**(ROSE LANE) (NO WAITING)**  
**ORDER, 1967**

The City Council of Liverpool, in exercise of its powers under sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 26 and sub-section (4) of Section 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

- (1) Save as provided in Article (2) of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on:
  - (a) the northwesterly side of Rose Lane, for a distance of 145 feet southwest of its junction with Bridge Road;
  - (b) the northwesterly side of Rose Lane between a point 50 feet and a point 170 feet northeast of its junction with Bridge Road;
  - (c) the southeasterly side of Rose Lane between a point 140 feet southwest of its junction with Pitville Avenue and a point opposite the north east side of Ribbledale Road.
  
- (2) Nothing in Article (1) of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that article for so long as may be necessary:
  - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
  - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any wedding, funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas or water or electricity or any telegraphic line, as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878; or

- (d) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of road.
- (3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- (4) This Order shall come into operation on the 22nd day of May, 1967, and may be cited as "The City Council of Liverpool (Rose Lane) (No Waiting) Order, 1967".
