THE MOLE VALLEY DISTRICT COUNCIL (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 1997

The Mole Valley District Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Section 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act, and of all other enabling powers, with the consent of the Surrey County Council in accordance with Section 39(3) of the Act and after consulting the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order :-

PART I

GENERAL

Commencement and Citation

1. (1) This Order shall come into operation on the *2nd* day of *June* 1997 and may be cited as the Mole Valley District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1997.
- (2) The Mole Valley District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1990, the Mole Valley District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) (Amendment No. 1) Order 1990, the Mole Valley District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) (Amendment No.2) Order 1991 and the Mole Valley District (Off-Street Parking Places) (Amendment No.3) Order 1993 are hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretation

2. (1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-
 - 'driver', in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;
 - 'parking place', means any area of land specified by name in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order provided by the Council under Section 32(1) of the Act for use as a parking place and includes the means of access thereto and egress therefrom.
 - 'parking space', means any part of a parking place marked out, by means of white lines or otherwise, for the leaving of a vehicle;
 - 'parking attendant', means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place;
 - 'invalid carriage', 'motor car', 'motor cycle', and 'trailer' have respectively the same meanings as in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
 - 'goods vehicle', means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of and description, or a trailer so constructed or adapted;

'charging hours', in relation to a parking place means the period during which a charge for parking is made, as specified in Column 4 of the Schedule to this Order;

'ticket machine', means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the Secretary of State for the Environment for the purpose of this Order, being apparatus designed to issue parking tickets indicating the payment of a charge and the date and time at which the charge was paid;

'excess charge', means an additional amount of money, payable in the circumstances set out in Article 28(1) of this Order, as specified in Column 6 of the Schedule to this Order.

PART II

USE OF PARKING PLACES

Use of Land and Parking Places

3. Each area of land specified by name in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such classes of vehicles, on such days and during such hours and on payment of such charges as are specified in relation to that area in Columns 2-6 of the said Schedule.
4. Where in the Schedule to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place unless it is of the class so specified.
5. The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place other than in a parking space and for this purpose every part of the vehicle must be within the limits of the parking space.
6. (1) The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in Column 4 of the Schedule to this Order in relation to that parking place.

(2) When a vehicle has left a parking place after waiting therein the driver thereof shall not within one hour after its leaving permit it to wait again in that parking place.
7. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in that parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle within or to depart from the parking place.
8. No person shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article (including the vehicle itself) to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
9. The driver of a vehicle shall not permit that vehicle to wait in a parking place unless the vehicle is licensed in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 and unless there is in force in relation to the use of the vehicle by the driver such a policy of insurance as complies with the requirements of Part VI of the Road Traffic Act 1988.

10. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
11. No person shall, except with the permission of the Council or any person duly authorised by them, drive any vehicle in a parking place other than for the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place.
12. No person shall in a parking place wantonly shout or otherwise make any loud noise to the disturbance or annoyance of users of the parking place or residents of premises in the neighbourhood.
13. No person shall in a parking place use any threatening, abusive or insulting language, gesture or conduct with intent to put any person in fear or so as to occasion a breach of the peace or whereby a breach of the peace is likely to be occasioned.
14. No person shall use any part of a parking place or any vehicle left in a parking place -
 - (a) for sleeping or camping purposes, or
 - (b) for eating or cooking purposes, or
 - (c) for the purpose of servicing, washing, cleaning, constructing, maintaining or repairing any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from the parking place, unless authorised in writing by the Council, or
 - (d) for washing any part of his person.
15. No person shall use a parking place as a means of passage proceeding from one road to another road.
16. Where in a parking place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of indicating -
 - (a) the entrance to or exit from the parking place, or
 - (b) that a vehicle using the parking place shall proceed in a specified direction within the parking place,no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle -
 - (i) so that it enters the parking place otherwise than by an entrance, or leaves the parking place otherwise than by an exit, so indicated, or
 - (ii) in a direction other than that specified, as the case may be.
17. In a parking place no person shall -
 - (a) erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure without the written consent of the Council;
 - (b) light or cause or permit to be lit any fire, stove or cooker.

18. The driver of a vehicle drawing a trailer shall not permit the vehicle or the trailer to wait in a parking place unless they have been disconnected, and for the purposes of this Order the vehicle and the trailer shall be deemed to be separate vehicles and the said driver shall be deemed to be the driver of each of the said vehicles.
19. The driver of a vehicle drawing a trailer shall not permit the trailer to wait in a parking place unless the registration number of the towing vehicle is clearly displayed thereon.
20. No vehicle shall be left in any parking place if its length exceeds 36 feet.
21. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Order the Council may by notice displayed at or near a parking place close such a parking place or part thereof for any period and no driver of any vehicle shall use such parking place or part thereof when it is so closed.
22. If at any time in or on a parking space or spaces or in any position adjacent thereto there is displayed a notice that a particular space or spaces is/are reserved for use by disabled drivers or for the leaving of solo motor cycles or for the use of any other person or category of persons authorised by the Council, no person shall leave a vehicle in any such parking space other than for the purpose so specified.
23. Goods vehicles exceeding 30 cwt. unladen weight may only be parked in those parking places so indicated in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order and may only be left in a parking space or spaces in or on which, or adjacent to which, is displayed a notice that that space or spaces is/are provided for the use of such vehicles. Other vehicles may only use such space or spaces when there are no other parking spaces available in that parking place.

Amount and Method of Payment

24. (1) The driver of a vehicle who leaves that vehicle in a parking place during the charging hours shall on leaving the vehicle in the parking place pay the appropriate initial charge as set out in Column 5 of the Schedule to this Order:

(2) No charge shall be so payable by the driver of a vehicle left in a parking place in or on which is displayed, so that it is facing forwards and can be easily seen from the front of the vehicle, a valid season ticket issued in accordance with the provisions of Article 26 of this Order.
25. (1) The charge referred to in Article 24(1) of this Order shall be payable by the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins into the ticket machine provided in the parking place, being a ticket machine approved in accordance with Section 35(3) of the Act, and the provisions of Section 47(5) of the Act shall apply in respect of such machine.

(2) Subject to paragraph (3) of this Article payment of the initial charge for the vehicle left in a parking place shall be indicated by the issue by a ticket machine of a numbered ticket or numbered tickets showing the day and time of payment of the charge and by the exhibition of that ticket or those tickets on the vehicle in accordance with paragraphs (5) and (6) of this Article.

(3) Where payment of the initial charge necessitates the issue by a ticket machine of more than one numbered ticket payment of that charge shall be indicated by the issue by such machine of two or more tickets numbered consecutively and by the exhibition of those tickets on the vehicle in accordance with paragraphs (5) and (6) of this Article.

(4) Upon payment of the initial charge the driver shall exhibit on the vehicle the ticket issued by the ticket machine -

- a) in the case of a vehicle which is fitted with a transparent windscreen, by affixing the ticket to the inside surface of the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be easily seen from the front of the vehicle, or
- b) in the case of a vehicle which is not fitted with a transparent windscreen by affixing the ticket on the front of the vehicle facing forwards not more than 6ft 6ins and not less than 2ft 6ins above the surface of the parking space in which the vehicle is parked.

(5) The ticket shall be so exhibited that the time and other particulars shown thereon are clearly visible from outside the vehicle.

(6) No person shall insert in the ticket machine any coins additional to those inserted on originally entering the parking place by way of payment of the initial charge in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article.

26. (1) The owner of any vehicle other than a goods vehicle exceeding 30 cwt unladen weight may on written application to the Treasurer of the Council at Pippbrook, Dorking, purchase a season ticket at a charge of £250 per annum (£120 per annum in respect of Woodfield Lane Car Park, Ashted) and that season ticket shall be valid during the period for which it is issued in any of the parking places in the Schedule to this Order in which the maximum waiting period is 24 hours, except that a season ticket issued in respect of Woodfield Lane Car Park at a charge of £120 per annum referred to shall be valid in respect of that car park only.

(2) The owner of any goods vehicle exceeding 30 cwt unladen weight may purchase a season ticket in like manner at a charge of £1250 per annum and that season ticket shall be valid during the period for which it is issued in any of the parking places in the Schedule to this Order which are available for such vehicles.

27. The following vehicles left in a parking place shall be exempt from any limitation on time and from the payment of any charge specified in Columns 4 and 5 of the Schedule to this Order :-

- (a) an invalid carriage;
- (b) a vehicle issued to a disabled person by the Department of Health and Social Security in lieu of an invalid carriage;
- (c) a vehicle of which the driver is a person who on account of his severe physical disability has been given a notice in writing by the Council that he is exempt from any such charge or limitation on time, if the notice is displayed on the vehicle in a conspicuous position;
- (d) a disabled person's vehicle which is being used to convey a

registered disabled person to and from the parking place and which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority in accordance with the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982, and for the purpose of this paragraph a badge shall be in the relevant position if:-

- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the nearside of and immediately behind the windscreen; and
 - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.
- (e) a vehicle of which the driver has been given a permit in writing by or on behalf of the Council, subject to such conditions as the Council think fit, exempting him from any such charge or limitation on time, if the permit is displayed on the vehicle in a conspicuous position.

Excess Charge

- 28 (1) If a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours either
- (a) after the period for which payment was made in accordance with Article 25(1) of this Order has expired, or
 - (b) without having a ticket exhibited on it in accordance with Article 25(4) and (5) of this Order, or
 - (c) without having a valid season ticket purchased in accordance with Article 26 hereof exhibited on it in such a manner that the particulars shown thereon are clearly visible from outside the vehicle, or
 - (d) in a manner other than as prescribed in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order,

an excess charge of the amount specified in Column 6 of the Schedule to this Order shall be payable, provided that if within seven days following the date notice of such excess charge is issued as provided in this Article the driver tenders the sum of £25 then such latter sum may be accepted by the Council in satisfaction of the excess charge.

(2) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which an excess charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a parking attendant to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars :-

- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
- (b) the time at which he first noticed that an excess charge had become payable;
- (c) a statement that an excess charge of the amount specified in Column 6 of the Schedule to this Order for that class of vehicle in that parking place is required to be paid;
- (d) the manner in which, and the time within which, the excess charge

should be paid; and

- (e) a statement that it is an offence under Section 35A of the Act for the driver of a vehicle who has left the vehicle in a parking place to fail duly to pay the excess charge.

29. An excess charge shall be paid to the Council either by cheque, banker's draft, money order or postal order which shall be delivered or sent by post so as to reach the Treasurer's department of the Council at Pippbrook, Dorking not later than 4.15 p.m. on the twenty-eighth day following the day on which the penalty charge was incurred; or by any of the above or in cash in person or by messenger at any of the Council's cash offices at Pippbrook, Dorking or Wesley House, Bull Hill, Leatherhead, not later than as aforesaid.

Provided that if the said twenty-eighth day falls on a day on which the said department or cash offices are closed, the period within which payment shall be made shall be extended until 4.15 p.m. on the next full day on which the said Department or cash offices are open.

Restriction on Removal of Notices and Tickets

30. (1) Where a ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 25 of this Order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, shall remove the ticket from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.

(2) Where a notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with Article 28 of this Order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle or a parking attendant, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.

Movement of Vehicle Left in Parking Place

31. (1) Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in this Order, a parking attendant or other person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle and he may remove the vehicle from the parking place or cause it to be removed and, where it is so removed, shall provide for its safe custody.

(2) Any person removing or altering the position of a vehicle by virtue of the foregoing provisions of this Article may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think reasonably necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position, as the case may be.

32. Any parking attendant or other person duly authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place he thinks fit, any vehicle left in a parking place.

Excess Charge


- 28 (1) If a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours either
- (a) after the period for which payment was made in accordance with Article 25(1) of this Order has expired, or
 - (b) without having a ticket exhibited on it in accordance with Article 25(4) and (5) of this Order, or
 - (c) without having a valid season ticket purchased in accordance with Article 26 hereof exhibited on it in such a manner that the particulars shown thereon are clearly visible from outside the vehicle, or
 - (d) in a manner other than as prescribed in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order,

an excess charge of the amount specified in Column 6 of the Schedule to this Order shall be payable, provided that if within seven days following the date notice of such excess charge is issued as provided in this Article the driver tenders the sum of £25 then such latter sum may be accepted by the Council in satisfaction of the excess charge.

(2) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which an excess charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a parking attendant to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars :-

- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
- (b) the time at which he first noticed that an excess charge had become payable;
- (c) a statement that an excess charge of the amount specified in Column 6 of the Schedule to this Order for that class of vehicle in that parking place is required to be paid;
- (d) the manner in which, and the time within which, the excess charge
