The Glamorgan County Council in exercise of their powers under sections 1 (1), (2), and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, and Schedule 1 of the Local Government Act, 1972 and of all other powers then lawfully exercisable in that behalf and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 84 C(1) of the said Act of 1967 hereby make the following Order:

1. Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order, no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.0 a.m. and 6.0 p.m. on Monday to Saturday inclusive, in the lengths of roads or sides thereof specified in the Schedule to this Order.

2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary:-

- (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (c) to enable the vehicle if it is in the service of or employed by the Post Office, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
- (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to the said length of road of any sewer or main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878; or to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
- (e) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road;
- (f) to enable any vehicle owned by a funeral director or owner of funeral vehicles to be used as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise in connection with a funeral.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the ^{5th} day of August 1975, and may be cited as the "West Glamorgan County Council (Picton Road and Caenant Terrace, Skewen) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1975".

SCHEDULE

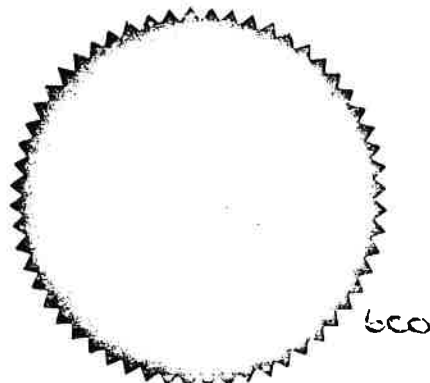
Picton Road (West Side) - From the North kerbline of New Street to the South Side of the access lane at the rear of New Street a distance of approximately 42 metres.

Picton Road (East Side) - From the North kerbline of New Street to the South Side of Caenant Terrace.

Caenant Terrace (South Side) - From the East Side of Picton Road to a point adjacent to the Western rear boundary of No. 50 New Road.

Caenant Terrace (North Side) - From the East side of Picton Road to a point adjacent to the rear boundary wall of No. 14 Picton Road a distance of approximately 48 metres.
