# (ULLET ROAD/CROXTETH ROAD/SEFTON PARK ROAD) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING, ONE WAY TRAFFIC AND RESTRICTIONS ON DRIVING) ORDER, 1973

The City Council of Liverpool, in exercise of its powers under sections 1(1), (2) and (3) and 84D(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with section 84C (1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1. The Orders specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Order are hereby revoked to the extent specified opposite such Orders in Column 2 of the said Schedule.
- 2. Save as provided in Article 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable or of a traffic warden in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the road, sides of lengths of roads or in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 3. No person shall cause any vehicle proceeding in Windermere Terrace to make a right hand turn into Ullet Road.
- 4/ No person shall cause any vehicle proceeding in Ullet Road to make a left hand turn into Croxteth Road.
- 5. No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in the road or length of road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 3 to this Order in a direction other than that specified in Column 2 of the said Schedule.
- 6. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the road, the sides of lengths of roads or in any of the lengths of roads referred to in that Article, for so long as may be necessary:—
  - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
  - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it is in the service of or employed by the Post Office, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;

- (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any wedding, funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road, sides of lengths of roads or the lengths of roads so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to the said road, sides of lengths of roads or the lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas or water or electricity or any telegraphic line, as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878;
- (e) to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (f) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said road, sides of lengths of roads or the lengths of roads.
- 6. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, or by or under any other enactment.
- 7. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if for the purposes of section 38 of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the Orders revoked by Article 1 of this Order were Acts of Parliament thereby repealed.
- 8. This Order shall come into operation on the 3rd day of September, 1973, and may be cited as The City Council of Liverpool (Ullet Road/Croxteth Road/Sefton Park Road) (Prohibition of Waiting, One Way Traffic and Restrictions on Driving) Order, 1973.
