WEST GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

(MARGAM ROAD, PORT TALBOT)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1984

The Council of the County of West Glamorgan (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 and Section 1 and Schedule 7 to the Local Government Planning and Land Act 1980 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967"), and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 84C(1) of the Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-

- This Order shall come into operation on the 10th September 1984 and may be cited as the West Glamorgan County Council (Margam Road, Port Talbot) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1984.
- 2. (1) In this Order -

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS. No. 4631: 1970), but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position when -
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and
 - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle, and
 - (b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.

- (3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- (4) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 4. (1) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road or on the side of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -
 - (a) a person to aboard or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicles, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely -
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road or side of road; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in land adjacent to the said lengths of road or side of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or appartus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878.
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (e) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road or side of road;
 - (f) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said side or any of the said length of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or

- (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.
- (2) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- (3) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the length of road or on the side of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length or on the same side of road on the same day).
- 5. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1967 or by or under any other enactment.

SCHEDULE

Margam Road (North East Side)

From its junction with the northwest kerbline of Wilden Avenue north westwards a distance of approximately 53 metres (58 yards).
