#### **ORDER 1995**

The Council of the County of West Glamcrgan (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2, 32, 36, and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred as "the Act of 1984") and of all other powers them enabling and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-

- This Order shall come into operation on the 11th day of December 1995 and may be cited as the "West Glamorgan County Council (Skewen/Neath Abbey Traffic Management Scheme) (Phase 4) Order 1995.
- 2. (1) In this Order -

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales Regulations 1986

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982 as amended by The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1991.

"parking disc" means a disc issued by a Local Authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (B.S. 4631 - 1970) coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins, and

"relevant position" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982 as amended by The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1991.

"Disabled Parking Place" (hereinafter referred to as a "Parking Place") means an area of highway designated as a Parking Place by this Order for the use of vehicles displaying a valid disabled persons badge in accordance with the Regulations.

"public service vehicle" shall have the same meaning as in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981 and "local service" shall have the same meaning as in Section 1 of the Transport Act 1985

"carriageway" means a way consisting of or comprised in a highway being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles. (2) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

NEATHFULLUEE STATION

- (3) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- (4) The provisions of the Orders specified in Schedule 1 to this Order are hereby revoked in so far as they relate to the lengths or sides of road specified in Schedules 2 to T to this Order.
- 3. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 to this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides or lengths of road as set out in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides or lengths of road specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-
  - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
  - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose, in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
    - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said site of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
    - (iv) a vehicle being used for Police, Ambulance or Fire Brigade purposes; or
  - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a Local Authority or of a Water Authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 37 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
  - (f) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road.

- (g) local service vehicles when waiting at an authorised bus stop to set down or pick up passengers.
- 5. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the side of road referred to in the said Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road).
- 6. Save as provided in Article 4, c), d), e), f), g) of this Order no person shall except on the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait or to be loaded or unloaded at any time on the sides or lengths of road as set out in Schedule 4 to this Order.
- 7. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order no person shall except on the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day except Sunday on the sides or lengths of road as set out in Schedule 4 of this Order.
- 8. (i) Save as provided in Articles 4, 5, and 8 (ii) Order no person shall except on the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait for longer than one hour or to return within one hour to the same side or length of road on which the period of waiting originally began between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day except Sunday on the sides or lengths of road as set out in Schedule 5 to this Order.
  - (ii) The prohibitions imposed by Article 9(i) to this Order shall not apply to a vehicle when displaying on its front windscreen a Residents Parking Place Permit issued by the West Glamorgan County Council exempting the vehicle from the provisions of the said Article.
- 9. (i) Save as provided in Article 9(ii) of this order no person shall except on the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday in a Parking Place designated by this Order and specified in Schedule 6 except a Goods Vehicle which may wait in a Parking Place for the purposes of loading or unloading for a maximum of 30 minutes if in respect of that Parking Place a period of more than one hour has elapsed since the termination of the last period of waiting (if any) of the Goods Vehicle in the Parking Place.

- (ii) Nothing in Article 9(1) shall apply to vehicles waiting for as long as may be necessary:-
  - (a) to enable persons to hoard or alight from the vehicle.
  - (b) to enable a vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition the removal of any obstruction to traffic the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the length of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of any telegraphic lines as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878.
- 10. No person other than a Police Officer in uniform or a Traffic Warden shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait, load or unload between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m., 11.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. and 3 p.m. and 4 p.m. on any day except Saturday or Sunday on the lengths or sides of roads apocified in Schedule 7 to this Order.
- 11. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle travelling westbound on New Road to make a left turn into Queens Road.
- 12. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or otherwise.

# SCHEDULE 2 - No Waiting, At Any Time

1. Graig Road (both sides)

Between its junction with Dynevor Place and a point approximately 11 metres north of that junction.

2. <u>Brookville Drive</u> (North side)

Between its junction with Dynevor Place and a point approximately 15 metres north east of that junction.

- 3. <u>Dynevor Place</u> (North side)
  - (i) Between points approximately 10 metres west and 10 metres east of its junction with Graig Road.
  - (ii) Between its junction with Railway Terrace and a point approximately 8 metres west of that junction.
- 4. New Road (North side)

- (i) Between its junction with Brookville Drive and a point approximately 85 metres south east of that junction.
- (ii) Between points approximately 10 metres and 23 metres west of its junction with Station Road.
- (iii) Between points approximately 15 metres and 55 metres east of its junction with Picton Road.
- (iv) Between points approximately 80 metres and 90 metres east of its junction with Picton Road.
- (v) Between points approximately 150 metres and 177 metres east of its junction with Picton Road.

(South side)

- (i) Between points approximately 50 metres and 155 metres west of its junction with Winifred Road.
- (ii) Between points approximately 10 metres and 25 metres east of its junction with Christopher Road.
- (iii) Between points approximately 15 metres and 83 metres west of its junction with Stanley Road.
- (iv) Between points approximately 25 metres and 120 metres east of its junction with Stanley Road.

- (v) Between its junction with Bethlehem Road and a point approximately 45 metres east of that junction.
- (vi) Between points approximately 15 metres west and 25 metres east of its junction with Brook Street.

# SCHEDULE 3 - No Waiting, Loading or Unloading, At Any Time

#### 1. <u>Sidings Terrace</u> (North side)

Between points approximately 15 metres west and 10 metres east of its junction with Lucy Road.

### 2. <u>Lucy Road</u> (West side)

- (i) Between its junction with Sidings Terrace and a point approximately 15 metres north of that junction.
- (ii) Between points approximately 35 metres and 41 metres north of its junction with Sidings Terrace.

#### (East side)

Between its junction with Sidings Terrace and a point approximately 15 metres north of that junction.

#### (South side)

Between its junction with Lucy Road (access road) and a point approximately 12 metres west of that junction.

#### 3. New Road (North side)

- (i) Between points approximately 10 metres west and 13 metres east of its junction with Station Road.
- (ii) Between points approximately 15 metres west and 15 metres east of its junction with Grove Lane.
- (iii) Between points approximately 15 metres west and 15 metres east of its junction with Picton Road.
- (iv) Between points approximately 26 metres west and 15 metres east of its junction with Penbryn Road.
- (v) Between points approximately 25 metres west and 15 metres east of its junction with Park Street.
- (vi) Between its junction with Drymmau Road and a point approximately 25 metres west of that junction.

#### (South side)

(i) Between points approximately 15 metres west and 15 metres east of its junction with Winifred Road.

- (ii) Between points approximately 6 metres west and 10 metres east of its junction with Christopher Road.
- (iii) Between points approximately 15 metres west and 25 metres east of its junction with Stanley Road.
- (iv) Between its junction with High Street and a point approximately 10 metres west of that junction.

# SCHEDULE 4 - No Waiting, 8 am - 6 pm, Monday - Saturday

#### 1. Dynevor Place (North side)

- (i) Between points approximately 10 metres east of its junction with Lucy Road and 10 metres west of its junction with Graig Road, a distance of approximately 25 metres.
- (ii) Between points approximately 10 metres east of its junction with Graig Road and 8 metres west of its junction with Railway Terrace, a distance of approximately 33 metres.

#### 2. New Road (North side)

- (i) Between points approximately 95 metres and 115 metres west of its junction with Station Road.
- (ii) Between points approximately 15 metres east of its junction with Park Street and 25 metres west of its junction with Drummau Road, a distance of approximately 70 metres.

#### (South side)

- (i) Between points approximately 35 metres and 60 metres east of its junction with Winifred Road.
- (ii) Between points approximately 25 metres and 52 metres west of its junction with Christopher Road.
- (iii) Between points approximately 43 metres and 105 metres east of its junction with Christopher Road.
- (iv) Between points approximately 45 metres and 60 metres east of its junction with Bethlehem Road.
- (v) Between points approximately 80 metres east of its junction with Bethlehem Road and 15 metres west of its junction with Brook Street, a distance of approximately 183 metres.

SCHEDULE 5 - Waiting Limited to 1 Hour, Return Prohibited Within 2 Hours, 8 am - 6 pm, Monday - Saturday Residents with Permits Exempt.

  - (vi) Between points approximately 177 metres and 235 metres east of its junction with Picton Road.

#### (South side)

- (i) Between points approximately 15 metres and 35 metres west of its junction with Winifred Road.
- (ii) Between points approximately 25 metres and 43 metres east of its junction with Christopher Road.
- (iii) Between points approximately 10 metres and 35 metres west of its junction with High Street.
- SCHEDULE 6 Parking by Service Vehicles Only, 8 am 6 pm, Monday - Saturday, Maximum Duration 30 minutes.

Between points approximately 124 metres and 150 metres east of its junction with Picton Road.

#### (South side)

- (i) Between points approximately 35 metres and 50 metres west of its junction with Winifred Road.
- (ii) Between points approximately 15 metres and 35 metres east of its junction with Winifred Road.
- (iii) Between points approximately 5 metres and 25 metres west of its junction with Christopher Road.
