

WEST GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL(CRYDDAN ROAD/EXCHANGE ROAD/DANYGRAIG ROAD JUNCTION, BRITON FERRY, NEATH)(PROHIBITION OF WAITING, LOADING AND UNLOADING) AND(REVOCATION) ORDER 1985

The Council of the County of West Glamorgan (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Section 1, 2, 3 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 124 of the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order.

1. This Order shall come into operation on the *20th* day of *January* 1985 and may be cited as the "West Glamorgan County Council (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) and (Revocation) Order 1985.
2. (1) In this Order:-
 - "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;
 - "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975;
 - "parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS. No. 4631 - 1970), coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.
- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the observe side facing forwards on the nearside of and immediately behind the windscreen, and
 - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle, and
 - (b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.

- (3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- (4) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. Save as provided in Article 5 this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in Schedule Two to this Order.
4. Save as provided in Article 5 of this Order no person shall cause any vehicle to wait, to be loaded or unloaded at any time in the length of road specified in Schedule One to this Order.
5. (1) Nothing in Articles 3 and 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the lengths of road or on the sides of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the side of road; or
 - iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said side of road or any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878; or
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
 - (e) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road.

- (f) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said side or any of the said lengths of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
 - (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.
- (2) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle in the lengths of road specified in Schedule Two to this Order.
- (3) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the lengths of road or the side of road referred to in Schedule One to this Order for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length or on the same side of road on the same day).
6. The provisions of the Borough Council of Neath (Restrictions on Waiting) (Crythan Road, Neath) Order 1970 made by the former Borough Council of Neath and coming into operation on 31st August 1970 are hereby revoked in respect of the lengths of road specified in the Schedules to this Order.
7. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1967 or by or under any other enactment.

SCHEDULE ONE

Prohibition of Waiting/Loading and Unloading At Any Time

Exchange Road (South West Side)

From the north west kerb line of Cryddan Road for a distance of 10 metres in a north westerly direction.

Cryddan Road (North West Side)

From the south west kerb line of Exchange Road for a distance of 19 metres in a south westerly direction.

SCHEDULE TWO

Prohibition of Waiting At Any Time

Exchange Road (South West Side)

From a point 10 metres north west of the north western kerb line of Cryddan Road for a distance of 13 metres in a north westerly direction.

Danygraig Road (both sides)

From the south eastern kerb lines of Cryddan Road for a distance of 15 metres in a south easterly direction.

Cryddan Road (South East Side)

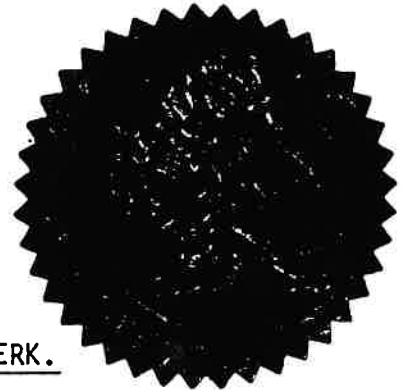
From the north eastern kerb line of Danygraig Road for a distance of 5 metres in a northerly direction.

From the south western kerb line of Danygraig Road to the south west side of Foundry Road a distance of approximately 30 metres.

From the south west side of Foundry Road for a distance of 25 metres in a south westerly direction.
