THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MILTON KEYNES (VARIOUS ROADS, BEANHILL) (PARKING AND WAITING RESTRICTIONS) ORDER 2011

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The Council of the Borough of Milton Keynes ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2), 4(2) and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order:-

PART 1

IMPLEMENTATION, CITATION AND DEFINITIONS

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the 17th day of November 2011 and may be cited as "The Council of the Borough of Milton Keynes (Various Roads, Beanhill) (Parking and Waiting Restrictions) Order 2011".
- 2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:-

"Civil Enforcement Officer" has the same meaning as in Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act of 2004;

"delivering" and "collecting" in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"disabled persons' badge" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"disabled persons' vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"postal packets" has the same meaning as in Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000;

"prescribed hours" means those hours stated in Schedules 2 and 4 to this Order;

"restricted road" means a road which is subject to parking and waiting restrictions;

"road" means a highway and any other road to which the public has access;

"statutory undertaker" has the same meaning as in Section 329 of the Highways Act 1980;

"telecommunications apparatus" has the same meaning as in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under, Section 64 of the Act of 1984;

3. Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.

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4. The plans annexed to this Order identify the lengths of roads subject to this Order, provided that where there is any inconsistency between the plans and the Schedules it is the wording of the Schedules which shall prevail.

PART 2

PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING

- 5. No person shall except with the permission or under the direction of a police officer in uniform, traffic warden or a Civil Enforcement Officer (CEO), cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 hereto.
- 6. No person shall except with the permission or under the direction of a police officer in uniform, traffic warden or a CEO, cause or permit any vehicle to wait during the prescribed hours from Monday to Friday in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 hereto.
- 7. No person shall except with the permission or under the direction of a police officer in uniform, traffic warden or CEO cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 am and 6.00 pm from Monday to Saturday in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 3 hereto:-
 - (1) for a longer period than 1 hour; or
 - (2) if a period less than 2 hours has elapsed since the termination during the said hour of the last period of waiting (if any) by that vehicle in the said lengths of roads.

Any vehicle which is present in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 3 hereto at the commencement of the hours of operation of any restrictions imposed by this Order shall be deemed to have been left in those lengths of roads at the commencement of that period of operation of the restriction in question.

- 8. Nothing in Articles 5, 6 and 7 above shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of roads specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 for so long as may be necessary to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle.
- 9. Nothing in Articles 5, 6 and 7 above shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 for so long as may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle.
- 10. Nothing in Articles 5, 6 and 7 above shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 for so long as may be necessary:-

- (1) when the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop or is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident or is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control;
- (2) for a vehicle to wait whilst any gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises to which the vehicle requires access or from which it has emerged is being opened or closed, if it is not reasonably practicable for the vehicle to wait outside otherwise than in a length of road specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this Order while such gate or other barrier is being opened or closed;
- (3) to enable a taxi to wait upon any hackney carriage stand;
- (4) to enable the vehicle if it cannot reasonably be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in connection with any of the following:
 - a) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - c) the laying, erection or repair of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or any telecommunication system defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - d) use in the service of any undertaker, the Environment Agency or any public authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - e) the vehicle, being a bus, to wait in a bus stop area;
 - f) in connection with any wedding or funeral;
 - g) use for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
 - use for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined by section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - i) the vehicle being specially constructed or adapted for the delivery or collection of money or valuable securities to be used for those purposes in relation to premises in the vicinity.
- 11. In accordance with the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000, nothing in Articles 5, 6 and 7 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays a disabled person's badge and parking disc in the relevant position in accordance with Articles 12 and 13 hereof to wait for a period not exceeding 3 hours in a length of road specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 hereto (provided the period of exempted waiting does not begin less than one

hour after a previous period of exempted waiting by the same vehicle in the same road on the same day).

- 12. For the purposes of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position under the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 if:-
 - (1) the badge is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle; or
 - (2) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle.
- 13. For the purposes of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a parking disc in the relevant position under the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 if:
 - (1) the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle, so that, when marked to show the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle; or
 - (2) where the vehicle does not have a dashboard or facia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle, so that, when marked to show the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle.

PART 3

DISABLED PERSONS' PARKING PLACES

- 14. (1) The lengths of road specified in Schedule 4 to this Order are authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Part of the Order, during the prescribed hours as a parking place for the class of vehicle specified in Article 11.
 - (2) No vehicle other than the class specified in Article 11 shall park in the parking places specified in Schedule 4 to this Order.
- 15. The parking places specified in Schedule 4 to this Order may be used for the leaving of a vehicle displaying a disabled persons badge in the relevant position.

- 16. The limits of a disabled persons' parking place and the limits of any access way in a disabled persons' parking place shall be indicated by the Council on the road by the appropriate traffic signs and any vehicle standing in a disabled persons' parking space shall stand wholly within the limits so marked.
- 17. The driver of a vehicle using a disabled persons' parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking space, and shall not start the engine of the vehicle except:
 - (1) for loading or unloading, or
 - (2) when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
- 18. No person shall use a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge whilst it is in a disabled persons' parking place in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near that parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services, provided that nothing in this article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge if the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected.
- 19. (1) When a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge is left in a disabled persons' parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in Part 3 of this Order a person authorised in that behalf may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from the parking place.
 - (2) A police officer in uniform, traffic warden or CEO may, in cases of emergency, move or cause to be moved, to any place he sees fit, any vehicle left in a disabled persons' parking place.
 - (3) When a vehicle displaying a disabled persons badge is waiting in a disabled persons' parking place in a position which contravenes the provisions of Article 16 a person authorised in that behalf may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.
 - Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of paragraphs (1), (2) and (3) of this article may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such manner as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or to alter its position as the case may be.
 - (5) When a person authorised in that behalf removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge from a disabled persons' parking place by virtue of paragraphs (1) and (2) of this article he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably

necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

- 20. (1) Any person authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a disabled persons' parking place or any part thereof whenever and for such duration as he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus or traffic sign;
 - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
 - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
 - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions;
 - (2) A police constable in uniform, traffic warden or CEO may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a disabled persons' parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - (3) Without prejudice and in addition to all other enabling powers the Council shall have the power from time to time as it deems appropriate to close or suspend for as long as it considers necessary the use of any disabled persons' parking place for the purpose of enabling such parking place to be used by exhibition or public information vehicles of official or quasi official authorities or bodies whose contents are intended to be and are made available for inspection by and for the public without any charge of any kind being made to the public.

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PART 4

ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS

- 21. The Council shall, on or in the vicinity of a restricted road;-
 - Highlight each restricted area with notices, signs and road surface markings in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions Act 2002;
 - (2) Maintain and from time to time alter the said notices, signs and roadsurface markings;
 - (3) Carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purpose of the satisfactory operation of a restricted road.
- 22. The Council shall appoint Civil Enforcement Officers (CEOs) whose duty it shall be to patrol and enforce the waiting and parking restrictions imposed by the Articles of this Order.

SCHEDULE 1

NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

- NW2 From a point approximately 21.4 metres north-east of its junction with Maslin Drive, continuing for a distance of approximately 30 metres in a south-westerly then north-westerly direction.
- NW3 From a point 32.7 metres south-west of a point in line with the south-west kerb line of Saxon Street (V7), continuing for a distance of 64 metres in a south-westerly direction.
- NW4 From a point in line with the centre boundary line of numbers 1 and 2 Dodkin, continuing for a distance of approximately 23.3 metres in a south-westerly then south-easterly direction.
- NW5 From its junction with Saxon Street (V7), continuing for a distance of approximately 59 metres in a south-westerly direction.
- NW6 From a point 99 metres south-west of its junction with Saxon Street (V7), continuing for a distance of 7 metres in a south-westerly direction.
- NW7 From a point 71 metres north-east of its junction with Maslin Drive, continuing for a distance of 11.2 metres in a north-easterly direction.
- NW8 From a point 31.7 metres north-east of its junction with Maslin Drive, continuing for a distance of 9 metres in a north-easterly direction.

- NW9 From a point 16.9 metres north-east of its junction with Maslin Drive, continuing for a distance of 10.3 metres in a north-easterly direction.
- NW10 From a point 10 metres north-east of its junction with Maslin Drive, continuing for a distance of 16.7 metres in a south-westerly and then north-westerly direction.
- NW11 From a point 23.3 metres south-west of a point in line with the south-west kerb line of Saxon Street (V7), continuing for a distance of 30 metres in a south-westerly direction.
- NW12 From a point 7.4 metres south-west of the centre boundary line of Numbers 1 and 2 Wastel, continuing for a distance of 16.4 metres in a south-westerly and then south-easterly direction.

SCHEDULE 2


NO WAITING BETWEEN 8.00 AM AND 6.00 PM MONDAY TO FRIDAY

- NW13 From a point in line with the centre boundary line of Numbers 1 and 2 Dodkin, continuing for a distance of 61.7metres in a north-easterly direction.
- NW14 From a point 59 metres south-west of its junction with Saxon Street (V7), continuing for a distance of 40 metres in a south-westerly direction.
- NW15 From a point 40 metres north-east of its junction with Maslin Drive, continuing for a distance of 30.5 metres in a north-easterly direction.
- NW16 From a point 10 metres north-east of its junction with Maslin Drive, continuing for a distance of 6.9 metres in a north-easterly direction.
- NW17 From a point 7.4 metres south-west of the centre boundary line of Numbers 1 and 2 Wastel, continuing for a distance of 126 metres in a north-easterly direction.


SCHEDULE 3
