" means the area bounded by Erskine Street, Hall Lane, Mount Vernon Green, Mount Vernon, Mount Vernon Road, Minshull Street, Paddington, Brownlow Hill, Great Newton Street, Pembroke Street, Pembroke Place, Daulby Street and Moss Street.

"Protective Cover" means a protective cover which is used to retain and display a permit on a vehicle and issued by the Council under the provisions of Article 56.

"Public Service Vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a tramcar) which – (a) being a vehicle adapted to carry more than eight passengers is used for carrying passengers for hire or reward; or (b) being a vehicle not so adapted, is used for carrying passengers for hire or reward at separate fares in the course of a business of carrying passengers.

"Residents Parking Permit" means a parking permit issued by the Council pursuant to Article 45.

"Residents Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 2 to this Order.

"Restricted Hours" means:- (a) in respect of any Restricted road specified in Schedule 14 to this Order the period between 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on Mondays to Sundays inclusive; (b) at all times in respect of any Restricted Road specified in Schedule 15 to this Order; and (c) in respect of any Restricted Road specified in Schedule 16 to this Order the period between 6.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on Mondays to Sundays inclusive.

"Restricted Road" means any highway or part of highway specified in Schedule 14, Schedule 15 and Schedule 16 to this order excluding any Parking Place.

"Solo Motor Cycle" means a Motor Cycle without a side car fitted.

"Special Events" means any occasional event such as a film festival, travelling fun fair, advertising photo shoot, band concert, firework display, charitable event or any other event authorised by the Council **NEW INTERPRETATION GOING IN FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010**

"Street Traders Parking Bay" means a space marked out and provided in a street traders parking place for the leaving of a single street traders vehicle.

"Street Traders Parking Place" means any area of highway described in Schedule 35 of this Order.

"Street Traders Parking Permit" means a parking permit issued by the Council pursuant to Article 53.

"Street Traders Vehicle" means a street traders vehicle displaying a valid street traders parking permit.

"Telecommunications Apparatus" has the same meaning as in the Telecommunications Act 1984.

"Traffic Sign" means any object or device (whether fixed or portable) for conveying, to traffic on roads or any specified class of traffic, warnings, information, requirements restrictions or prohibitions of any description:- (a) specified by regulations made by the Secretaries of State charged with general responsibility under the Act of 1984 in relation to England and Wales and Scotland respectively acting jointly; or (b) authorised by the Secretary of State and any line or mark on a road for so conveying such warnings, information, requirements, restrictions or prohibitions.

"Trailer means" a vehicle other than a motor vehicle.

"valid Parking Ticket" means a parking ticket that is valid for use within the parking place where the vehicle in which the ticket is displayed, is parked. Such a ticket being valid by virtue of the expiry time shown on the ticket having not expired, for that date of use of that ticket, whilst the vehicle in which the ticket is displayed is parked in the parking place.

"Visitors Parking Voucher" means a parking voucher issued by the Council pursuant to Article 48.

"Zone I" means any restricted road contained in Schedule 21 to the Order.

"Zone J" means any restricted road contained in Schedule 22 to the Order.

"Zone K" means any restricted road contained in Schedule 23 to the Order.

"Zone L" means any restricted road contained in Schedule 24 to the Order.

"Zone N" means any restricted road contained in Schedule 30 to the Order.

2.2 Any reference in this order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended or substituted by any subsequent enactment.

2.3 Any reference in this order to a masculine gender shall include reference to the feminine gender.

2.4 Any reference in this Order to a Singular includes the plural.

Designation of Parking Places

3. Each area on a highway in the City of Liverpool which is described in Schedules 1 to 13 inclusive and Schedules 25 to 27 inclusive, Schedule 29, Schedules 31-32 inclusive and Schedule 35-36 inclusive of this Order is designated as a Parking Place subject to the restrictions and provisions set out in this Order.

PART II – RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF PARKING PLACES

Pay and Display Parking Places

4. No person shall leave a vehicle other than a Passenger Vehicle Dual Purpose Vehicle, Goods Vehicle, Motor Cycle with a side car fitted or Invalid Carriage at any Pay and Display Parking Place during the Permitted Hours.

5. No person shall leave a vehicle in a Pay and Display Parking Place at any time during the Permitted Hours unless he:-

5.1. has paid the Initial Charge, relevant for that parking place, as specified in Article 34 in accordance with Article 35 and displays the valid Parking Ticket on that vehicle in accordance with Article 36; or

5.2. is the holder of a valid Disabled Persons Badge which has been issued to him and he displays such Badge on that vehicle in accordance with Article 62.

6. In the event that a person leaves a vehicle in a Pay and Display Parking Place at any time outside the Permitted Hours and that vehicle remains at that Pay and Display Parking Place at the commencement of the next Permitted Hours that person shall then:-

6.1. pay the Initial Charge specified in Article 34 in accordance with the provisions of Article 35 and displays the Parking Ticket on that vehicle in accordance with Article 36; or

6.2. display a valid Disabled Persons Badge on that vehicle in accordance with Article 62.

7. Subject to the exceptions set out in Article 9 no person shall leave a vehicle at a Pay and Display Parking Place during the Permitted Hours for a period exceeding: - (a) 2 hours in respect of a Pay and Display Parking Place specified in Part I of Schedule 1; and (b) 4 hours in respect of a Long Stay Pay and Display Parking Place specified in Part III of Schedule 1.

8. Subject to the exceptions set out in Article 9 where a vehicle has been left at a Pay and Display Parking Place during the Permitted Hours and is then taken away from that Parking Place, the vehicle shall not be left at that Parking Place again until one hour has elapsed from the time at which the vehicle was taken away from that Parking Place or the Permitted Hours have expired whichever is the earlier.

9. The restrictions as to the maximum length of time for which a vehicle may be left in a Pay and Display Parking Place specified in Article 7 and the restrictions on returning to a Pay and Display Parking Place specified in Article 8 shall not apply to vehicles on which a valid Disabled Persons Badge is displayed in accordance with Article 62.

Multi Use Parking Places

10. No person shall leave a vehicle other than a Passenger Vehicle, Goods Vehicle, Motor Cycle with a side car fitted or Invalid Carriage at any Multi Use Parking Place.

11. No person shall leave a vehicle in a Multi Use Parking Place at any time during the Permitted Hours unless he:-

11.1 has paid the Initial Charge specified in Article 34 in accordance with the provisions of Article 35 and displays the Parking Ticket on that vehicle in accordance with Article 36; or

11.2 is the holder of a valid Disabled Persons Badge and he displays such Badge on that vehicle in accordance with Article 62; or

11.3 is the holder of a valid Residents Parking Permit or a valid Business Parking Permit or a valid Carers Parking Permit in respect of the Parking Place at which the vehicle is left and he displays such Permit on that vehicle in accordance with Article 61.

11.4. is the holder of a valid Visitors Parking Voucher or a valid Business Visitor Parking Voucher (in the Baltic Triangle area) in respect of the Parking Place at which the vehicle is left and he has validated and displays such Voucher in accordance with Article 63.

12. In the event that a person leaves a vehicle in a Multi Use Parking Place at any time outside the Permitted Hours and that vehicle remains at that Parking Place at the commencement of the next Permitted Hours that person shall then:-

12.1 pay the Initial Charge specified in Article 34 in accordance with the provisions of Article 35 and display the Parking Ticket on that vehicle in accordance with Article 36; or

12.2 display a valid Disabled Persons Badge on that vehicle in accordance with Article 62; or

12.3 display a valid Residents Parking Permit or a valid Business Parking Permit or a valid Carers Parking Permit which has been issued to him in respect of the Parking Place at which the permit is left on that vehicle in accordance with Article 61; or

12.4 validate and display a Visitors Parking Voucher or Business Visitor Parking Voucher (in the Baltic Triangle area) which has been issued to him in respect of the parking place at which the voucher is left on that vehicle in accordance with Article 63.

13. Subject to the exceptions set out in Article 15 no person shall leave a vehicle at a Multi Use Parking Place during the Permitted Hours for a period exceeding 2 hours.

14. Subject to the exceptions set out in Article 15 where a vehicle has been left in a Multi Use Parking Place during the Permitted Hours and is then taken away from that Parking Place the vehicle shall not be left at that Parking Place again until one hour has elapsed from the time at which the vehicle was taken away from that Parking Place or the Permitted Hours have expired whichever is the earlier.

15. The restrictions as to the maximum length of time for which a vehicle may be left in a Multi Use Parking Place as specified in Article 13 and the restrictions on returning to a Multi Use Parking Place specified in Article 14 shall not apply to vehicles on which there is displayed:-

15.1 a valid Disabled Persons Badge in accordance with Article 62;

15.2 a valid Residents Parking Permit or Business Parking Permit or Carers Parking Permit authorising that vehicle to park at the parking place at which the vehicle has been left in accordance with Article 61; and

15.3 a valid Visitors Parking Voucher or Business Visitors Parking Voucher (In the Baltic Triangle area) authorising that vehicle to park at the Parking Place during the period for which the vehicle has been left there in accordance with Article 63.

Disabled Persons Parking Place

16. No person shall leave a vehicle at any Disabled Persons Parking Place during the times specified below, unless he is the holder of a Disabled Persons Badge and he displays such badge on that vehicle in accordance with Article 62:-

16.1. at any time in respect of the areas of highway described in Schedule 5 and 25 to this Order;

16.2. between the hours of 6.00 p.m. and 6.00 a.m. in respect of the areas described in Schedule 6 to this Order;

16.3. between the hours of 6.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. in respect of the areas described in Schedule 7 to this Order;

16.4 no person shall leave a vehicle at a any Disabled Persons Parking Place as described in Schedule 25 to this Order during the permitted hours for a period exceeding one hour; and

16.5 where a vehicle has been left in a Disabled Persons Parking Place as described in Schedule 25 to this Order during the permitted hours and is then taken away from that Parking Place the vehicle shall not be left at that Parking Place again until one hour has elapsed from the time at which the vehicle was taken away from that Parking Place;

16.6. between the hours of 10.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. in respect of the areas described in Schedule 31 to this Order.

Residents Parking Places

17. No person shall leave a vehicle at a Residents Parking Place during the Permitted Hours unless:-

17.1.1 he is the holder of a valid Residents Parking Permit or Carers Parking Permit in respect of the Parking Place at which the vehicle is left and he displays such Permit on that vehicle in accordance with Article 61; or

17.1.2 he is the holder of a valid Visitors Parking Voucher in respect of the Parking Place at which the vehicle is left and he has validated and displays such voucher on that vehicle in accordance with Article 63.

Parking Places for specified Disabled Residents Vehicle

18. No person shall leave a vehicle during the Permitted Hours at any Disabled Residents Parking Place unless he:-

18.1. holds a valid Disabled Residents Parking Permit which authorises him to park that particular vehicle at the particular Disabled Residents Parking Place at which the vehicle is left; and

18.2. displays such Permit on the vehicle in accordance with Article 61.

Doctors Parking Places

19. No person shall leave a vehicle during the Permitted Hours at a Doctors Parking Place unless he:-

19.1. holds a valid Doctors Parking Permit which authorises him to park that particular vehicle at the particular Doctors Parking Place at which the vehicle is left; and

19.2. displays such Permit on the vehicle in accordance with Article 61.

Chair Lift Minibus Parking Places

20. No person shall leave a vehicle in a Chair Lift Minibus Parking Place at any time unless that vehicle is a Minibus suitably adapted by means of Chair Lift for the conveyance of Disabled Persons and that such vehicle is left at that Chair Lift Minibus Parking Place for the conveyance of Disabled Persons.

Motor Cycle Parking Places

21. No person shall leave a vehicle or other means of transport at any Motor Cycle Parking Place at any time other than a bicycle propelled by mechanical power which does not have a side car attached.

Coach Parking Places

22. No person shall leave any vehicle at any Coach Parking Place at any time other than a Coach.

Coach Parking Places (Restricted Hours)

23. No person shall or leave any vehicle at any Coach Parking Place (Restricted Hours) during the Permitted Hours, other than a Coach.

Loading Bays

24. No person shall leave a vehicle at any time at a Loading Bay:-

24.1 Other than a motor vehicle which is left at such Loading Bay for the purpose of loading and/or unloading goods; and

24.2 Unless the vehicle is left at the Loading Bay specified in Column 2 of Schedule 3 to this Order during the hours specified in the corresponding part of Column 5 of Schedule 3 during the days specified in the corresponding part of Column 4 of Schedule 3, for a maximum period not exceeding that specified in Column 6 of Schedule 3; and

24.3 Unless the vehicle is left at the Loading Bay specified in Schedule 31 to this Order during the hours 6.00pm to 10.00am for a maximum period not exceeding 1 hour.

Lord Mayors/Lady Mayoress's Parking Places

25. No person shall leave a vehicle at any time at any Lord Mayors/Lady Mayoress's Parking Place unless that vehicle is the official vehicle of the Lord Mayor or Lady Mayoress for the time being of the Council.

Police Parking Places

26. No person shall leave a vehicle at any time in a Police Parking Place unless that vehicle is a marked police vehicle.

Ambulance Parking Places

27. No person shall leave any vehicle at any Ambulance Parking Place at any time other than an Ambulance.

Permitted Parking Area

28. No person shall leave a vehicle in a Permitted Parking Area specifically described as such within Schedule 2 to this Order during the Permitted Hours unless:-

28.1.1 he is the holder of a valid Residents Parking Permit or Carers Parking Permit in respect of the Permitted Parking Area at which the vehicle is left and he displays such Permit on that vehicle in accordance with Article 61; or

28.1.2 he is the holder of a valid Visitors Parking Voucher in respect of the Permitted Parking Area at which the vehicle is left and he has validated and displays such voucher on that vehicle in accordance with Article 63.

Car Club Parking Places

29. No person shall leave a vehicle at a Car Club Parking Place during the Permitted Hours unless he is the holder of a valid Car Club Parking Permit in respect of the parking place at which the car club vehicle is left and he displays such permit on that vehicle in accordance with Article 61.

Hackney Carriage Clearways

30. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to stop or stop for the purpose of loading or unloading at any time at a Hackney Carriage Clearway during the Permitted Hours other than a Hackney Carriage.

Street Traders Parking Place

31. No person shall leave a vehicle at a Street Traders Parking Place during the Permitted Hours unless he is the holder of a valid Street Traders Parking Permit in respect of the parking place at which the vehicle is left and he displays such permit on that vehicle in accordance with Article 61.

Drop-Off/Pick-Up Places For Coaches

32. No person shall leave a vehicle at any time at a Drop-Off/Pick-Up Place For Coaches:-

32.1 Other than a coach which is left at such Drop-Off/Pick-Up Place For Coaches for the purpose of allowing passengers to board or alight; and

32.2 Unless the coach is left at the Drop-Off/Pick-Up Place For Coaches specified in Column 2 of Schedule 36 to this Order during the hours specified in the corresponding part of Column 5 of Schedule 36 during the days specified in the corresponding part of Column 4 of Schedule 36, for a maximum period not exceeding that specified in Column 6 of Schedule 36.

Cruise Liner Coach Parking Places

33. No person shall leave a vehicle in a designated Cruise Liner Coach Parking Place specifically described as such within Schedule 11 to this Order at any time unless he is the holder of a valid Cruise Liner Parking Permit in respect of the Cruise Liner Coach Parking Place at which the vehicle is left and he displays such Permit on that vehicle in accordance with Article 61. **NEW ARTICLE GOING IN FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010**

PART III – PROVISIONS AS TO PAY AND DISPLAY PARKING PLACES AND MULTI USE PARKING PLACES

34. Amount of Initial Charge – For Pay and Display Parking Places In The Inner Zone - Mondays to Sundays

34.1 The Initial Charge payable for a vehicle to be left at a Pay and Display Parking Place specified in Part I of Schedule 1 to this Order for a period not exceeding that specified in Column 1 below shall be the sum specified in the corresponding part of Column 2 below:-

34. Amount of Initial Charge – For Multi-Use Parking Places In The Outer Zone - Mondays to Sundays

The Initial Charge payable for a vehicle to be left at a Pay and Display Parking Machine in a Multi-Use Parking Place specified in Part II of Schedule 1 to this Order for a period not exceeding that specified in Column 1 below shall be the sum specified in the corresponding part of Column 2 below:-

34. Amount of Initial Charge – For Long Stay Pay And Display Parking Places (Up To A Maximum Of Four Hours) In The Outer Zone - Mondays to Sundays

34.3. The Initial Charge payable for a vehicle to be left at a Long Stay Pay and Display Parking Place specified in Part III of Schedule 1 to this Order for a period not exceeding that specified in Column 1 below shall be the sum specified in the corresponding part of Column 2 below:-

Payment Of Initial Charge

35. The Initial Charge shall be paid by insertion of the appropriate coin or coins in the Pay and Display Machine situated at the Pay and Display Parking Place or Multi Use Parking Place at which the vehicle is left provided that if there is no Pay and Display Machine situated at that Parking Place or such machine is not operating properly the Initial Charge shall be paid by inserting the appropriate coin or coins in a Pay and Display Machine which is operating properly and which is nearest to the Parking Place at which the vehicle is left.

Display of Parking Ticket

36. The Parking Ticket issued by the Pay and Display Machine shall be displayed in the vehicle in respect of which the Initial Charge has been paid in a conspicuous position on the vehicle dashboard or fascia, so that the date and time recorded on the Parking Ticket are clearly visible to a person standing at the front or nearside of such vehicle for the whole of the time during which such vehicle is left at the Pay and Display Parking Place or Multi Use Parking Place.

Not to Insert further coins

37. No person shall insert in any Pay and Display Machine any coin or coins additional to the coin or coins inserted in a Pay and Display Machine by way of payment of the Initial Charge in respect of that vehicle.

Penalty Charge

38. Subject to Article 39 a Penalty Charge of £70.00 or £50.00 shall be incurred if a vehicle is left at any time during the Permitted Hours in a Pay and Display Parking Place or a Multi Use Parking Place and:-

38.1. the Initial Charge has not been paid in respect of that vehicle; or

38.2. the Initial Charge has been paid in respect of that vehicle but the Initial Period in respect of which the Initial Charge has been paid has expired.

38.3. the Parking Ticket is not displayed, in accordance with Article 36, for the whole of the time during which such vehicle is left at the Pay and Display Parking Place or Multi Use Parking Place.

39. Exemption from Penalty Charge

39.1. No penalty charge shall be incurred in respect of a vehicle left in a Pay and Display Parking Place in which is displayed a valid Disabled Persons Badge in accordance with Article 62.

39.2 No penalty charge shall be incurred in respect of a vehicle left in a Multi Use Parking Place in which there is displayed:-

39.2.1 a valid Disabled Persons Badge in accordance with Article 62;

39.2.2 a valid Residents Parking Permit or Business Parking Permit or Carers Parking Permit authorising that vehicle to park at the Parking Place at which the vehicle has been left in accordance with Article 61;

39.2.3 a valid Visitors Parking Voucher or Business Visitor Parking Voucher (in the Baltic Triangle area) authorising that vehicle to park at that Parking Place during the period for which the vehicle has been left there in accordance with Article 63.

Notice of Penalty Charge

40. In the case of a vehicle in respect of which an Penalty Charge has been incurred, it shall be the duty of a Civil Enforcement Officer to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position, a notice which shall include the following particulars:-

40.1. the registration mark of the vehicle, or where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;

40.2. a statement indicating the offence of either:-

40.2.1. failing to pay the Initial Charge; or

40.2.2. leaving the vehicle in a Pay and Display Parking Place (or Multi Use Parking Place) after the Initial period has expired;

40.3. a statement that a penalty charge of £70.00 or £50.00 inclusive of Value Added Tax is required to be paid;

40.4. the manner in which, and the time within which, the penalty charge should be paid.

Restriction on Removal of Notices

41. Where a notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 40 of this Order, no person, not being the Driver of the vehicle, a person duly authorised by the Council or a Civil Enforcement Officer, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the Driver.

Manner of Payment of Penalty Charge

42. The Driver shall pay the penalty charge to the Council within 28 days beginning with the date on which the penalty charge notice was served under the provisions of Article 40 provided that if the Driver tenders the sum of £35.00 or £25.00 inclusive of Value Added Tax to the Council not later than the last day of the period of 14 days beginning with the date on which the penalty charge notice was served under Article 40, then such payment shall be accepted by the Council in satisfaction of the penalty charge.

PART IV – PROVISIONS AS TO PERMITS, VOUCHERS AND BADGES

Application and Issue

43. An application for a Permit or Voucher shall be made in writing to the Council on the form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include all particulars and information required by such form.

44. The Council may require an applicant for a Permit or Voucher to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of the Application as may be reasonable necessary to verify the particulars or information given to him by the applicant.

44a Permits and Vouchers shall be issued by the Council by ordinary post upon the Council being satisfied that the applicant for such a permit or voucher has satisfied the criteria set out in this Order for the issue of such permits or vouchers.

44b Should a permit be lost, damaged or defaced a charge of £25.00 will be levied for a replacement permit.

Residents Parking Permits

45. The Council may issue a Residents Parking Permit permitting a specified vehicle to park during the Permitted Hours in Residents Parking Places or Multi Use Parking Places within a Parking Zone specified by the Council to an applicant who satisfies the Council that he:-

45.1 uses as his principle place of residence a Dwellinghouse fronting or sufficiently proximate to a Residents Parking Place or a Multi Use Parking Place or is a Minister of Religion in whose parish is located any Residents Parking Place or Multi Use Parking Place; and

45.2 has no suitable parking facility within a reasonable distance of such Dwellinghouse; and

45.3 is the owner of a Passenger Vehicle, a Dual Purpose Vehicle, a Goods Vehicle, an Invalid Carriage or a Motor Cycle with side car fitted, or a Solo Motor Cycle.

Business Parking Permits

46. The Council may issue a Business Parking Permit permitting a specified vehicle to park during the Permitted Hours in Multi Use Parking Places within an area specified by the Council to an applicant who satisfies the Council that he:-

46.1. is regularly carrying on a business of which he has a controlling interest at premises fronting or sufficiently proximate to a Multi Use Parking Place; and

46.2. has no suitable parking facility within a reasonable distance of such business premises; and

46.3. is the owner of a Passenger Vehicle, a Dual Purpose Vehicle, a Goods Vehicle, an Invalid Carriage or a Motor Cycle with side car fitted, or a Solo Motor Cycle (or if he is not the owner of such a vehicle that he has the permission of the owner of such a vehicle to use such a vehicle from the premises referred to in Article 46.1 above); and

46.4. has paid to the Council the charge of £140.00 in respect of the issue of a Permit for 3 months if that Permit is designated for the use outside the Baltic Triangle area; and

46.5. has paid to the Council the charge of £50.00 in respect of the issue of a permit for 12 months if that Permit is designated for use in the Baltic Triangle Area or the Prescott Street Area.

Carers Parking Permits

47. The Council may issue Carers Parking Permits permitting a vehicle to park during the Permitted Hours in a Residents Parking Place or Multi Use Parking Place within a particular zone specified by the Council to an applicant who satisfies the Council that he:-

47.1 is elderly, registered disabled or chronically sick; and

47.2 uses as his Principal Place of Residence a Dwellinghouse fronting or sufficiently proximate to a Residents Parking Place or a Multi Use Parking Place; and

47.3 is regularly visited by a person who is a medical practitioner, nurse, midwife or other carer for the purpose of administering care to the applicant; and

47.4 has no suitable parking facility within a reasonable distance of such Dwellinghouse.

Visitors Parking Vouchers

48. The Council may issue up to 100 Visitors Parking Vouchers per calendar year, permitting a vehicle to park during the Permitted Hours in Residents Parking Places or Multi Use Parking Places within a Parking Zone specified by the Council for a period of 1 day irrespective of each voucher to an applicant who satisfies the Council that:-

48.1 his Principle Place of Residence is a Dwellinghouse fronting or sufficiently proximate to a Residents Parking Place or a Multi Use Parking Place;

48.2 he has no suitable parking facility within a reasonable distance of such Dwellinghouse; and

48.3 he is regularly visited by a non-resident who is the owner of a Passenger Vehicle, Goods Vehicle, Invalid Carriage or a Motor Cycle with side car fitted, or a Solo Motor Cycle.

Business Visitors Parking Vouchers

49. The Council may issue Business Visitor Parking Vouchers permitting a vehicle to park during the Permitted Hours in a Multi Use Parking Place within the Baltic Triangle Area and Prescot Street Area for a period of 1 day in respect of each voucher to an applicant who satisfies the Council (or any Organisation appointed on behalf of the Council) that:-

49.1. he regularly carries out a business of which he has a controlling interest at premises within the Baltic Triangle Area or the Prescot Street Area; and

49.2. such business premises do not have any suitable off-street parking facility; and

49.3. that there is no suitable parking facility which could be reasonably used by visitors to that business within a reasonable distance of such business premises; and

49.4. that the applicant has paid to the Council the charge of £1.50p in respect of each voucher to be used.

Disabled Residents Parking Permits

50. The Council may issue a Disabled Residents Parking Permit permitting a specified vehicle to park during the Permitted Hours in a specific Disabled Residents Parking Place to an applicant who satisfies the Council that he:-

50.1. is a Disabled Person; and

50.2. is the owner of a Passenger Vehicle, a Dual Purpose Vehicle, a Goods Vehicle, an Invalid Carriage or a Motor Cycle with side car fitted, or a Solo Motor Cycle; and

50.3. uses as his Principal Place of Residence a Dwellinghouse fronting or sufficiently proximate to a Disabled Residents Parking Place; and

50.4 has no suitable parking facility within reasonable distance of such Dwellinghouse.

Doctors Parking Permits

51. The Council may issue a Doctors Parking Permit permitting a specific vehicle to park during the Permitted Hours in a specific Doctors Parking Place to an applicant who satisfies the Council that he:-

51.1. is a legally qualified medical practitioner as defined in Section 52 of the Medical Act 1956; and

51.2. practices at a surgery or consulting rooms in Liverpool; and

51.3. is liable to be called of necessity to emergencies away from such surgery or consulting rooms to the extent that the need for special parking arrangements is justified; and

51.4. is the owner of a Passenger Vehicle, a Dual Purpose Vehicle, a Goods Vehicle, an Invalid Carriage or a Motor Cycle with side car fitted, or a Solo Motor Cycle; and

51.5. he has no suitable parking facility within a reasonable distance of his surgery or consulting rooms; and

51.6. has paid to the Council the charge of £50.00 in respect of the issue of such Permit for one year.

Car Club Parking Permits

52. The Council may issue to an authorised Car Club operator one Car Club Parking Permit for each Car Club Parking Bay in a Car Club Parking Place permitting a passenger vehicle to park during the permitted hours in a Car Club Parking Place within a Parking Zone specified by the Council to an applicant who satisfies the Council that he is the owner of a Passenger Vehicle, which does not exceed 2.28 metres in height and 5 metres in length, or if he is not the owner of such a vehicle that he has the permission of the owner of such vehicle to use such a vehicle from the Car Club Parking Place.

Street Traders Parking Permits

53. The Council may issue to an authorised Street Trader one Street Traders Parking Permit for each bay in a Street Traders Parking Place permitting a Street Traders Vehicle to park during the Permitted Hours in a Street Traders Parking Bay within a Parking Zone specified by the Council to an applicant who satisfies the Council that he is the owner of the Street Traders Vehicle, or if he is not the owner of such a vehicle that he has the permission of the owner of such vehicle to use such a vehicle to trade from.

Cruise Liner Coach Parking Permits

54. The Council may issue to an authorised Coach operator one Cruise Liner Parking Permit for each bay in a Cruise Liner Coach Parking Place specifically described as such within Schedule 11 to this Order permitting a Coach to park during the Permitted Hours in a Cruise Liner Coach Parking Bay within a Parking Zone specified by the Council to an applicant who satisfies the Council that he is the owner of the Coach, or if he is not the owner of such a vehicle that he has the permission of the owner of such vehicle to use such a vehicle from the Cruise Liner Coach Parking Place. **NEW ARTICLE GOING IN FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010**

Form of Permits and Vouchers

55.1 A Permit issued under the provisions of this Order shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-

55.1.1. The Registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the Permit has been issued (excluding Business Permits).

55.1.2. The period during which the Permit has been granted and/or the date on which the permit is due to expire (subject to the provisions of this Order as to termination of Permits).

55.1.3. An authentication that the Permit has been issued by the Council.

55.1.4. An indication of the number and/or location of the Parking Place or Places to which the Permit relates, by reference to a Parking Zone.

55.2 A Voucher issued under the provisions of this Order shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-

55.2.1. The number and/or location of the Parking Place or Places to which the voucher relates, by reference to a Parking Zone.

55.2.2. An authentication that the voucher has been issued by the Council.

55.2.3. An unmarked set of dates and times to be scratched as appropriate by the holder of the voucher to validate such voucher.

Protective Cover

56. When issuing a Permit under the provisions of this Order the Council shall also issue a protective cover to facilitate the display of such Permit on a vehicle.

57. Duplicate Permits

57.1. If a Permit issued under the Provisions of this Order is mutilated or defaced or the figures or particulars on it have become illegible or the colour of the Permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the Permit Holder shall surrender it to the Council and may then apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate Permit.

57.2. If a Permit is lost or destroyed, the Permit Holder may apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate Permit.

57.3. Any Duplicate Permit issued under the provisions of paragraph 57.1. or 57.2. of this Article shall be marked as a duplicate, and upon the issue of a duplicate Permit the original Permit which it duplicates shall become invalid.

57.4. The provisions of this Order relating to applications for Permits and Permits generally shall apply to applications for duplicate Permits and duplicate Permits generally.

Termination of Parking Permits or Vouchers

58. A Permit or Voucher issued under the provisions of this Order shall terminate and cease to be valid:-

58.1. immediately without notice in the event that any cheque given to the Council for payment of any charge due in respect of any Permit or Voucher is dishonoured;

58.2. immediately upon surrender of such Permit or Voucher to the Council;

58.3. immediately without notice upon the expiry of the period specified in such Permit or Voucher; or

58.4. on a date specified in a notice addressed to the Holder of the Permit or Voucher revoking the Permit or Voucher on the grounds that any or all of the matters as to which the Council was satisfied when granting the Permit or Voucher is or are no longer satisfied or for any other reason whatsoever.

59. Any notice addressed to the Holder of the Permit or Voucher under the provisions of Article 58.4 shall be sufficiently served if addressed to that person and delivered to him personally or sent by ordinary post to his last known residence or place of business.

60. Upon termination of a Residents Parking Permit, a Business Parking Permit or a Doctors Parking Permit under the provisions of Article 58 the Permit Holder shall be entitled to a refund of any charge paid to the Council in respect of that Permit to the following extent:-

60.1. the whole of such charge if the Permit is terminated prior to the date on which it is due to become valid; and

60.2. in any other case one twelfth of the charge paid in respect of each complete month of the period for which the Permit was granted as remains unexpired at the date of termination of such Permit.

Display of Permit

61. A Permit issued under the provisions of this Order shall be displayed as follows:-

61.1. in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen on the near side thereon and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; or

61.2. in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.

Display of Disabled Persons Badge

62.1. A Disabled Persons Badge issued before 2nd March, 1992 shall be displayed:-

62.1:1. in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen on the near side thereon and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; or

62.1:2. in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.

62.2. A Disabled Persons Badge issued on or after 2nd March, 1992 shall be displayed:-

62.2:1. in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel on such dashboard or fascia panel so that the front face of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; or

62.2:2. in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the front face of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.

Validation And Display of Vouchers

63.1 On arrival at a Parking Place the voucher holder shall validate the voucher by scratching off panels on the Parking Voucher to indicate the date, day, month and year of arrival at the Parking Place.

63.2 The validated voucher shall be displayed:-

63.2.1. on the vehicle dashboard or fascia panel so that the front face of the voucher is legible from outside the vehicle for the full duration that the vehicle is parked in the Parking Place.

63.2.2. A voucher will be invalid if more than one date, day, month or year are scratched out on the voucher or if no date, day, month or year are scratched out on the voucher.

Removal of Permits/Vouchers and Disabled Persons Badge

64. Where a Permit/Voucher or Disabled Persons Badge has been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order no person shall remove such Permit/Voucher or Badge from display on such vehicle unless expressly authorised to do so by the Driver of the vehicle.

PART V – RESTRICTIONS IN RESPECT OF CERTAIN ROADS OTHER THAN PARKING PLACES

Restriction of Waiting, Loading and Unloading of Vehicles in certain roads other than parking places

65. Save as provided in Articles 66 and 68 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any Restricted Road during the Restricted Hours.

Exemptions from Waiting Restrictions on Restricted Roads – General

66. Nothing in Article 65 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any Restricted Road:-

66.1. for so long as may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight from a vehicle other than the road numbered 168 (Saint Johns Lane);

66.2. for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to any Restricted Road, the removal of any obstruction to traffic in any Restricted Road, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any Restricted Road, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to any Restricted Road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any Telecommunications Apparatus, wide area traffic control cable, or apparatus or Traffic Signs;

66.3. if the vehicle is a vehicle used for fire brigade purposes or an ambulance, or any vehicle in the service of a Local Authority or police force in either case being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

66.4. if the vehicle is a Public Service Vehicle being used in the operation of a local service waiting during a Layover Period at any duly authorised bus stop as defined in Column 1 of Schedule 4 for the length of time set down in the corresponding part of Column 2 of Schedule 4 and during such times as set down in the corresponding part of Column 3 of Schedule 4 to this Order;

66.5. if the vehicle is a Hackney Carriage waiting upon any duly authorised cab rank;

66.6. if the vehicle is waiting owing to the Driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;

66.7. if the vehicle is in the service of or employed by a Postal Operator, British Telecommunications plc or Mercury Communications Limited and is waiting while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to that road are being unloaded from the vehicle or, having been unloaded therefrom, are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent to that road; or is in use in connection with the servicing of telephone kiosks adjacent to that road;

66.8. for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to any Restricted Road;

66.9. for the purpose of loading or unloading the vehicle while the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or Dwellinghouse to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository, except that no vehicle shall wait for any such purpose during the period between 8.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. or the period between 4.30 p.m. and 6.00 p.m. ON ANY DAY so far as any such period falls within the Restricted Hours in any part of a Restricted Road specified in Schedule 17 to this Order UNLESS NOTICE IS GIVEN TWENTY FOUR HOURS IN ADVANCE TO THE POLICE OR CIVIL ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AND THEIR CONSENT IS OBTAINED;

66.10. if the vehicle is being used in connection with any wedding or funeral;

66.11 if the vehicle is used to gain access to premises within the Pier Head solely for the purpose of delivery to or servicing of such premises or for emergency purposes, only in the roads numbered 483 (Georges Parade) and 484 (Georges Pier Head). NEW ARTICLE GOING IN FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010

66.12 if the vehicle is authorised in writing by the Council to proceed in the area of the Pier Head in connection with the holding of an exhibition or special event authorised by the Council, only in the roads numbered 483 (Georges Parade) and 484 (Georges Pier Head). NEW ARTICLE GOING IN FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010

66.13 if the vehicle is on the business of the Mersey Docks And Harbour Company and is used to gain access within the Pier Head, only in the roads numbered 483 (Georges Parade) and 484 (Georges Pier Head). NEW ARTICLE GOING IN FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010

66.14 if the vehicle is under the control of Merseytravel and is used to gain access to the Mersey Ferry, only in the roads numbered 483 (Georges Parade) and 484 (Georges Pier Head). NEW ARTICLE GOING IN FROM FRI 7 NOV 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 30 APR 2010

66.15. if the vehicle is displaying a disabled person's badge and parking disc/clock and that same vehicle is being used by a disabled person whose badge and parking disc/clock is correctly on display in accordance with the Department for Transport's guidebook, "The Blue Badge Scheme: Rights And Responsibilities In England";

66.16. none of the exemptions set out in this Article shall apply to any of the roads specified in Schedule 18 to this Order.

Exemptions from Waiting Restrictions on Bus Stop Clear Ways

67. Nothing in Article 65 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any Bus Stop Clear Way.

67.1 if the vehicle is used for fire brigade purposes or an ambulance, or any vehicle in the service of a Local Authority or police force in either case being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

67.2 if the vehicle is a Hackney Carriage waiting upon any duly authorised cab rank which is specified as such within Schedule 28; **NEW ARTICLE AMENDMENT GOING IN FROM FRI 30TH, MAY 2008 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRI 27TH NOV 2009**

67.3 if the vehicle is a Public Service Vehicle allowing passengers to board or alight, to stop or stop for the purpose of loading and unloading.

68. Exemption from waiting restrictions on Restricted Roads – Loading and Unloading

68.1. Nothing in Article 65 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any Restricted Road for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of delivering or collecting Goods or merchandise or Loading or Unloading a vehicle at premises adjoining that Restricted Road provided that:-

68.1.1. no vehicle shall wait during the period between 8.30 A.M. AND 9.30 A.M. or the period between 4.30 P.M. AND 6.00 P.M. ON ANY DAY so far as any such period falls within the Restricted Hours in any part of a Restricted Road specified in Schedule 17 to this Order for the purpose of delivering or collecting Goods or merchandise or Loading or Unloading the vehicle; and

68.1.2. nothing in either of the preceding provisos shall apply so as to restrict the Loading or Unloading of any vehicle while the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the collection or delivery of Goods which cannot reasonably be loaded or unloaded outside the Restricted Hours PROVIDED THAT NOTICE IS GIVEN TWENTY FOUR HOURS IN ADVANCE TO THE POLICE OR CIVIL ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AND THEIR CONSENT IS OBTAINED

68.2. Notwithstanding anything in paragraph 68.1 of this Article, the driver of a vehicle waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting Goods or merchandise or Loading or Unloading the vehicle shall move the same on the instruction of a police officer in uniform whenever such movement may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing obstruction.

68.3. None of the exemptions set out in this Article shall apply to any of the roads specified in Schedule 15 to this Order.

PART VI – MISCELLANEOUS

69. Number of Parking Spaces

69.1. The number of Parking Spaces in any particular Parking Place defined in Column 2 of any of the Schedules to this Order shall not exceed the number specified in the corresponding part of Column 4 of the Schedule in which the Parking Place is defined.

Position of Parking Spaces

69.2. The position of any Parking Spaces within any Parking Place shall be as determined by the Council from time to time.

70. Placing of Traffic Signs at Parking Places

70.1. The Council shall cause the limits of each Parking Place and of each Parking Space to be indicated on the carriageway by placing and maintaining appropriate Traffic Signs thereon.

70.2. The Council shall place and maintain in the vicinity of each Parking Place Traffic Signs indicating the number of such Parking Place and any restriction as to vehicles which may use any particular Parking Place.

Manner of Standing in Parking Places

71. Every vehicle left in a Parking Place shall stand:-

71.1. in the case of a Parking Place described in Column 2 of Schedule 1 in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of vehicles in that place are specified in the corresponding part of Column 3 of Schedule 1 to this Order, in accordance with those provisions;

71.2. in the case of any other Parking Place:-

71.2:1 so that the left or near side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway, unless the Parking Place is in a One-Way Street;

71.2:2 so that the left or near side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left hand edge of the carriageway or so that the right or off side of the vehicle is adjacent to the right hand edge of the carriageway if the Parking Place is in a One-Way Street; and

71.2:3 so that the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 30 centimetres; and

71.3. so that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the Parking Space.

Alteration of Position of Vehicle in Parking Place

72. Where any vehicle is standing in a Parking Place in contravention of the provisions of Article 71 of this Order, a Civil Enforcement Officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

73. Power to Suspend Use of Parking Place

73.1. Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a Parking Place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-

73.1:1. for the purposes of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;

73.1:2. for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the Parking Place or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the Parking Place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the Parking Place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any Telecommunications apparatus, Traffic Sign or Pay And Display Machine;

73.1:3. for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the Parking Place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or Dwellinghouse to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;

73.1:4. on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or

73.1:5. for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the Parking Place at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions.

73.2. A Civil Enforcement Officer may suspend for not longer than TWENTY FOUR HOURS the use of a Parking Place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.

73.3. Any person suspending the use of a Parking Place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 73.1 or paragraph 73.2 of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to any part of that Parking Place the use of which is suspended a Traffic Sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.

73.4. Whenever a Parking Place is suspended in accordance with Article 73.1 then the Council may make an administrative charge of £25 for each request for a single consecutive period of suspension of each Parking Place and a charge of:-

73.4:1. £18.00 per day (or part thereof) in respect of each Parking Space (or part thereof) suspended from use which is comprised within a Pay and Display Parking Place specified in Part I of Schedule 1; or

73.4:2. £18.00 per day (or part thereof) in respect of such Parking Space (or part thereof) suspended from use which is comprised within a Multi-Use Parking Place specified in Part II of Schedule 1; or

73.4:3. £18.00 per day (or part thereof) in respect of each Parking Space (or part thereof) suspended from use which is comprised within a Long Stay Pay and Display Parking Place specified in Part III of Schedule 1; or

73.4:4. £18.00 per day (or part thereof) in respect of each Parking Space (or part thereof) suspended from use which is comprised within a Car Club Parking Place in Schedule 32.

73.5. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of a Parking Place during such period when a Traffic Sign is placed in or adjacent to that part of the Parking Place pursuant to paragraph 73.3 of this Article provided that this paragraph shall not apply to a vehicle:-

73.5:1. being used by the respective Fire or Police Authority or National Health Trust to deal with an emergency; or

73.5:2. being used for any purpose specified in Article 75.1:2 or 75.1:4; or
