CITY OF MANCHESTER (PENCROFT WAY AND GUILDHALL CLOSE, HULME)
(PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING)
ORDER 1993

The Council of the City of Manchester in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (the "Act"), and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for the County of Greater Manchester in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

1(1) In this Order:-

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, 125 millimetres square, but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-

(a) a disabled person's badge issued before 2nd March 1992 in the relevant position if:-

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; or

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle; and

(b) a disabled person's badge issued after 2nd March 1992 in the relevant position if:-

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; or

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle

(c) a parking disc in the relevant position if,

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or

- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.
- (3) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2 Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait (a) at any time on the sides of lengths of road specified in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order, and (b) between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive on the sides of lengths of road specified in Part 2 of the Schedule to this Order.
- 3(1) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of lengths of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) in the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of lengths of road; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair, in or in land adjacent to the said sides of lengths of road, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (e) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said sides of lengths of road;

- (f) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said sides of lengths of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any funeral;
- (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
- (h) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle.
- (2) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the sides of lengths of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of length of road on the same day).
- 4 The Greater Manchester County (Pencroft Way, Manchester) (Restriction of Waiting) (City) Order 1985 is hereby revoked.
- 5 This Order shall come into operation on **8th March 1993** and may be cited as the City of Manchester (Pencroft Way and Guildhall Close, Hulme) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1993.

SCHEDULEPart 1

Pencroft Way, Hulme

both sides from Denmark Road
for a distance of 15 metres
in a northerly direction.

both sides from a point 5
metres south of Guildhall
Close to a point 5 metres
north of Guildhall Close.

both sides from Burlington
Street for a distance of 15
metres in a southerly
direction.

Guildhall Close, Hulme

both sides from Pencroft Way
for a distance of 15 metres
in a westerly direction.

Part 2

Pencroft Way, Hulme

east side from a point 15 metres north of Denmark Street to a point 5 metres south of Guildhall Close.

east side from a point 5 metres north of Guildhall Close to a point 15 metres south of Burlington Street.

west side from a point 5 metres south of Guildhall Close for a distance of 30 metres in a southerly direction.

west side from a point 128 metres south of Burlington Street for a distance of 50 metres in a northerly direction.

Guildhall Close, Hulme

both sides (except for a length on the north side from a point 45 metres west of Pencroft Way for a distance of 50 metres in a westerly direction). The whole of the cul-de-sac at the western end is included.
