CITY OF MANCHESTER (ROCHDALE ROAD AND ADJACENT STREETS, COLLYHURST) (REVOCATION, PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND DESIGNATED PARKING PLACE) ORDER 2006

The Council of the City of Manchester in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 32(1) and 35(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for the County of Greater Manchester in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order: -

INTERPRETATION

- 1. In this Order: -
 - (1) "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled person's badge being a vehicle which, immediately before or after any period of waiting allowed by virtue of a provision of a kind required by the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 to be included in an order under the Act, has been or is to be used for carrying disabled persons as passengers;

"driver" in relation to a vehicle left at or waiting at a parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left at or is waiting at the parking place;

"goods" means goods of any kind whether animate or inanimate and includes postal packets of any description and "delivering and collecting" in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage or goods or burden of any description or a trailer so constructed or adapted;

"large passenger carrying vehicle" means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted to carry more than 12 seated passengers in addition to the driver and which is not a public service vehicle;

"maximum gross weight" has the same meaning as in Regulation 4 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"parking place" means the parts of road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 7 to this Order to be used as a parking place and unless otherwise so specified bounded on one side by the edge of the carriageway and on the other side by a road marking complying with Diagram 1028.3 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, 125 millimetres square, coloured blue and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins, which has not ceased to be valid;

"postal packet" has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000;

"trailer" means a vehicle other than a motor vehicle;

"traffic sign" means any sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised under or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under Section 64 of the Act of 1984.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if:-
 - (i) the badge is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle; or
 - (ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle;

so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle;

- (b) a parking disc in the relevant position if:-
 - (i) the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle; or
 - (ii) where the vehicle does not have a dashboard or facia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle;

so that, when marked to show the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

REVOCATION OF EXISTING ORDERS

2. The Orders specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Order are revoked to the extent as specified in Column 2 of Schedule 1 to this Order

NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

3. Save as provided in Article 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform, a parking attendant or a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.

DAYTIME NO WAITING

- 4. Save as provided in Article 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform, a parking attendant or a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle: -
 - (a) to wait between the hours of 8.00am to 6.00pm on Monday to Friday inclusive and between the hours of 8.00am to 12.30pm on Saturday on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 3 to this Order;
 - (b) to wait between the hours of 8.00am to 6.00pm on Monday to Saturday inclusive on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 4 to this Order;

(c) to wait between the hours of 7.00am to 7.00pm on Monday to Friday inclusive on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 5 to this Order.

PEAK TIME NO WAITING

5. Save as provided in Article 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform, a parking attendant or a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 7.00am to 10.00am and 4.00pm to 7.00pm on Monday to Friday inclusive on the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 6 to this Order.

EXEMPTIONS - GENERAL

- 6. (1) Nothing in Articles 3, 4 and 5 of this Order shall prevent any person to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the lengths of road referred to in those Articles for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair, in or on land adjacent to the said lengths of road, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets;
 - the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of road;
 - (f) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any funeral;
 - (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
 - (h) goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle.

EXEMPTION FOR DISABLED PERSONS VEHICLES

- (2) Nothing in Articles 3 and 4 of this Order shall prevent any person to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle, which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver or the person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on any of the lengths of road referred to in those Articles for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same length of road on the same day).
- (3) Nothing in Article 5 of this Order shall apply to a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge.

DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACE

- Fach area of road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 7 to this Order is authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for use by such classes of vehicles, in such positions, on such days and during such hours and within such time limits as specified in Columns 2, 3, 4 and 5 of Schedule 7 to this Order.
- 8. Save as provided in Article 16 of this Order where in Schedule 7 to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the length of road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 7 to this Order: -
 - (a) unless it is of the specified class; and
 - (b) is in position wholly within the limits of the parking place.

CONDITIONS OF USE

- 9. The driver of a vehicle shall not use the parking place so as to unreasonably prevent access to any premises adjoining the road or the use of the road by any other person, or so as to be a nuisance.
- 10. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine again except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from that parking place.
- 11. No person shall use the vehicle whilst it is in a parking place in connection with the sale of any article to persons on or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
- 12. When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of this Order, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from the parking place; PROVIDED THAT when a vehicle is waiting in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 8(b) of this Order, a person authorised in that behalf may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that it shall comply with that provision.

- 13. Any person removing the vehicle or altering its position by virtue of Article 12 of this Order, may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think fit and take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position as the case may be.
- 14. When a person removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 12 of this Order, he shall make such arrangements as may be necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.
- 15. Any person authorised in that behalf by the Council may in the case of emergency move or cause to be moved to any place he thinks fit any vehicle left in a parking place.

EXEMPTIONS

- 16. Notwithstanding the forgoing provisions of this Order, any vehicle may wait in any part of the parking place, if the use has not been suspended and: -
 - (a) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
 - (c) the vehicle is being used for the fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic; or
 - (e) the vehicle is waiting:
 - i. while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the parking places in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded there from are being delivered; or
 - ii. while postal packets are being collected for loading on the vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting or having been so collected are being loaded thereon;
 - (f) in connection with any building operation or demolition in or adjacent to the parking place, the maintenance, cleansing, improvement or reconstruction of the roads authorised to be used as authorised parking places or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to any of the said parking places of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.

SUSPENSIONS

- 17. Any person authorised by the Council, or a police constable in uniform may suspend, subject to such conditions or exceptions as he considers appropriate, the use of a parking place or any part thereof, whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary: -
 - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - (b) for the convenience of the occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on the occasion of:
 - i. the removal of furniture from one building to another; or
 - ii. at times of weddings or funerals;
 - (c) for any special occasion, except for weddings and funerals, or on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street would be thronged or obstructed;
 - (d) for any of the purposes specified in Article 16 (f) of this Order.
- 18. Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Article 17 of this Order, shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to the parking place, or any part thereof, use of which is suspended, a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is not permitted.
- 19. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a parking place or any part thereof, as the case may be during such period as there is in or adjacent to the parking place a traffic sign placed in pursuance of Article 18 of this Order.

COMMENCEMENT

20. This Order shall come into operation on 6th November 2006 and may be cited as the City Of Manchester (Rochdale Road and Adjacent Streets, Collyhurst) (Revocation, Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Designated Parking Place) Order 2006.


