WEST GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL (LLEWELLYN STREET, GLYNNEATH)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1990

The West Glamorgan County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as the "Act of 1984") and of all other powers them enabling and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the 17th day of Septende 1990 and may be cited as the "West Glamorgan County Council (Llewellyn Street, Glynneath) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1990.
- 2. (1) In this Order:-


"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1986;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a Local Authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS.4631 - 1970), coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins, and

"relevant position" means:-

- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the nearside of and immediately behind the windscreen;
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle.
- 3. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.



- 4. Save as provided in Article 5 or 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides or lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 5. Nothing in article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides or lengths of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said side of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
 - (f) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road.
 - (g) local bus service vehicles when waiting at an authorised bus stop to set down or pick up passengers.

- Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the side of road referred to in the said Article for a period not exceeding 2 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road).
- 7. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other prohibition or restriction whether made under the Act of 1984 or otherwise.

SCHEDULE

"Prohibition of Waiting At Any Time"

Llewellyn Street, Glynneath North Side.

From the west side of Lon-y-Nant for a distance of 35 metres in a south westerly direction.

South Side.

From the west side of Lon-y-Nant for a distance of 50 metres in a south westerly direction.
