# THE BOROUGH OF LUTON (STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2009

The Council of the Borough of Luton ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 47, 49 and 53 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-

### PART I

#### **GENERAL**

#### Commencement and Title

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 30<sup>th</sup> March, 2009 and may be cited as the Borough of Luton (Street Parking Places) Order 2009.

# Interpretation

- 2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-
  - "civil enforcement officer" means a civil enforcement officer in relation to parking contraventions, appointed by the council under section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004:
  - "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons)(England)Regulations 2000;
  - "driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person presumed driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;
  - "electronic communications network" has the same meaning as in the Communications Act 2003(c.21)
  - "enactment" means any enactment, whether public, general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment
  - "goods" means goods of any kind whether animate or inanimate and includes postal packets of any description; and "delivering" and "collection" in relation to any goods
  - "goods vehicle" has the same meaning as in Regulation 4 of the Traffic

Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"motor cycle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act of 1984;

"owner" in relation to a vehicle means the person by whom such vehicle is kept which in the case of a vehicle registered under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 (c.22);is presumed (unless the contrary is proved)to be the person in whose name the vehicle is registered,

"parking disc" shall have the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"parking place" means any part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place or any part of the highway designated by this Order as a parking place.;

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than 8 passengers, exclusive of the driver, and not drawing a trailer;

"permitted hours" in relation to a parking place identified by the plans attached to this Order means the periods identified by the plans during which the restrictions imposed by this Order apply in respect of that parking place

"plans" means the plans attached to this Order

"relevant position" in relation to a disabled person's badge and parking disc/clock has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

"standard exemptions" shall mean those exemptions specified in Schedule 1 to this Order, and

#### Reference to enactments

3. Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, reenacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

### Revocations

4. The Orders specified in Schedule 4 to this Order are hereby revoked.

#### PARTII

# AUTHORISATION, DESIGNATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACE

Authorisation and designation of parking places

- 5. (1) Each of the areas of a road identified by the plans attached to this Order as a parking place is authorised as a parking place.
  - (2) Each of the areas of the highway identified by the plans attached to this Order as a parking place, in which vehicles displaying a certain parking permit are exempt from the time limits specified in Article 8 of this Order, is designated as a parking place.
  - (3) Each parking place may be used during the permitted hours, subject to the provisions of this Order.
- 6. Nothing in Article 5 of this Order ;-
  - (a) shall restrict the power of the Council, for preventing obstruction of the streets, by order on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or where the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed, to close any parking place; or
  - (b) shall authorise the use of any part of a road so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by any person entitled to the use thereof, or so as to be a nuisance.

Class of vehicle and position in which to wait in a parking place

- 7. Where by the plans attached to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place:-
  - (a) unless it is of the specified class; or
  - (b) in a position other than that specified.

Period of waiting of vehicle and return to a parking place after leaving

- 8. (1) The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting in relation to that parking place during the permitted hours as identified by the plans attached to this Order.
  - (2) When a vehicle has left a parking place after waiting thereon during the permitted hours the driver thereof shall not, within one hour after

its leaving, permit it to wait again during the permitted hours in a parking place within that road.

Position in which vehicle to stand in a parking place

- 9. Every vehicle left in a parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall stand:-
  - (a) in the case of any parking place the longest side of which is parallel to the kerb so that the longest side of the vehicle is parallel to the kerb; or
  - (b) in the case of any parking place marked at an angle of 90 degrees to the kerb or, where two or more bays are marked in echelon formation set at an angle to the roadside kerb, the vehicle is parked within the confines of the marked bay with its longest side parallel to the longest side of the marked bay (for the purposes of this paragraph "marked bay" means an area within a parking place that is indicated by road markings as being for the leaving of one vehicle only; and
  - (c) so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of a parking place.

Driver not to use parking place so as to cause obstruction or use when closed by the Council

- 10. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place:-
  - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premise adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance; or
  - (b) when for preventing obstruction of the streets the Council shall by order made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that parking place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near the parking place

Driver of a vehicle to stop the engine when in a parking place

11. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.

Vehicle in a parking place not to be used for the sale of goods or services

12. No person shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection

with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

Vehicle displaying a valid disabled persons badge - exemption from time limit

 A vehicle displaying a valid disabled person's badge in the relevant position may be left in a parking place without time limit.

Suspension of a parking place by the Council or the Police

- 14. (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council, or any person duly authorised by the Chief Constable of the Bedfordshire Police, may suspend the use of any parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any "electronic communications network" or traffic sign; or
  - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions.
  - On any suspension of the use of any parking place in accordance with the provision of paragraph (1) of this Article, any person duly authorised by the Council or any person duly authorised by the said Chief Constable or a civil enforcement officer, may indicate that the use of the parking place is suspended by placing within the parking place or adjacent to that parking place appropriate signs in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.

Removal of vehicle left in a parking place in contravention of this order

15. If a vehicle waits in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in this Order, the vehicle may be removed or caused to be removed from that parking place in pursuance of Regulations made under section 99 and 101 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

# Removal of vehicle in emergency

A police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place he thinks fit any vehicle left in any parking place specified in this Order.

#### PART III

## **EXEMPTIONS FOR PARKING PERMIT HOLDERS**

# Interpretation

17 In this part to this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them

"authorised agent" means any organisation or authority authorised by the Council to issue parking permits to an employee, agent, voluntary worker or helper of that organisation or authority for the purpose of enabling that person to carry out their duties as a carer;

"business" means any trade or profession conducted from premises wholly or principally used or adapted for those purposes at premises the postal address of which is in any of the Zones specified in schedule 3 to this order;

"business parking permit" means a parking permit issued under the provisions of Article 21

"carer" means a person who is not a resident but who satisfies the Council that he or she consistently provides a high level of care to a resident or to a child of a resident and that such care is difficult to provide without benefit of the facility to permit a vehicle to wait in a parking place;

"carer's parking permit" means a parking permit issued under the provisions of Article 21

"company car" means a car provided by an employer (including a car under a leasing arrangement) available for the "private use" of a director or employee or a member of his or her family or household but does not include motor cycles, invalid carriages, vans or other commercial vehicles;

"doctor's parking permit" means a parking permit issued under the provisions of Article 21

"dual purpose vehicle" has the same meaning as in Schedule 6 to the Act of 1984:

"employee" means any person employed by a business;

"fully registered medical practitioner" has the same meaning as in the Medical Act 1983:

"heavy commercial vehicle" means (a) a vehicle as defined in Section 138 of the Act of 1984 which has an operating weight exceeding 7.5 tonnes; or (b) a goods vehicle with an unladen weight exceeding 3.05 tonnes;

"parking permit", means either a business parking permit, a residents parking permit, a carer's parking permit, a resident's visitor's parking permit or a doctor's parking permit any permit issued under the provisions of Article 21 of this Order;

"parking permit holder" means a person to whom a parking permit has been issued:

"parking place" means any parking place in any road identified by the plans attached to this Order and which is signed as a place to which a parking permit applies;

"particulars" means;

- (a) in relation to a parking permit, other than a doctor's parking permit, displayed on a vehicle, those particulars specified in Article 26 of this Order which relate to the type of parking permit displayed, other than the particulars specified in paragraph (1)(d) or (2)(c) of that Article
- (b) in relation to a doctor's permit the following particulars,
  - (1) Expiry Date of permit
  - (2) Permit number
  - (3) Bay location
  - (4) Vehicle Registration

"resident" means a person whose residence is at premises the postal address of which is in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order; and

"resident's parking permit" means a parking permit issued under the provisions of Article 21(3) (a) following an application from a resident;

"resident's visitor's parking permit" means a parking permit issued under the provisions of Article 21 (5)

"visitor" means any person who is a visitor to a resident and where that person is not a resident nor an employee of a business.

Exemption from time limit of vehicle displaying a valid parking permit

Nothing in Article 8 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle waiting in a parking place, provide that the vehicle displays in accordance with Article 20

of this Order a valid parking permit relating to the zone identified on the plans attached to this Order in relation to that parking place..

Designation and use of resident permit holders' only parking place

- 18a (1) Each area on a Highway which is indicated as a Resident Permit Holders' Only Parking Place by signs and markings in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 and which is identified as a Resident Permit Holders' Only Parking Place by the plans attached to this Order
  - (2) Save as provided by paragraph (3) of this Article the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a parking place which is indicated as a Resident Permit Holders' Parking Place in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article
  - (3) Nothing in paragraph (2) of this Article shall make it unlawful for any vehicle to be left in any Parking Place which is indicated as a Resident Permit Holders' Only Parking Place in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article if the use of that Parking Place has not been suspended and if
    - (a) the vehicle displays in accordance with Article 20 of this Order a valid Resident's Parking Permit issued under the provisions of Article 21
    - (b) the vehicle is left in compliance with Schedule 1 Standard Exemptions 1 (a) (ii) (b) and (c), 2 (a), 3 (ii)
- 18b (1) Each area on a Highway which is indicated as a Business Permit Holders Parking Place by signs and markings in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Dir4ections 2002 and which is identified as Business Permit Holder Parking Place by the plans attached to this Order
  - (2) Save as provided by paragraph (3) of this Article the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a parking place which is indicated as a Business Permit Holders Parking Place in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article.

- (3) Nothing in paragraph (2) of this Article shall make it unlawful for any vehicle to be left in any Parking Place which is indicated as a Business Permit Holder Parking Place in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article if the use of the Parking Place has not been suspended and if
  - (a) the vehicle displays in accordance with Article 20 of this Order a valid Business Parking Permit issued under the provisions of Article 21. or
  - (b) the vehicle is left in compliance with Schedule 1 Standard Exemptions 1 (a) (ii) (b) and (c), 2 (a), 3(ii)

# Designation and use of doctors' parking places

- 19 (1) Each area on a highway which is indicated as a Doctor's Parking Place by signs and markings in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 and which is identified as a doctors parking place by the plans attached to this Order,
  - (2) Save as provided by paragraph (3) of this Article the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a parking place which is indicated as a Doctor's Parking Place in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article.
  - (3) Nothing in paragraph (2) of this Article shall make it unlawful for any vehicle to be left in any parking place which is indicated as a Doctor's Parking Place in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article if the use of that parking place has not been suspended and if
    - (a) the vehicle displays in accordance with article 20 of this Order a valid doctor's parking permit issued under the provisions of Article 21 of this Order; or
    - (b) the vehicle is left in a parking place in compliance with any of the standard exemptions 1(a) (ii), (b) and (c), 2(a), 3(ii).

# Display of valid parking permits

- 20 (1) a parking permit issued in accordance with the provisions of this Order shall be displayed:-
  - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen with the obverse side facing forwards; and

- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle, so that all the particulars on the parking permit are readily visible from outside the vehicle and from the front or near side of the vehicle
- (2) In addition to the requirements of paragraph (1) of this Article, a resident's visitor's permit shall in be displayed in the manner described on the permit.

Applications for resident's, business, resident's visitor's, carer's or doctor's parking permits

- 21 (1) Any person who is:-
  - (a) a resident who is the owner of a passenger vehicle, a dual purpose vehicle, a goods vehicle (other than a heavy commercial vehicle) or a motor cycle, or who is provided with a company car, may apply to the Council for the issue of a residents parking permit in respect of that vehicle, or
  - (b) a resident acting on behalf of a visitor who is the owner of a passenger vehicle, a dual purpose vehicle, a goods vehicle (other than a heavy commercial vehicle) or a motor cycle may apply to the Council for the issue of a Residents' Visitors Parking permit in respect of that vehicle, or
  - (c) an employee of a business the postal address of which is in any of the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2 to this Order and (with the exception of Zone HT and Zone KC) who is the owner of a passenger vehicle, a dual purpose vehicle, a goods vehicle (other than a heavy commercial vehicle) of a motor cycle, may apply to the Council for the issue of a parking permit for the leaving of that vehicle, or
  - (d) a carer who is the owner of a passenger vehicle, a dual purpose vehicle, a goods vehicle (other than a heavy commercial vehicle) or a motor cycle, may apply to the Council or to an authorised agent where appropriate for the issue of a carers parking permit in respect of that vehicle, or
  - (e) a fully registered medical practitioner who is the user of a passenger vehicle, a dual purpose vehicle, a goods vehicle (other than a heavy commercial vehicle) or a motor cycle, may apply to the Council for the issue of a Doctors permit in respect of vehicles used by him.

and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council or as appropriate from an authorised agent and shall include the information required by such form and shall be accompanied by a remittance for such charge specified in Article 27 (1) of this Order as is appropriate in respect of the parking permit for which application is being made.

- (2) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a parking permit to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a parking permit made to them as they may reasonably require to verify any information given to them.
- (3) The Council,
  - (a) upon receipt of an application from a resident made under the provisions of paragraph (1)(a) of this Article and the appropriate charge specified in Article 27(1) of this Order, and upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and the owner of a vehicle of a class specified in paragraph (1)(a) of this Article, shall issue to the applicant one resident's parking permit for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking place to which such permit is being issued, by the owner of the vehicle or by any other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward.
  - (b) upon receipt of an application from an employee of a business made under the provisions of paragraph (1)(c) of this Article and the appropriate charge specified in Article 27 (1) of this Order, and upon being satisfied that the applicant is an employee of a business and the owner of a vehicle of a class specified in paragraph (1)(c) of this Article, shall issue to the applicant one business parking permit for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking place to which such permit is being issued, by the owner of the vehicle or by any other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward
  - or an authorised agent, upon receipt of an application from a carer made under the provisions of paragraph (1)(b) of this Article and the appropriate charge specified in Article 27(1) of this Order, and upon being satisfied that the applicant is an carer and the owner of a vehicle of a class specified in paragraph (1)(b) of this Article, shall issue to the applicant one carer parking permit for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking place to which such permit is being issued, by the owner of the vehicle or by any other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward.

- (4) The Council shall not issue a resident's parking permit or a business parking permit, neither shall the Council nor an authorised agent issue a carer's permit to any applicant for a resident's parking permit, a business parking permit or a carer's parking permit, if that permit would be valid for any period during which any other resident's business or carer's parking permit issued to that applicant is or would be valid.
- Resident visitors parking permits shall be issued by the Council in books of five permits only and on receipt of an application for a resident's visitor's parking permit made under the provisions of paragraph (1)(b) of this Article and on payment of the appropriate charge specified in Article 27(1) of this Order and on being satisfied that the applicant is a resident shall issue to that applicant a book of five resident's visitors' parking permits for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking place to which such parking permit relates of the vehicle in respect of which such permit is issued, by the owner of the vehicle or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward.
- The Council upon receipt of an application from a fully registered medical practitioner and upon receipt of the appropriate charge specified in Article 27(1) of this Order, may issue to the applicant a doctor's parking permit or permits for the leaving in the parking place specified on that doctors parking permit or permits of such vehicles as they are satisfied are used by fully registered medical practitioners who are liable to be called, of necessities, to emergencies away from the surgery or consulting room shown on such application to the extent that the need for special parking arrangements is justified and for whom no suitable alternative parking facility is available within a reasonable distance.
- For the purpose of determining a parking place to which such a permit relates, as specified in this Article each parking permit shall have theron a letter indicating a zone and that parking permit shall relate to any parking place identified on the plans as being in that Zone and adjacent to which there is placed on the highway a traffic sign showing the same letter indicating the Zone.

# Surrender and withdrawal of permits

22 (1) A parking permit holder may surrender a permit to the Council or to the issuing authorised agent at any time and shall surrender a parking permit to the Council or to the issuing authorised agent on

the occurrence of any of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article.

- The Council or the issuing authorised agent may, by notice in writing served on the parking permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the parking permit or at any other address believed to be that person's residence, withdraw a parking permit if it appears to the Council or to the authorised agent that any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article has occurred and the parking permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council within seventy two hours of the receipt of such notice.
- (3) The events referred to in paragraph (2) of this Article are:-
  - (a) the parking permit holder ceasing to be a resident or an employee of a business in the Zone for which the parking permit was issued;
  - (b) the parking permit holder ceasing to be a carer in the Zone for which the parking permit was issued;
  - (c) the parking permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the parking permit was issued;
  - (d) the vehicle in respect of which such parking permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of the class specified in Article 21 of this Order;
  - (e) the issue of a duplicate parking permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 21 of this Order;
  - (f) the issue of a revised or a duplicate doctors' parking permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 30 of this Order;
  - (g) the vehicle or any vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued ceasing to be used by a fully registered medical practitioner who is liable to be called, of necessity, to emergencies away from the surgery or consulting room shown on the application for that permit to the extent that the need for special parking arrangements can be justified;
  - (h) the withdrawal of a permit under paragraph (2) of this Article;
  - (i) the revocation of the designation of the doctors' parking place in respect of which the parking permit was issued;

- (j) the permit ceasing to be valid pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (2) of Article 23 of this Order.
- Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall affect the validity of or require the surrender of or enable the Council to withdraw the permit or not renew it on the grounds that the event set out in paragraph (3) (g) of Article 22 of this Order has occurred if the parking permit holder has duly applied to the Council for the permit to be amended pursuant to Article 31 (1) of this Order.
  - Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Article a parking permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified thereon (which period shall not exceed a period of 12 months from the beginning of the month during which it first became valid) or on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of Article 22 of this Order or of the event described in paragraph (3) of this Article whichever is the earlier.
  - Where a parking permit is issued to any person upon receipt of a cheque or upon payment by credit card or debit card and the cheque or credit card or debit card payment is subsequently dishonoured the parking permit shall cease to be valid and the Council or the authorised agent may by notice in writing served on the person to whom such parking permit was issued at the address shown by that person on the application for the parking permit or at any other address believed to be that person's residence require that person to surrender the parking permit to the Council within seventy-two hours of the receipt of the notice.

Information required by the Council of a permit holder

The Council may at any time require a parking permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of any parking permit issued by them as they may reasonably require.

Replacement of lost or damaged permits

If a parking permit is mutilated or defaced or the figure or particulars on it have become illegible or the colour of the parking permit has become altered by fading or otherwise the parking permit holder shall surrender it to the Council or to the authorised agent and may apply to the Council or to the authorised agent for the issue of a duplicate parking permit and the Council or the authorised agent upon the receipt of the parking permit if such receipt is accompanied by an application for a duplicate parking permit shall issue a duplicate parking permit so marked and on any second or subsequent application for a duplicate parking permit the permit holder shall make payment of a fee of £5.00.

- (2) If a parking permit is lost or destroyed the parking permit holder may apply to the Council or to the authorised agent for the issue of a duplicate parking permit and the Council or the authorised agent upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction shall issue a duplicate parking permit so marked and on any second or subsequent application for a duplicate parking permit the permit holder shall make payment of a fee of £5.00.
- (3) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a revised permit or a duplicate parking permit and an application for a duplicate parking permit as if it were a parking permit or as the case may be an application therefore.

Form of residents', resident's visitors', business and carer's permits

- 26 (1) A resident's parking permit, a business parking permit or a carers parking permit shall include the following particulars:-
  - (a) the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the parking permit has been issued;
  - (b) the period during which subject to the provisions of Article 23(2) of this Order the parking permit shall remain valid;
  - (c) an authentication that the parking permit has been issued by the Council or by an authorised agent;
  - (d) directions as to the manner in which the parking permit should be used and displayed in accordance with this Order, and
  - (e) be clearly marked to identify the Zone or location within which the parking permit shall be valid.
  - (2) A residents' visitors parking permit shall be in the form of a scratchcard which shall include the following particulars:-
    - (a) the serial number of issue;
    - (b) scratch off panels showing the date, day, month and year by which the driver of the vehicle can validate the permit;
    - (c) directions as to the manner in which the parking permit should be used and displayed in accordance with this Order, and
    - (d) shall be clearly marked to identify the Zone within which the parking permit shall be valid.

(3) A resident's visitor's parking permit shall not be valid if more than one date, day, month or year are scratched off or if the date, day, month and year which are scratched off do not accord with the date, day, month and year on which the vehicle is parked.

Charges for the issue of permits and the variation of charges by notice

- 27 (1) The charges for the issue of a resident's parking permit, resident's visitor's parking permits, a business parking permit, a carer's parking permit, and a Doctor's Parking Permit, shall be the amounts specified in relation thereto in Schedule 3 to this Order.
  - (2) The amount of any charge due under this Order may be varied by the Council giving notice in accordance with Section 46A of the Act.
  - (3) The issue of a resident's parking permit for a motor cycle shall be exempt from any charge.

Charge for a permit payable in accordance with Article 21(1)

The charge in respect of the issue of a parking permit for the leaving of a vehicle in a parking place shall be payable in accordance with the provisions of Article 21(1) of this Order.

Eligibility for refund on surrender of resident's, business and carers/doctors permits

- 29 (1) A parking permit holder who surrenders a resident's parking permit or a carer's permit to the Council shall not be entitled to a refund of the charge or any part of the charge paid in respect of the issue of that parking permit.
  - (2) A business/doctor's parking permit holder who surrenders a parking permit shall be entitled to a refund of one twelfth of the charge for that parking permit in respect of each complete period of one month remaining outstanding calculated from the expiry date of that parking permit.

Amendment of doctor's parking place so as to apply to other or additional vehicles

The holder of a doctor's parking permit may at any time apply to the Council for a permit issued to him to be amended so as to relate to any other vehicle or any additional vehicle or both being in either case a vehicle which is used by a fully registered medical practitioner who is liable to be called, of necessity, to emergencies away from the surgery or consulting room shown on the application for that permit to the extent that the need for special parking arrangements can be justified.

(2) Upon receipt of an application pursuant to paragraph (1) of this Article and of the relevant permit, the Council may amend the permit accordingly or to such lesser extent as they think fit, or, at their discretion, issue a revised doctor's permit, and if a revised permit is so issued, the permit shall become invalid and shall be surrendered to the Council.

### PART IV

#### PARKING PLACES FOR DISABLED PERSONS

# Interpretation

In this part to this Order "disabled persons' parking place" means any part of a road authorised by this part of this Order to be used as parking place for a a vehicle displaying a valid disabled person's badge.

# Authorisation of disabled person's parking place

- 33 (1) Each part of a road identified by the plans attached to this Order as a disabled person's parking place is authorised to be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, as a parking place for a vehicle displaying in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge on such days and during such hours as identified by the said plans.
  - (2) The driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in any disabled person's parking place identified by the said plans unless it is a vehicle displaying in the relevant position a valid disabled persons' badge.
  - (3) The Council may at any time require a disabled badge holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of any disabled badge issued by them as they may reasonably require.

# Exemptions

Nothing in Article 33 of this Order shall make it unlawful for any vehicle to wait in a disabled person's parking place, in compliance with any of the standard exemptions 1(a)(i) to (iv),(b), (c), 2(a), (b) and (c).

# Prohibited use of a disabled person's parking place

No person shall use any part of a disabled persons parking place or any vehicle left in a disabled person's parking place for sleeping or camping or cooking.

### PART V

#### AMBULANCE PARKING PLACES

# Interpretation

36 In this part to this Order:-

"ambulance" shall mean a vehicle which is constructed or adapted for, and used for no other purpose than, the carriage of elderly or disabled persons and is readily identifiable as a vehicle used for the carriage of such persons by virtue of being marked "Ambulance" on both sides or in the alternative bears the Council's emblem or device.

"ambulance parking place" shall mean a parking place which is identified by the plans attached this Order and which is marked by signs and road markings in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 as being for the use of ambulances.

No vehicle other than an ambulance to wait in an ambulance parking place

No person shall cause or permit any vehicle other than an ambulance to wait in an ambulance parking place.

Time limit on period of waiting in an ambulance parking place

The driver of an ambulance shall not permit it to wait in an ambulance parking place identified by the plans attached to this Order for longer than any maximum permitted period for waiting in relation to that parking place which may be specified by the said plans and when a vehicle is left in a parking place for which a maximum period of waiting is so specified, the driver thereof shall not, within one hour of its leaving permit it to wait again upon that parking place.

Driver of an ambulance waiting in a parking place not to prevent access to premises nor to use parking place when closed by the Council by order

- 39 A driver of an ambulance shall not use the ambulance parking place:-
  - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance:
  - (b) when for preventing obstruction of the street the Council shall, by order made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed, have closed the ambulance parking place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near the ambulance parking place.

Driver of ambulance to stop engine in an ambulance parking place

The driver of an ambulance using an ambulance parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the ambulance parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the ambulance parking place.

# Exemptions

41 Nothing in Article 37 of this Order shall make it unlawful for any vehicle to wait in the ambulance parking place for so long as may be necessary in compliance with any of the standard exemptions 1(a) (i) to (iv), (b) and (c).
